

- **1.** Report of the Officer-in-charge This annual report of the rescue centre (Amte's Animal Ark) is being submitted for the year 2022-23.
- 2. History of the Rescue Centre The rescue Centre (AAA) was started around 46 years back as an orphanage cum rescue centre for wild orphan animals on mother animal being killed by local tribal for food. Later the local people started bringing baby orphan animals to the rescue centre when they knew about our social objective of conserving of wild life and forest.
- 3. Vision To save wild life and spread awareness amongst local tribal for conservation of wild life and thus environment.
- 4. <u>Mission -</u> To take care of injured/rescued/orphaned animals.
- 5. Objective Main aim of the Rescue centre is to rear and provide life time care facility to all rescued / abandoned young wild animals in the rescue centre.

Additional objectives are as follows:

- (1) Care & looking after the injured and sick wild animals;
- (2) To rehabilitate the rescued animals after veterinary care and after found

fit to be released into natural habitat within 30 days of the rescue;

- (3) Promoting wildlife conservation;
- (4) Sensitizing the local tribes for Conservation of in-situ population of
  - various species of endangered animals and their habitat.
- (5) Creating empathy amongst the visitors towards wild animals through appreciation and better understanding; and,
- (6) Promoting nature-based education.




