

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## **1. Report of the Officer-in-charge**

The Lion Safari Vasona Dadra and Nagar Haveli is one of the centres of wildlife conservation through which recreation and environmental education is imparted. Every effort has been made to provide required housing, feed and health care to all the animals in the zoo. The number of visitors visiting to the Lion Safari, Vasona is increasing year after year. This zoo has been recognized as a Mini Zoo by the Central Zoo Authority of India and now the steps have been taken up for its improvement by carrying out necessary development works to create good infrastructure. The area of the zoo is 19.64 Ha. Adequate measures are carried out to provide required visitor amenities like Resting Shelters, Drinking Water, and Toilets. Regular training camps and awareness tour are conducted to mainly students and teachers. Animal health care is an important function in the Zoo and it is our endeavour to ensure that the animal are screened regularly for occurrence of any disease, timely that is prophylactic measure are taken. The animal sanitation and hygiene is also maintained well. The zoo staff works sincerity and devotion to their job on order to ensure a healthy environment for animals and visitors.

## **2. History of the Zoo**

The Portuguese occupied Dadra and Nagar Haveli between 1783 and 1785 and about 170 years of Portuguese rule was brought to an end on 2 August 1954 by the volunteers of Goa parties acting in close cooperation with the local inhabitants. After its liberation, the administration of the territory was carried on by an Administrator with an advisor to advise him on all administrative matters and soon steps were taken to associate the local people in the administration by the creation of Varistha Panchayat and Group Panchayat. On 12<sup>th</sup> June 1961, the Varsitha Panchayat unanimously passes a resolution for integration with the Indian Union. On 11.08.1961, the territory became nationally united by the Dadra and Nagar Haveli Act 1961 (No.35 of 1961) passed by the parliament. Consequently, the free Dadra & Nagar Haveli Administration was succeeded by a formal statutory Administration headed by an ADMINISTRATOR, Dadra and Nagar Haveli comprising of 65 villages and one town Statutory and 5 Census Town from a single district and single taluka as Union Territory. All the villages have been divided into 11 Patelads for revenue purposes, each in the charge of Patel Talati who is also the ex-officio Secretary to the Group Panchayat. The Administrator head of the Union Territory is the Administrator who is also

the Administrator of Daman & Diu. The population is 3,43,709 as per the 2011 census with 51.95 % of the population tribal with Varli, Dhodia, Kikna, Kathodi, Koli, Dhor and Naik tribes. The forest area covers 492 sq. km with 107 sq. km as Reserve Forest and 92 sq. km as wildlife Sanctuary.

The Lion Safari is situated 10 km away from Silvassa and is well connected by road. The UT is visited by more than 1 (one) lakh tourists per year and the lion safari is a much sought after tourist attraction with nearly 70 thousand tourists visiting every year. The Lion safari is a part of Dadra & Nagar Haveli Wildlife Sanctuary and the habitat here has been especially created and maintained as per the wild natural habitat of the Asiatic lion. The idea for creation was shown in the year 1987-88. The Forest Department had initiated the lion safari project at village Vasona survey no. 147 and 148 by initially enclosing 6.68 hectare area of Reserve Forest on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 1988 in the first phase. Major works were accomplished by the year 1999-2001 and CZA have permission for mini-zoo in the year 2002. Lion Safari was opened for public on 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2005. This area was expanded to the present area in the second phase of expansion. A third phase of development is being planned with a panther cage and display enclosure.

### **4. Mission**

To promote wildlife conservation by serving as a quality recreation spot within an educational environment.

**Collection Plan-** The Lion Safari is dedicated to the pure Asiatic lion and the overall collection plan is with the objective of maintaining a viable population level of the lion. Breeding programmes with other zoos will be executed after checking their pedigrees for pure breeds only. The DCF (WL) is the authority to deal with the CZA correspondence assisted by ACF (WL).

**Conservation breeding-** The Lion Safari is a part of in-situ captive breeding of Asiatic lion, however despite successful pregnancies the 2 cubs could not survive and such till date successful breeding has not been achieved. However, efforts are being made by the Wildlife Division in coordination with the Junagad Veterinary facility and the CCMB, Hyderabad, Anand vet

collage to carry out scientific investigation into the reasons for this failure and the means to rectify the same.

## **5. Objective**

The basic objectives of establishing the safari in this UT were

- 1) Conservation of an endanger species – The lions here are pure breed Asiatic lions *Panthera leo persica*. Only at 3 places Junagad, Rajkot and Dadra & Nagar Haveli presently maintain breeding stocks of purebred Asiatic lions.
- 2) To create an education and general awareness regarding the importance of wild animals and conservations of the natural habitat through the interpretation area at the adjoining Nature Education Center.
- 3) To provide an opportunity for scientific study and creation of a database useful for ex-situ conservation.
- 4) To increase the ecotourism potential of the Union Territory by establishment of a Mini-Zoo.
