People For Animals (PFA), Wardha was established in 1999 to provide safe shelter, medical treatment and food for the animals in distress, and to relocate them at a later stage. PFA Wardha, Unit were established in the year 1999 by a Group of Friends who was interested in Preservation of fauna and flora in Wardha district.

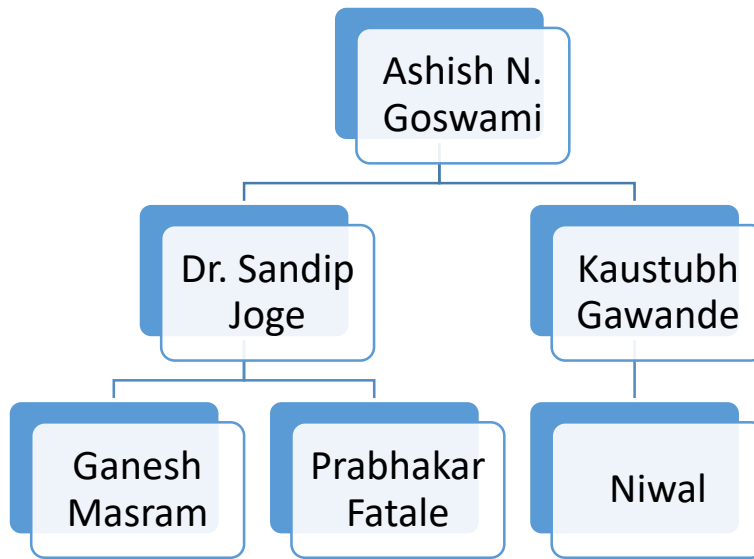
“Zoo Operator” means the person who has ultimate control over the affairs of the zoos provided that_____

19. Important Events and happenings.

One of the major and biggest achievement we got during the last summer season, which is, not a single conflict case registered after started filling artificial water bodies in forest area. According to past registered record of conflict cases, maximum cases of wild animals attack were registered due to searching of water in nearby villages of forest area. In the starting of the summer season, during the habitat study. PFA Wardha team registered numbers of herbivores and carnivores animals around the villages in the search of water.

In present, PFA Wardha filling near about 8-10 major artificial water bodies in forest area which is closed to Dhaga, Bramhanwada, Sindhiwihiri, Khairwada, Borkhedi(Kala), Masod, Saheli with the help of water tank with less contact & crowd, for providing plenty of water to wild animals to avoid there unusual entrance in village area.



Conducted Training programs

- ❖ Training for village youth regarding how to spread information amongst the village communities in case a wild animal is sighted.
- ❖ How to provide first aid to human beings in case of injuries caused by animals.

- ❖ Training regarding construction of toilets, cattle sheds, rescue of animals, coordination with village heads and forest department officials etc.
- ❖ Conducting training program for maintenance of water holes inputs in the buffer zone to village youth and members of Joint Forest Management Committee.

20. Seasonal special arrangements for upkeep of animals.

- Provide rolling bottle feeder for peafowl.
- Scattering grains on the ground for peafowl.
- Frozen fruits provided during summer season.
- Provide some plants in herbivorous animals' cage.
- Special arrangement for birds by cover up the entire cage by joot bags to protect from during hot summer season.
- Provide warm light in bird cages during winter season.
