Sub:- Cancellation of recognition to the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram, Haryana under Section 38H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 – reg.

1. This office letter F. No. 22-85/2004-CZA(483)(AK)/2716/2016, dated 27.09.2016.
2. This office Show Cause Notice F. No. 22-85/2004-CZA(483)(AK)/4386/2018, dated 12.09.2018.

Whereas, the recognition of Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram, Haryana under Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 vide letter F. No. 22-85/2004-CZA(483)(AK)/2716/2016, dated 27.09.2016 was valid up to 28.08.2018 subject to the compliance with the conditions specified therein under Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.

Whereas, inspite of reminders dated 05.06.2018, 06.09.2018 and 12.09.2018, the Rescue Centre Operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram did not file application in Form – I seeking renewal of recognition of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram, Haryana for period beyond 23rd August, 2018, in compliance of Rule 8 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.

Whereas, to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The team deputed by the office of the Central Zoo Authority visited the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram on 08.09.2018 to carry out the evaluation. However, the CZA team was denied entry by the personnel present at the entrance of the Rescue Centre on the instruction of Shri Kartick Satyanarayan, Co-founder, Wildlife SOS.

Whereas, Mr. Kartick Satyanarayan, Co-founder, Wildlife SOS vide e-mail dated 08.09.2018 and 10.09.2018 informed that the staff of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera were not available and requested this office that evaluation of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera be rescheduled between 26th and 30th September, 2018. Also, the Co-founder, Wildlife SOS sent a text message to the deputed evaluators on 08.09.2018 that the application form for renewal of recognition of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera will be submitted to the office of the CZA.

Whereas, the office of the CZA has issued notice vide F. No. 22-85/2004-CZA(483)(AK)/4386/2018, dated 12.09.2018 under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, to the Operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram asking whether intends to continue operation of the Rescue Centre.

Whereas, the Central Zoo Authority vide letter dated 19.09.2018 again deputed Dr. Devender Kumar, Scientific Officer and Shri Ajay Kumar, Evaluation and Monitoring Assistant, CZA to evaluate the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram on 24.09.2018.

Whereas, the Co-founder, Wildlife SOS vide letter No.WSOS/CZAWRC GURUGRAM/204 dated 19.09.2018 informed the office of the Central Zoo Authority vide e-mail dated 22.09.2018 that the Rescue Centre Operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram has decided to operate it as transit facility and does not require renewal of recognition under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

Whereas, as per Rule 2(j) of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009, "Rescue Centre means an establishment for the long-term care of animals specified in the Schedules to the Act". Thus, the transit facility does not come under definition of Zoo and does not require recognition under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

Whereas, the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram is being operated by the NGO namely Wildlife SOS in collaboration with the Department of Forests, Government of Haryana. Now, the Operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram suddenly stated that henceforth, the wild animals will be handed over to the Forest Department of Haryana for release. It is not clear about the liability of the wild animals under long-term care at the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram. Wild animals being the Government Property, it is a sudden and unexpected liability on the Department of Forests, Government of Haryana.

Whereas, the technical Committee members in its 86th meeting held on 28th September, 2018 observed that the Operator (Wildlife SOS) operating the Elephant Conservation and Care Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh without obtaining recognition under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. There exists no guarantee that similar situation may not repeat there. Hence, it is advisable that the Government should be cautious while permitting the non-government organisations for long-term care of wild animals.

Whereas, the Technical Committee in its 86th meeting held on 28th September, 2018 after due deliberation on the observations of the CZA recommended to the Central Zoo Authority to cancel recognition to the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram as per provisions of Section 38H(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 keeping in view the welfare of the captive animals.

Whereas, the Central Zoo Authority in its 32nd meeting held on 19th November, 2018, in view of the failure of the operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram to comply with conditions stipulated by the CZA and decided to cancel the recognition of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram under Section 38H(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Now, therefore, in view of the facts that the operator of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram did not allow mandatory evaluation of the Rescue Centre by the evaluators deputed by this Authority and preferred for closure of the facility, the recognition of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram is hereby cancelled as per provisions laid down in Section 38H(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 with a provision to file an appeal before the Central Government as per provisions laid down in Section 38H(7) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of Wildlife Rescue Centre at Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram was carried out by Dr. Devender Kumar & Mr. Ajay Kumar on 9th April, 2016. The evaluation report of Wildlife Rescue Centre at Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 79th Meeting held on 24th August, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of two years. The renewal of recognition of Wildlife Rescue Centre at Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram as a "Rescue Centre" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 23rd August, 2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the Rescue Centre:-

The recognition of Wildlife Rescue Centre at Gopalpur Khera, Gurugram shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Rescue Centre operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

The evaluation report of the Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gurgaon, Haryana as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 57th Meeting held on 24th March, 2011.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of recognition to Wildlife Rescue Centre, Gurgaon, Haryana as a Rescue Centre under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 30th April, 2013 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009:-

All staff involved with upkeep and healthcare of zoo animals shall be screened against zoonotic diseases once every year and those found positive to any communicable disease shall be provided appropriate treatment till they get cured and freed of the infection and during the period of such treatment, the infected employees shall be kept away from the responsibility of upkeep and healthcare of the animals.

Every zoo shall maintain detailed records of observations of biological and social behaviour and health status of the animals including feed intake, medication and treatment provided in the keeper's diary, daily reports, animal history cards and treatment cards, as per standards specified by the Central Zoo Authority. Each animal and bird shall have individual history, treatment cards.

6. Veterinary facilities

(6) The rescue centre shall have linkages with the eminent institutions and organizations working in the field of wild animal healthcare for assistance in scientific diagnosis of diseases of serious nature and advise on the effective remedial treatment, the training and upgrading technical skills of zoo staff; and the development of protocols for preventive medicines and vaccination

7. Post-mortem and disposal of carcasses of animals

(1) Every animal died in the zoo shall be subjected to a detailed postmortem examination by registered veterinarian to determine conclusively the cause of the death.

(2) The findings of the post-mortem examination referred to in sub-paragraph (1) shall be recorded in such format as may be prescribed by Central Zoo Authority and in this regard and shall be maintained for a period of not less than six years.

8. Euthanasia of the animals

(1) No animal in the zoo shall be euthanized unless doing so is essential for the health of other animals or relieving the animal from unnecessary suffering or agony and whenever such exigencies arrives, action may be taken in accordance with the norms specified by the Central Zoo Authority in this regard.

9. Acquisition and breeding of animals

(10) The rescue centre shall take effective measures to safeguard against escape of the zoo animals from the


