Sir,

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao, Uttar Pradesh was carried out by Dr. D.N. Singh, Member Secretary, CZA on 03.08.2017. The evaluation report of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 84th Meeting held on 19.09.2017. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee has recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for renewal of recognition of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao, Uttar Pradesh (Mini Zoo Category) for a period of two years and to serve Show Cause Notice on the zoo operator for violation reported.

The Central Zoo Authority in its 30th Meeting held on 28.09.2017, approved the recommendation of the Technical Committee and has decided to serve Show Cause Notice under Section 38H (6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 on operator of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao for non-compliance with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority in violation of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009, to provide time period of six months to the zoo to submit a compliance report on the issues mentioned in the Show Cause Notice. Besides, the Central Zoo Authority has decided to renew recognition to the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao for a period of two years. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately. Further, the Authority has also decided to regularise the period after 30.09.2016.

The evaluation of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao was carried out by Sh. P. C. Tyagi on 07.05.2014. The evaluation report of the Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao as submitted by the evaluating officers was considered by the Technical Committee in its 71st Meeting held on 2nd September, 2014.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant recognition to Nawabganj Deer Park, Unnao as "a Mini Category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 30th September, 2016 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-
