Sir,

Reference is invited to your letter No. nil, dated 23.12.2015 received in this office on 05.01.2016 seeking grant of renewal of recognition to Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal for period beyond 31.12.2015.

The evaluation of the Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal was carried out by Sh. Bipul Chakrabarty on 11.03.2016. The evaluation report of the Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 78th Meeting held on 6th May, 2016.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant renewal of recognition to Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal as a "Mini category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to <u>05.05.2018</u> subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-
