

Sir,

Reference is invited to above cited correspondences. It is to inform that the evaluation of Chennai Snake Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu was carried out by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer on 07.08.2018. The evaluation report of the Chennai Snake Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu was considered by the Technical Committee in its 86th Meeting held on 28.09.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee decided for renewal of recognition of the Chennai Snake Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu for a period of one year. A copy of the evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officer is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action.

The renewal of recognition to the Chennai Snake Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu as a "Small Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 28.09.2019 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation, and to regularise the period after 05.05.2018:-
