Reference is invited to letter No. 640/A.1/PNHZP/15-16 dated 14.01.2016 from the Director, Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling, West Bengal received in this office on 21.01.2016 seeking grant of renewal of recognition to Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling for the period beyond 31.07.2015

The evaluation of the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling was carried out by Sh. S. K. Patnaik and Dr. M. L. Smith on 27.11.2015. The evaluation report of the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling as submitted by the evaluating officers was considered by the Technical Committee in its 77th Meeting held on 20th January, 2016.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of recognition to Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling as 'Medium Zoo' category under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 for a period up to 20.01.2019 subject to the compliance with the following directives under Rule 10 of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (Amended in 2013) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

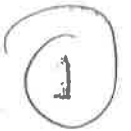

Sir,

Reference is invited to your letter No.340/GENL/GRANT-RECOGN/CZA/PNHZP dated 29.6.2005 seeking renewal of recognition for Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling beyond 31.8.2005 under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

The evaluation report of the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling as submitted by the evaluating team comprising of Shri M. Kamal Naidu and Dr. Apoorva Chakrabarty was considered by the Technical Committee in its meeting held on 10.1.2006 . The committee has recommended that the Zoo shall continue the planned breeding programme for the highly endangered high altitude species of the region in collaboration with the *in-situ* wildlife managers of the region.

The evaluation report and other relevant records have revealed that the zoo management was successful in complying with the stipulated conditions laid down by the Central Zoo Authority in its letter of even number dated 10.9.2003.

Further, on the recommendations of the Committee, it has now been decided to grant renewal of recognition to the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling as a small category zoo under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act for a period up to 31.12.2009 subject to the following conditions under Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992:-

1.	1	The primary objective of the zoo should be conservation of endangered species of high altitude fauna and to complement and strengthen the national efforts in conservation of these species in the country.
Administrative and Staffing Pattern		
2.	13	The zoo should post an official with a Masters degree in Wildlife Science as a <u>full time Curator</u> , solely responsible for looking after the upkeep of animals and maintenance of animal enclosures.
3.	14	The zoo operators should post 1 full time veterinarian with following description and educational qualification: Veterinarian/ Veterinary Officer (one): He/she should have minimum educational qualification of B.V.Sc & A.H or equivalent with a minimum of 5 years experience of working in a zoo recognised by the Central Zoo Authority. He/She should be duly registered with the State Veterinary Council or Veterinary Council of India.
Animal care, Health and Treatment		
4.	28	Routine examination including parasite checks shall be carried out regularly and preventive medicines including vaccination should be administered at such intervals as may be decided by the zoo veterinary officer.
5.	29	The zoo should arrange for medical check up of the staff responsible for upkeep of animals atleast once in every six months to ensure that they do not have infections of such diseases that can infect the zoo animals.
Breeding of animals		
6.	37	The zoo is exhibiting single wild animals like clouded leopard, musk deer, slow loris and Himalayan Tahr. Mates for these single animals should be provided. Alternatively the animals may be transferred to zoos where these animals can be kept in pairs or in social groups.
