1. Report of the Officer-in-charge: The Deer park at Kuanria is the only 'Mini zoo' in the Nayagarh District. A large number of visitors not only from Nayagarh but also from Boudh and Phulbani districts do visit to witness the most elegant Deer species having golden body colour with white spots i.e. Chital (Axis axis).

> On an average 100-150 tourists visit the Deer Park daily and no revenue or entry fee is collected from them. Every individual spends at least half an hour in watching the magnificent gesture of the animals. We provide them drinking water, toilet, sitouts, gazebo and separate play area for children to make them comfortable.

> At the beginning of the financial year 2018-19, there were 255 nos. spotted deer with Male - 95 nos. and Female-160 nos. in the Deer Park. The area of deer park was 6.0 Acre. As per the guideline of Central Zoo Authority of India all the prescribed activities of Kuanria Deer Park are being carried out. The deer are fully protected inside the enclosure. There are 8 (eight) nos. of Animal keepers engaged in the deer park for taking care of the park as well as cleaning of deer park premises and periphery. They also collect green fodder from adjoining forest for the deer every day. During the year 2018-19, 15 nos. of fawn were born. One veterinary doctor from the Govt. Dispensary at Dasapalla block headquarters do visit the park regularly to check the health condition of the animals and administer medicines, vitamins etc. regularly.

#### 2. History of the Zoo:



Kuanria Deer park was established during the year 1985 under the administrative control of Divisional Forest Officer. Nayagarh Division having only 5 (Five) spotted Deer (Axis axis). It was transferred to Mahanadi Wildlife Division, Nayagarh with effect from 23.10.2002. The present area of the Zoo is 6.0 Acre. The facility was recognized by the Central Zoo authority as a "Mini Zoo" for the first time vide their letter No. F. 19-105/92-CZA(195) 22.09.2009 of CZA with validity up to 30.09.2012 which has been subsequently renewed from time

to time up to 27.09.2019.vide Letter No. F. No.19-105/92- CZA (195) (vol.1) (PKR)/4926/2018 Dated: 07.12.2018.

3. **Vision**: To protect and preserve flora and fauna of the local region.

4. <u>Mission</u>: To provide natural habitat to wild animals in captivity, suitable for their conservation and to spread the message of ex- situ conservation through aesthetic visitor's experiences.

#### 5. Objective

- I. The main objective of the Mini Zoo is to have ex-situ conservation and also to generate public awareness though environmental education on conservation and propagation of wild animals.
- II. To act as a rescue center for orphan, injured and sick animals.
