Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, Odisha was carried out by Dr. Devender Kumar on 29.06.2016. The evaluation report of the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 79th Meeting held on 24th August, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of one year. The renewal of recognition of Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, as "a Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 23rd August, 2017 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

As the locality has high tourist visitation and the adjoining reservoir has good numbers of resident water fowls and stork, a proper Master (layout) Plan for a zoo should be prepared in association with the water resources department with focus towards conservation of fauna of Mahanadi Elephant Reserve.	Within one month
3.	Till such time the Master (layout) Plan and Master Plan of the zoo are prepared and approved, necessary population control measures should be put in place for checking further breeding of Spotted deers. This may be done by separating the sexes of animals. During this period the health of animals should be scrutinized.	With immediate effect

A quarterly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition to the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh beyond 30th September 2013 as "a Mini Category Zoo" would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
