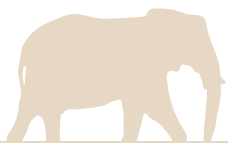

Report of the Officer-in-charge

As Executive Director of Children's Park Cum Small Zoo, Gadag it gives me immense pleasure and pride to present the annual report on the developmental works and conservation education programs undertaken in the zoo during 2017-18 . The year 2017-18 witnessed the opening of a Walkthrough Aviary, the pioneer concept of having free bird sightings while walking within the enclosure, first of its own kind in the entire North Karnataka.

Creation of Awareness in masses esp. young adults and children of age group 10-20years is the main activity carried out by this zoo. 2017-18 year was very memorable in the history of Binkadakatti zoo, as we celebrated 63rd wildlife week in October with grandeur by involving school children, college students, environmentalists, Government officials , range forest officers trainees and local people consecutively since 3 years. We organized different events and competitions for students in zoo premises. Throughout the week local public representatives participated in the program with enthusiasm. A wide publicity was given to zoo, concentrating especially on animal adoption program.

As per the Guidelines of Central Zoo Authority, we have prepared Master (layout) plan for the period of ten years from 2018-19 to 2028-29. After getting the approval for same, will allow the zoo to have many ambitious projects. Among them, the construction of new enclosures for Lion, Hyena, Primates, Snake Park, Construction of interpretation center are a few worth mentioning. Though Binkadakatti zoo team has given its 100% efforts to bring this zoo at the level on par with the best zoos known in Karnataka, still lot more works are to be done. Many more enclosure, better up keep and greater facilities are the deciding factors for better future of Binkadakatti zoo.

I extend my heartfelt thanks to Chairman, Member Secretary and Governing Council members of Zoo Authority of Karnataka for extending their cooperation and support in our endeavor in all forms. I also extend my gratefulness to Chairman and committee members of the Central Zoo Authority of India for providing the required technical guidance and scientific outlook for zoo management. 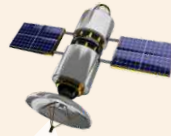

History of the Zoo

It was established in the year 1972 as 'Binkadakatti Children Park' with the active support of the then Forest Minister Shri K. H. Patil who hailed from Hulkoti village which is located about 5 Kms from the Zoo. The earlier plan for this Zoo was prepared by the Curator of Sri Chamarajendra Zoological Gardens, Mysore. Since then lot of improvements and developments have taken place in this Zoo.

The Binkadakatti Zoo is carved out of Gadag protected forests Sy.No.260 declared vide GO No. AFD.234.FAF.61 dt. 31.7.1968.

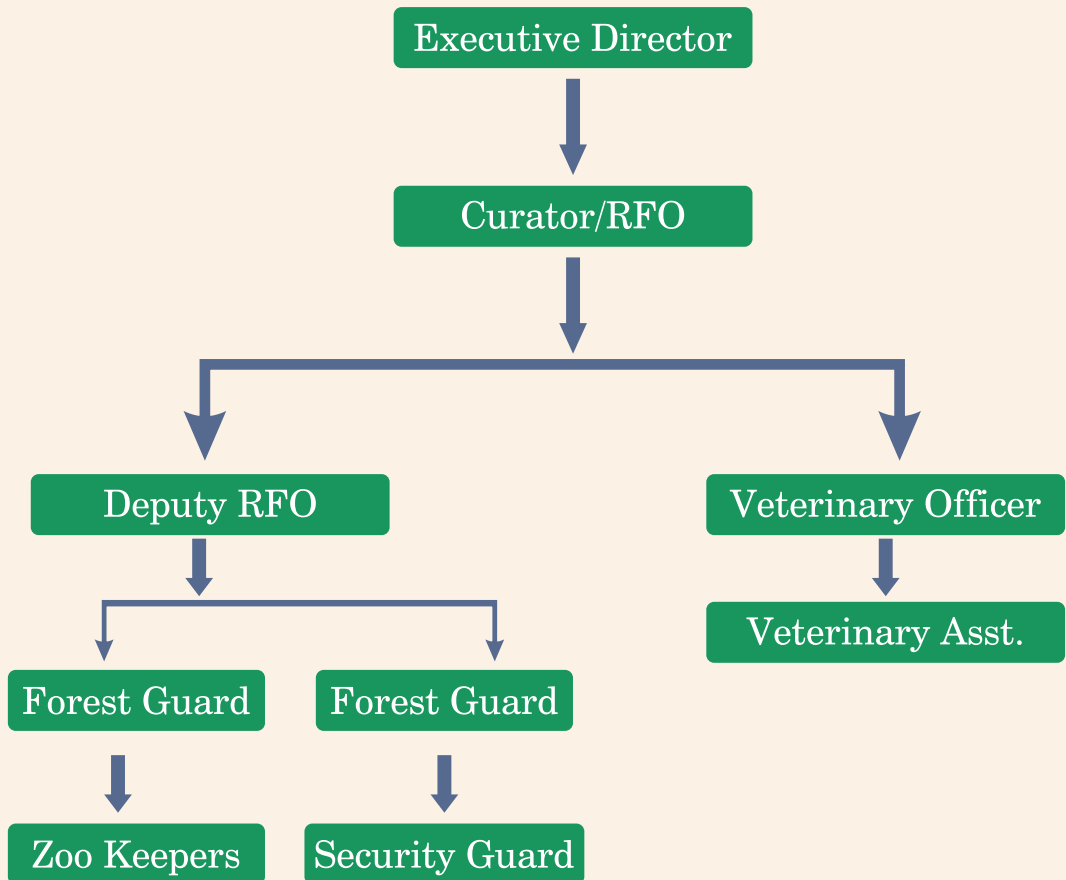

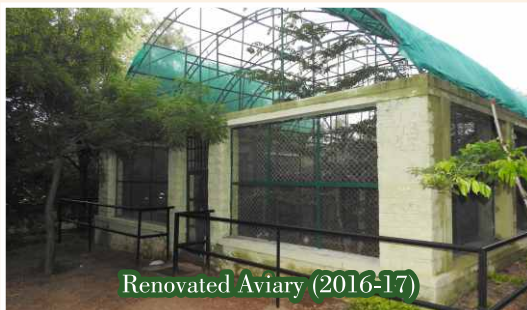
