Reference is invited to the aforesaid correspondence.

The evaluation of the Taptapani Deer Park, Gajapati District, Odisha was carried out by Sh. B.G. Mugadur. The evaluation report of the Taptapani Deer Park, Gajapati District, Odisha as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 76th Meeting of Central Zoo Authority held on 9th November, 2015.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant renewal of recognition to Taptapani Deer Park, Gajapati District, Odisha as "Mini Category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 for a period up to 30th November, 2017 subject to the compliance of the following conditions under the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 and mid-term evaluation of the Zoo:-



When the grass grown to sufficient height the deer be allowed to graze in this portion. Thus soil is protected. The same process repeated alternately.</p>	With Immediate effect

4.	5(9)	The men working who are in close contact with animals in the park are subject to screening against TB and Zoonotic disease atleast twice in a year in the hospital where such facilities are available and records be maintained in zoo for verification.	With Immediate effect

5.	9(9)	The present strength of spotted deer be limited to 50 individuals only and population control measures like segregation of sexes during breeding season and vasectomy on selected males should be taken up.	With Immediate effect

Grant of recognition Taptapani Deer Park, Gajapati District, Odisha beyond the period of 30th November, 2017 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the condition stated above and general performance of the Zoo at that point of time.

The recognition to the Taptapani Deer Park, Gajapati District, Odisha shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the above stipulated conditions.


