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1. **History of the zoo :** Davanagere district is spaced centrally in Karnataka's geographical map. The District once known as "**Manchester of Karnataka**" is now emerging as centre for education with variety of facultised colleges. The district also home renowned Archeological monuments and other tourist spots. The said zoo attracts students, rural folks, urbanites from all over Davanagere District and neighbouring.

The Anagodu Forest Block is situated on either sides of the National Highway No. 4 on Davanagere to Bangalore road, spreadover 151.56 ha. It is about 18 Kms. from Davanagere. The Southern forest block of 101 ha. houses "**Indira Priyadarshini Prani Sangrahalaya**".

2. **Mission :** To connect visitors to animals through exemplary animal welfare and care, best educational and inspirational experiences, fostering public appreciation and support for wild animals and conservation.
3. **Objectives :**
 - Recreation and nature education for children in particular and tourist in general.

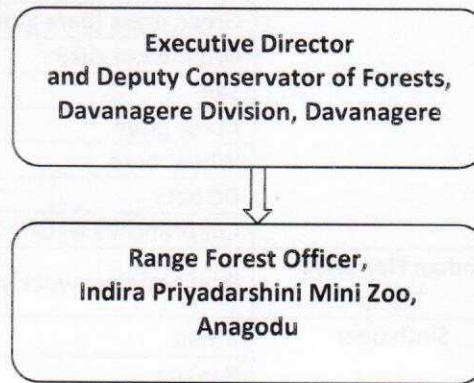
