Report of the Officer-in-charge

Mini Zoo Bhiwani has an area of 4.44 hect.and displays about 91 animals. This was started in 1982. It is one of the favourite place for the people of Bhiwani. About 87286 visitors visited the zoo 2017-18. The zoo experiences the shortage of the staff and absence of attractive animals like tiger and bear. Further the zoo has limited space. It is surrounded by water tanks, residential colony and Mini secretariat. Bhiwani, as such there is no scope for its expansion.

1. History of the Zoo

Foundation stone of bird aviaries in this zoo was laid by late Ch. Surender Singh, the then Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture & Wildlife Preservation, Govt of Haryana on 16.08.1982. Though, this Zoo was set up in 1982 but because of its poor condition the state Government decided to close it down. Later on with the special efforts by Smt. Kiran Choudhry, the then Hon'ble Minister of Forests, Haryana, this zoo was revived by CZA, New Delhi in Sept.2006 and some more enclosures for Bear, Crocodile, Gharial, Hippopotamus, Leopard, Tiger and Deer species were constructed in this zoo under extension program. The total area of this zoo is 4.44 hectare (10.97 acres). At present the animals housed in this zoo are Panther, Crocodile, Gharial, Fox, Spotted Deer, Sambar, Chinkara, Hippopotamus, Red Jungle Fowl, Golden Pheasant, Silver Pheasant, Cockatiel, Love Birds and Jawa Sparrow etc.

To impart conservation message to the visitors.

3. **Mission**

To develop amongst visitors an empathy for wild animals and motivate them to support

the cause of conservation..

4. **Objective**

1. To education and generate awareness among people with a view to develop a healthy relationship between animals and human beings.

2. To educate and motivate the society towards the conservation of wildlife, biodiversity and natural resources.

3. To promote conservation of endangered species through breeding under captive conditions.

4. To create awareness among the general people about our rich fauna & fauna hence to develop a healthy relationship between men and animal for maintaining a healthy ecological balance.

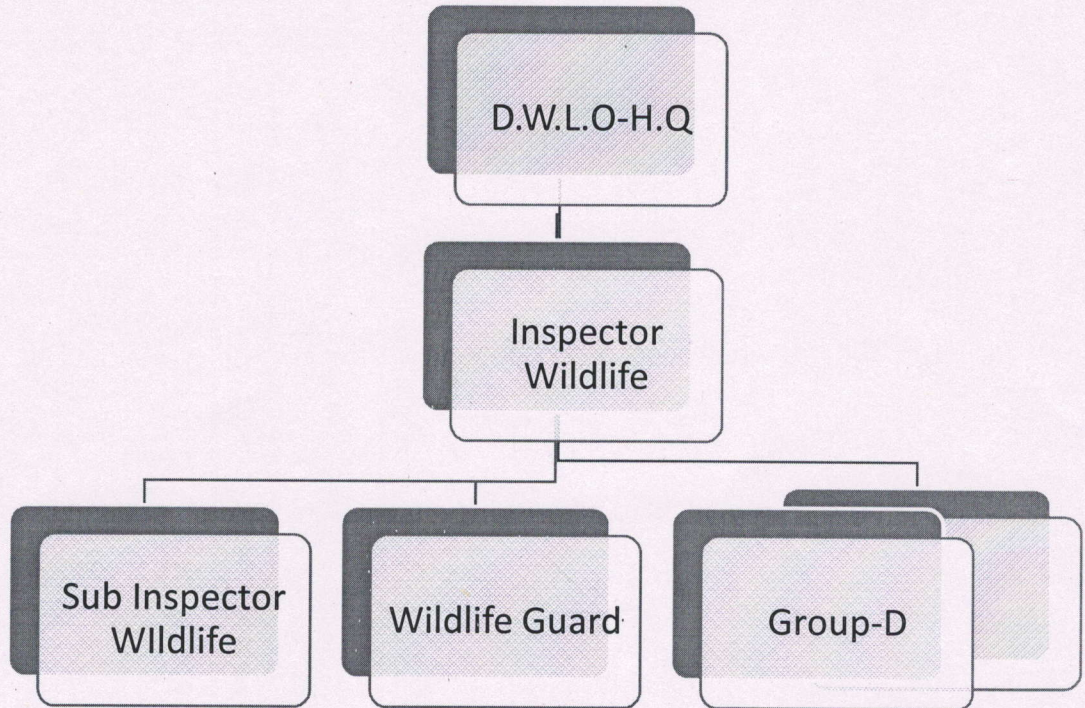
