ORDER

(Under Section 38H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972)

Sub:- Cancellation of recognition and physical closure to the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu – reg.

Whereas, the recognition to the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 was valid till 03.11.2018 subject to compliance with conditions specified under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 vide letter F. No. 19-97/93-CZA(249)(Vol. I)(AK)/3101/2016, dated 29.11.2016.

Whereas, the Chief Wildlife Warden, Tamil Nadu forwarded the proposal to cancel recognition of the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu, in view of the decision of the Thanjavur Municipal Corporation to discontinue operation of the zoo due to space constraint and developmental activities to be taken up in the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur since Thanjavur city has been selected by the Central Government under the 'Smart City' category.

Whereas, the proposal for cancellation of recognition to the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu and its voluntary closure was placed before the 86th meeting held on 28th September, 2018.

Whereas, after detailed deliberation, the members of the Technical Committee, CZA in its meeting held on 28.09.2018 considered rehabilitation of captive animals of three species (Common fox, unidentified species of Parakeet and Spotted deer) housed in the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur.

Whereas, the Committee also considered the fact that the amongst zoos having Common fox in their Animal Collection, the following zoos are housing single animal of the species against the provisions under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009:

- the Lady Hydari Park, Shillong,
- the Sanjay Gandhi Biological Park, Patna,
- the Wild Animal Conservation Centre, Sambalpur and
- the Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot

Whereas, the Lady Hydari Park, Shillong has been directed by the CZA to relocate to the new site and not to acquire any animal since the existing facility at the Zoo is not conducive to house any of the species kept in the Zoo. The Zoos at Patna and Rajkot are Large and Medium category zoos respectively and they have good record of breeding of the species housed in the Zoo. Further, the upkeep and healthcare facility available at the two zoos are also satisfactory. Hence, the Committee has recommended for shifting of Common fox in these two zoos as detailed below.

Whereas, the Committee recommended for approval of the CZA under Section 38-I of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for transfer of captive animals housed in the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur as follows:

Whereas, the recommendations of the Technical Committee of the CZA were placed before the Central Zoo Authority in its 32nd meeting held on 19th November, 2018.

Whereas, the CZA while issuing grant of renewal of recognition to the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu vide letter F.No. 19-97/93-CZA(249)(Vol. I)(AK)/3101/2016, dated 29.11.2016 for the period upto 03.11.2018 has stipulated following conditions under the provision of the Recognition of Zoo Rules which were not complied by the Zoo Operator:-

1. The single parrot not paired and five snakes should be released in the wild, following due protocol in the matter.
2. Failed to close zoo for a day every week to the visitors.
3. The appropriate stand-off barrier has to be provided at the enclosures for deer and birds.
4. The zoo should have a whole time officer in charge with adequate financial and administrative powers, instead of present arrangement of Revenue inspector who works under the guidance of the Municipal Commissioner with no financial and administrative powers, whereas a Forester visits frequently and guides staff.
5. The Zoo should have adequate scientific and technical staff as per the norms prescribed by the CZA.
6. The animal collection plan has to be prepared by the Zoo authorities for approval from the CZA.
7. The enclosures for Birds and Jackal need improvement.
8. The footbath of adequate size with proper disinfectant at entry and exit points of animal house should be immediately provided.
9. The improvement is needed in drainage system.
10. The facility for food storage is not adequate and should be improved.
11. The zoo should maintain records on screening of animals for parasitic load and vaccination against infectious diseases.
12. Screening of staff against zoonotic diseases is mandatory and the records in this regard should also be made available during the evaluation.
13. The zoo should have isolation and quarantine facility.
14. The zoo should have appropriate animal restraint equipment, accessories and drugs.
15. The zoo may have signage in bilingual language at appropriate places.
16. The zoo should make arrangements for physically challenged persons for viewing wild animals and civic facilities for them.
17. Barricading of deer enclosures should be done as per norms of the CZA by extending the barricade full in length.
18. The present birds enclosures should be re-designed and improved to house Pigeons and water birds by providing all infrastructure, and the cages especially for Jackals should be enlarged.
19. Master Plan for next 10 years should be prepared immediately and submitted to the CZA for approval.

Now, therefore, keeping in view the request of the Chief Wildlife Warden, Tamil Nadu stating that, due to insufficient space available for maintaining the small animals, birds and large number of deer and keeping in view of the welfare of animals. Further, as the Government has decided to initiate developmental activities to be taken up in the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur since Thanjavur city has been selected by the Central Government under the 'Smart City' category decided not to operate the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu, the Central Zoo Authority has decided to cancel the recognition of the Sivagangai Garden Zoo, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu as per provisions laid down in Section 38H(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 with a provision to file an appeal before the Central Government as per provisions laid down in Section 38H(7) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of Sivagangai Garden (Mini Zoo), Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu was carried out by Shri B.G. Mugadur on 8th March, 2016. The evaluation report of the Sivagangai Garden (Mini Zoo), Thanjavur as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 80th Meeting held on 4th November, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of two years. The renewal of recognition of Sivagangai Garden (Mini Zoo), Thanjavur as a "Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 3rd November, 2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

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The renewal of recognition to Sivagangai Garden (Mini Zoo), Thanjavur for period beyond 3rd November, 2018 as a "Mini Category Zoo" would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo. The recognition to the Sivagangai Garden (Mini Zoo), Thanjavur shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Grant of recognition beyond 31st March, 2011 to the Shivganga Garden Mini Zoo, Thanjavur as a 'mini category zoo' would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, general performance and physical evaluation of the zoo.

The recognition to the Shivganga Garden Mini Zoo, Thanjavur as shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point in time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
