Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh was carried out by Dr. Devender Kumar on 27.03.2016. The evaluation report of Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Rewalsar as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 78<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal for recognition for a period of two years. The renewal of recognition of Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Rewalsar as "a Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under Rule 10 of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (Amended in 2013) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-
