The evaluation report of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Pakke, Arunachal Pradesh as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 72<sup>nd</sup> Meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2014

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant recognition to Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Pakke, Arunachal Pradesh under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 31.12.2017 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

The recognition to the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Pakke, Arunachal Pradesh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Grant of recognition to Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Pakke, Arunachal Pradesh beyond 31<sup>st</sup> July 2014 as "a Rescue Centre" would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo. Submission of Master Plan be expedited.

The recognition to the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Pakke, Arunachal Pradesh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

Please refer to your letter CWL/D/16/2001/2619 dated 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2004 seeking recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh as a 'zoo' under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act.

The evaluation of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa was carried out on 13.12.2004 by Shri Brij Kishor Gupta, Scientist in the Central Zoo Authority. The evaluation report was placed before the Technical Committee Meeting held on 19.7.2005 and the Committee has approved granting recognition to the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa as a 'zoo', subject to fulfillment of the following conditions within a time period upto 31.8.2009:-

S. No.	Relevant Norm No.	Conditions
<b>General</b>		
1.	2.	The zoo shall not acquire any animal without the permission of the Chief Wildlife Warden under Section 11 (1)(a) and the Central Zoo Authority under Section 38I of the Act.
<b>Administration and Staffing Pattern</b>		
2.	12	One full time officer-in-charge of the zoo should be posted and he/she shall be delegated adequate administrative and financial powers to purchase feed and medicine and carryout emergency repair of animal enclosures as may be necessary for proper upkeep and care of the zoo animals.

<b>Animal Enclosures – Design, Dimensions and other Essential Features</b>		
3.	18	Every bear in the zoo should be provided food inside a feeding cell/ retiring cubicle. The number and size of feeding cells will be such that the dominant animals do not deprive other animals from getting adequate food. The individual feeding cells/ night shelters should be of the dimensions as specified in <u>Appendix I</u> of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992.
<b>Veterinary Facilities</b>		
4.	33	A treatment room should be constructed within the premises of the zoo where routine examination of animals can be undertaken and immediate treatment can be provided.
<b>Maintenance of Records and Submission of inventory to the Central Zoo Authority</b>		
5.	42	The records of birth, acquisition, disposals and deaths of the animals should be maintained. The inventory of the animals in the zoo as on 31 <sup>st</sup> March of every year shall be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority by 30 <sup>th</sup> April of the same year.
6.	43	A brief summary of the death of animals in the zoo for every financial year, along with the reasons of death identified on the basis of the postmortem report and diagnostic tests should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

**Other Recommendations:-**

- A. Reintroduction programme of Schedule I species shall be carried out after taking prior approval of the Government of India under Section 12 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act.
- B. Reintroduction programme of animals should be carried out as per the IUCN guidelines on "Reintroduction".

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition beyond 31.8.2009 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.
