# BIJNI DEER PARK

# **ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2018-19**





DIVISIONAL FOREST OFFICER, SOCIAL FORESTRY DIVISION, KOKRAJHAR

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#### 1. REPORT OF THE OFFICER-IN-CHARGE

The Bijni Park is located at about 80 KM from the Division Head Quarter, Kokrajhar. The deer park erstwhile known as Bijni Mini Zoo just after the establishment of the park with four nos. of hog deer (Axis pornicus) some other animal like reptile, amphibians, birds were also kept in the park and it gradually turned into a small size zoo. The area is 3.7 Hac. including 0.8 Hact, water body. But due to paucity of fund the maintenance of the animal become difficult and other animals except deers transferred to Guwahati Zoo. This process was done in the year of 1992-93 and completed till 2007.

Meanwhile in the event of submission of evaluation report by an evaluator from CZA passed an instruction either to shift the animals or shift there to new location owing to the limitation of space and absence of infrastructure like veterinary unit, carcass disposal ground, isolation zone etc.

Since then right from 2010, the process of shifting was initiated by the then DFO in-charge. The initial proposal for trans-shiftment was not possible due to the non compliance of the guidelines of CZA specially the master plan of the new site. A new site was selected at Elachijhar R.F under Kachugaon division which is situated at 3.5 KM distance from the Head Quarter and Council's Head Quarter from Kokrajhar.

The matter then was re-submitted but there was also some technical defects in Master Layout Plan etc. Finally a complete master Plan along with Layout Plan was submitted by this reporting officer during March 2017 through proper channel. But to approval of the same has been awaited till date and the status of the deer park remain the same for more than a decade. Now, today there is some constraints in maintaining the deer park due to the following few points.

- a. Fund: Fund for maintenance of the deer park is sanctioned and released by the BTC once in a year for 5 lac annually. This is not sufficient because everything like food, medical treatment, sanitization, cleaning of entire park area has to be covered by this small amount.
- **b.** There are seven number 7 ( seven) number of staff against the deer park ,but there is no office, staff quarter to accommodate these staff. Only one building inside the compound is there for office and staff accommodation. All the rest of staff resides in rented house.
- c. Inbreeding: there has always been a number of cases of casualties due to infighting which cannot be prevented due to lack of space and thus separating them during mating season. The injured deers are also kept in the same enclosure due to lack of another zone which becomes fatal them.

Whatsoever may be the constraints, the deers are monitored constantly and the health of the animals are maintained amidst lot of difficulties.

Now there is quite ample scope of collection of other animals in the BNC area as many animals are being rescued from forests like hog deers, python,porcupine,bear,slow loris, etc. If the Mini Zoo is established in a new site ( Prosed already sent ) there will be a very good new Mino Zoo at Kokrajhar.

#### 2. HISTORY OF THE BIJNI MINI ZOO

The Bijni Social Forestry Park cum Mini Zoo was established in 1982-83 at Bijni town adjacent to Bijni Forest Depot.

The Park has a total area of 3.70 Ha. including a water body of 0.80 Ha.

The park was created with an intention to provide recreation to the local people of Bijni area.

The park was originally looked after by Social Forestry Division, Kokrajhar and later on handed over to Social Forestry Division, Bongaigaon in 1993 at the time of creation of Bongaigaon Social Forestry Division. But the same park was again handed over back to Social Forestry Division, Kokrajhar in 2007 since the Bijni Park cum Mini Zoo area fall under BTC area but the Bongaigaon S.F. Division headquarter fall outside BTC area. Since then, the Park cum Mini Zoo is being looked after by Social Forestry Division, Kokrajhar although the Park is far away of about 80.00 KM from Kokrajhar.

Originally it is learnt that 5 Hog deers were released in the enclosure of the Park.

A few rescued/procured animals had also been rehabilitated/released in the Park time to time.

#### Remarks-

- 1. Out of 8 Nos. of Goose, 2 Nos. are known to be died and 2 are shifted to Guwahati Zoo.
- 2. 2 Nos. of Tortoise are also known to be shifted to Guwahati Zoo in 2007.
- 3. 1 no Peacock also known to be shifted to Guwahati Zoo in 2007.
- 4. Information about 7 Nos. of Rabbits & Guinea Pigs could not be obtained due to damage of office records by termites (as told) in Social Forestry Division, Bongaigaon.
- 5. Information regarding 1 Porcupine is also could not be traced due to damage of office records by termites as above.

The Bijni Social Forestry Park which is also popularly known as Bijni Mini Zoo was recognized by Central Zoo Authority but now the status has been changed & recognized as Bijni Deer Park and the Registration extended upto 19-08-2021 by Central Zoo Authority, Govt. of India

As per guidelines of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Mini-Zoo animals need to be transferred to Assam State Zoo, Guwahati and the Zoo is to be closed down.

Majority of animals and birds like Tortoise, Peacock etc. have already been shifted to Guwahati Zoo while some are known to be died due to various reasons. But still odd 25 Nos. of Hog deer, 1 Barking deer and 4 Nos. of Geese are there in the Park those are neither shifted to Guwahati Zoo nor other alternative and appropriate/suitable refuge for their sustenance and maintenance are arranged due to various factors.

#### The reasons are enumerated as under-

- First of all, shifting such a large number of deer over a distance of more than 200 KM from Bijni to Guwahati is not easy and would require a considerable amount of manpower and expenditure for cages, hiring of trucks and handling of animals besides other allied matters. The whole exercise will itself be a huge one irrespective of shifting to any suitable Zoo or location.
- Secondly, the deer are highly susceptible to shock and trauma during entire exercise of capture and transportation by road to such a long distance i.e. Assam State Zoo, Guwahati. In this case probability of arising severe problem or mortality etc. cannot be ruled out.
- Thirdly, The Assam State Zoo, Guwahati is already overcrowded with a variety of deer species and adding another significant number those are possibly from inbreed genetic stock may not be desirable.
- Fourthly, the local people have sentimental values attached to these deer and have informally requested the officials again and again to suitably rehabilitate these deer within BTC area. Still, it cannot be ruled out that some local people even object/obstruct of shifting of these deer from Bijni Park cum Mini Zoo to other location due to sentiments they have created in them.
- Finally, keeping in view the large number of wild animals rescued time to time in BTC and lower Assam area, it is felt that it will be a good strategy to establish a rescue cum animal facility centre in this area preferably near BTC headquarter, Kokrajhar.

So, it is with this justification, a proposal for establishing an animal facility near Kokrajhar at Elasijhar Reserve Forest (R.F.) under BTC is suggested and sent to the Central Zoo Authority of India for appraisal and approval.




