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## 1. Report of the Officer-in-charge

Karimnagar Deer Park is established in the year 31.10.2014. At the foot planes of the Lower Manair Dam in the lush green patch. This deer Park is only deer palls catering the environment and educational and zoological awareness needs of the people belongs to Peddapally, Karimnagar, Jagtial, Siddipet, Rajanna Sircilla and Kamareddy Districts about 50 Lakhs people various steps are being taken to improve the facilities of the visitors and Zoo animals gradually very well security been provided to the Deer Park all the days for protection of the animals. Call and concerend is taken for the wellbeing of the animals. It is only park in the city for entertaining to people.

## 2. History of the Zoo

The Deer park has been established near Lower Manair Dam, Karimnagar by the Forest Department with the funds provided under the Environmental Management Plan of Sri Ram Sagar Project. An amount of Rs.148.950 Lakhs has been spent on development of the park as on 31-10-2004. The District Administration was involved in the development of the Park from the inception. An area of 30 Acres was allotted by the District Collector in the year 1998. With aims to development of the vacant areas just below the Lower Manair Dam into Parks and Gardens to serve as tourist attractions. The Deer Park has been inaugurated on 9-11-2004.by the then Hon'ble Forest Minister of Andhra Pradesh Sri S.Vijaya Rama Raju Gaaru.

Previously the Park is being managed by the Forest Department. Under the overall Supervision of the Karimnagar Deer Park Development Committee.

Now the Deer park is maintained as per the instructions of the CZA Authorities.

### 3. Vision

To create awareness among the people as well as children towards conservation and preservation of wild flora and fauna and to propagate values of wildlife and its Bio-diversity.

### 4. Mission

The existing animals acquired is from other Zoos or rescued from different places or born in captivity. It is planned to collect different species from other Zoos and provision is to improved further for collection and for maintenance and protection of wildlife within the park area.

There is Environment Education Centre (EEC Building) under the control of a Technician. The Centre is having a library room, a display room and a room for exhibiting Slide & Film for promoting Environment, Forest & Wildlife awareness among the School Children and visitors.

Conservation and Environment Education is being systematically organized by staff on occasions like Vanaya Prani Saptah and World Environment Day, World Forestry Day etc.,

For the Deer Park personal we have proposing systematic training programme in capturing, keeping and tranquilizing of animals which are stray into human habituation.

### 5. Objective

1. To create awareness about conservation of nature and its natural resources and its Bio- diversity.
2. To create awareness about Wildlife and their habitats.
3. To educate the public about the importance of Forests.
4. To educate the children and citizens about wildlife and environment.

