## **Our Mission Statement**

Wildlife SOS is committed to saving India's endangered wildlife and threatened habitats by working in partnerships with indigenous communities and creating sustainable solutions while inspiring passion for nature through education, animal care and conservation research.

## **About Wildlife SOS**

Wildlife SOS (WSOS) is a conservation non-profit in India, established in 1998 with the primary objective of rescuing and rehabilitating wildlife in distress in the country, and preserving India's natural heritage. It is currently one of the largest Wildlife Organisations in South Asia.

Although internationally known for ground breaking work of eradicating the cruel and barbaric practice of Dancing Bears from the streets of India while creating alternative livelihoods for the nomadic communities that depended on the exploitation of the bears, Wildlife SOS is also known for their efforts at rescue and rehabilitation of sloth bears and more recently elephants. Wildlife SOS also runs active projects focused on mitigation of human wildlife conflict with regard to species like Leopards, Macaques, Elephants, Moon bears, Snakes etc. across several states in India. In addition, their work includes projects targeted at biodiversity and habitat conservation, awareness workshops and anti-poaching operations, as well as the rehabilitation of communities dependent on performing or working animals for their livelihood.

## THE WILDLIFE RESCUE CENTRE, GURUGRAM

The Wildlife Rescue Centre, Haryana was established in Gurugram in 1999 in collaboration with the Haryana Forest Department with financial assistance from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment under the scheme "Provision of shelter houses for looking after animals" to address the animal rescue and rehabilitation requirements of Gurugram and the adjacent areas where incidents of hit and run cases involving animals were high and there was a conspicuous absence of veterinary hospitals.

The Wildlife Rescue Centre, Haryana helps to create awareness about urban wildlife in Gurugram and the surrounding areas to prevent people to kill the local wildlife like snakes and other animals they perceive as dangerous.



Spiralling land development and change in land use in the Gurgaon region has brought about a drastic reduction in habitat availability for endemic wildlife of the area thus causing a steep increase in man-wildlife conflict.

The almost complete depletion of habitats where scrubland has been completely replaced by concrete jungles has caused even the most common wildlife species like the Nilgai to resort to crop depredation. The reduction in the sizes buffer areas and the rapid disappearance of wildlife corridors has led to a multi-fold increase in the number of accidents where animals get run over by vehicles in an attempt to navigate the busy highways that now dissect whatever is left of their habitats. These concerns prompted Wildlife SOS to set up the Wildlife Rescue Centre in Gurugram, Haryana.
