

1.	Report of the Officer-in-charge	::	The Divisional Forest Officer, Chittoor East (WL) Division, Chittoor has submitted annual report for the year 2018-2019 vide Rc.No.114/2003/G4, Dt.23.04.2020 which is enclosed.
2.	History of the Zoo	::	The Deer Park, Chittoor was established in the year 1981-82. The Deer Park was firstly evaluated by Sri M.P.Mathur, I.F.S., (Retd., Dy., Conservator of Forests) associated by the then Forest Range Officer and based on the evaluation report, the Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi, was pleased enough to grant recognition for a period of 2 years up to 31.12.1999 to the Deer Park in their No.19/56/93, C.Z.A (23) of 01.01.1998.
3.	Vision and Introduction	::	People of Chittoor Town regularly visit the area for morning and evening walk and relaxing in the Forest area. Hence, it was decided to develop an amusement park for Children and to develop a Deer Park. For the past about 2 decades the Forest Dept is maintaining the Deer park. Ever since the Deer park is opened, the students of various educational institutions, Public and officials are visiting the R.F and the Seer Park. There is a Percolation Tank – Gangirineni Cheruvu touching the R.F and the Deer Park which is now being developed and park is also established which attracts the Visitors. So it is very important to develop the park further. Moreover, a Science Centre is constructed with District funds which is situated adjoining to Children Park and handed over to Education Department, which is also attracting children of Children town and