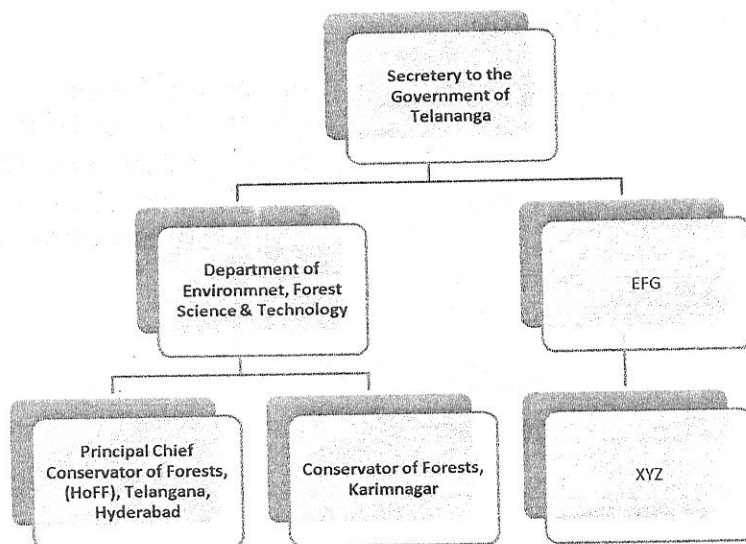

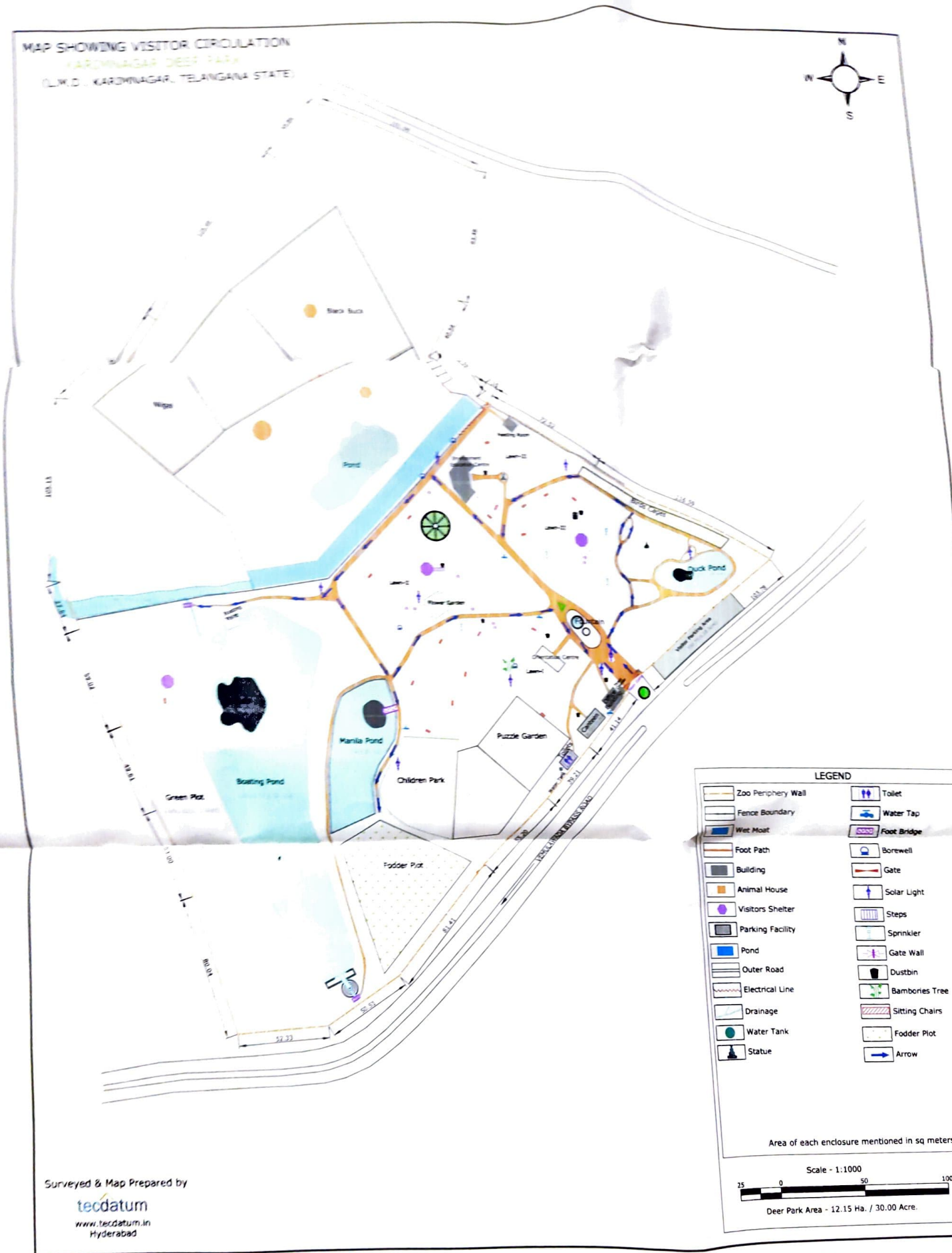

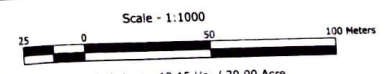


MAP SHOWING VISITOR CIRCULATION

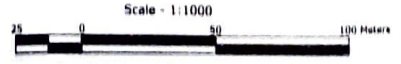

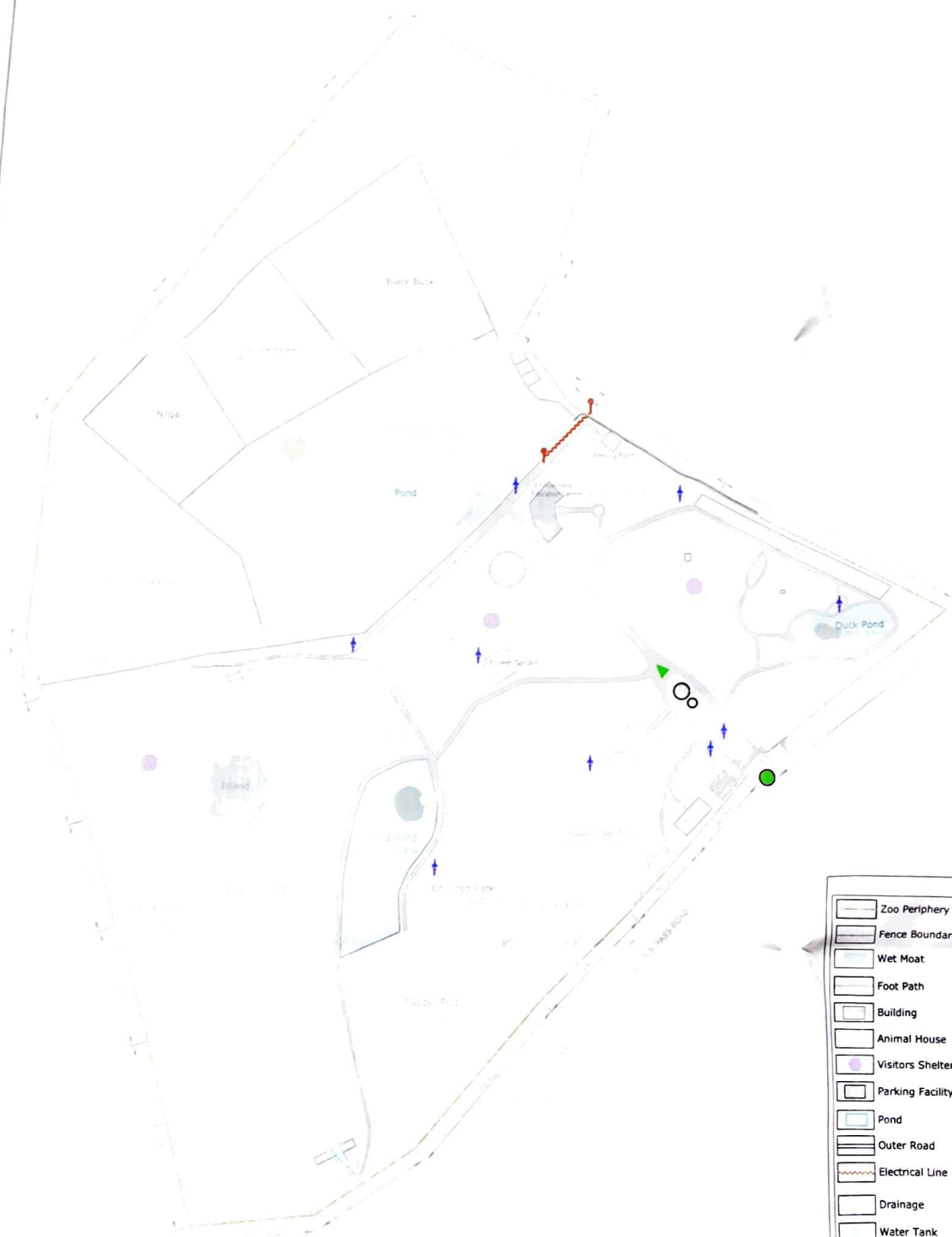

Elevation from AMSL in meters

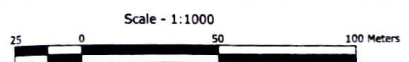
MAP SHOWING OF POWER SUPPLY

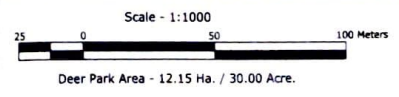

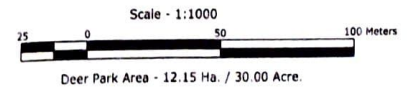
MAP SHOWING OF SEWERAGE SYSTEM
