- **1.** Report of the Officer-in-charge: Dhauladhar Nature Park was established in year 1992. Total area of the Zoo is 12.5 hectares. It is a small category Zoo.
- 2. <u>History of the Zoo:</u> Dhauladhar Nature Park is located at Gopalpur in District Kangra, H.P. at a distance of 20 km. from Dharamshala, 13 km. From Palampur and 6 km. From famous Chamundaji Devi Temple on Dharamshala-Palampur Road.\_Dhauladhar Nature Park is spread over 12.5 hectares with beautifully landscaped gardens interspersed with small forest patched with an abundance of free ranging birds & Butterfly. Himachal Pradesh has been bestowed by Nature with diverse climate conditions. The Climate and teterrian ranges from sub-tropical to alpine and cold desert conditions which inhabits a wide spectrum of floura and fauna. To enable the public visitors to enjoy & know about Nature and Wildlife Dhauladhar Nature Park was inaugurated on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1992. The park is located at a place which presents panoramic view of the unique feature of Dhauladhar Nature Park. Adjoining Tea Gardens adds to the beauty of area.
- **Vision:** To provide natural habitat to various animals & to spread the message of conservation of floura & fauna of the region by awareness educational programmes.


