Madam,

Reference is invited to your letter No. EIH/AHL/CA/002/2016, dated 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2016 seeking grant of renewal of recognition to Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 beyond the period of 30.04.2016.

The evaluation of the Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur was carried out by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer, CZA on 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2016. The evaluation report of the Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 79<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant renewal of recognition to Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur as a "Mini Category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 23.08.2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

Provided that the details in respect of the animals pertaining to the species included in Schedule I and Schedule II to the Act, along with the detailed reasons of death identified on the basis of the post-mortem examination reports shall be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority every quarter, within a period of fifteen days of the end of that quarter. Further it is to inform that the recognition granted to Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur for a period up to 23.08.2019 is subject to compliance with above conditions.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid condition should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of renewal of recognition to Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur beyond the period of 23 August, 2018 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the condition stated above and general performance of the Zoo at that point of time.

The recognition to the Safari Park, Haridas Ji Ki Magri, Udaipur shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the above stipulated conditions.
