

# Deer Park, Neelon, Ludhiana

2017-18



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1. **Report of the Officer-in-charge** :- Deer Park is operated by Department of Forest and Wildlife Preservation , Punjab is situated at Ludhiana, Chandigarh Road , Neelon Ludhiana.

2. **History of the Zoo**

Deer Park Neelon derives its name from village Neelon (district Ludhiana) where this park is located. This park was established in the year 1972-73 by the Department of Forests and Wildlife Preservation, Punjab. The curiosity to establish this park arose in the minds of local people as the area was having a unique serene beauty and dominated by compact forests. The area was also rich in resident birds population. The Sarpanch of village Neelon and other local people approached District Collector, Ludhiana who further wrote to the Department to explore the possibility of setting up a park. Keeping in view the demands of local people and serene beauty of the area, compact forests of 8.679 hectare on the bank of old Sirhind canal near village Neelon was chosen to develop as a Deer Park in a meeting of Chief Conservator of Forest, Punjab, District Forest officer, Ludhiana and Chief Wildlife Warden, Punjab. The main idea was to keep few resident birds and one or two mammal species in otherwise spacious lawns to be developed for the local people and on way tourists.

3. **Vision :-**

- (A) To maintain, present bio-diversity levels through all viable and effective means including, appropriate ex-situ conservation and breeding.
- (B) Our vision the human values for protection and preservation of the fauna and flora of the world.

4. **Mission**

We shall strive to provide natural habitats for the animals housed by providing and manipulating suitable environment and spread the message of nature conservation by awareness and educational programmes.

5. **Objective**

- (a) The main objective of the Deer Park Neelon, Wild Life awareness Park shall be to compliment and strengthen the national efforts in ex-situ



conservation and strength the conservation of the rich Bio-Diversity of the country, particularly the fauna.

- (b) Supporting the conservation of endangered species by giving species, which have no chance of survival in wild, a last chance of survival through coordinated breeding under ex-situ condition and raise stocks for rehabilitating them in wild as and when it is appropriate and desirable.
- (c) To inspire amongst zoo visitors empathy for wild animals, an understanding and awareness about the need for conservation of natural resources and for maintaining the ecological balance.
- (d) Providing opportunities for scientific studies, Research and documentation on conservation and creation of database for sharing between authorities involved in In-Situ and Ex-Situ conservation.
- (e) Bring awareness to the public on conservation and propagation of wildlife by conducting regular awareness and education campaigns and programs.
- (f) Providing dedicated facilities for the rescued and orphaned wild animals by providing appropriate housing, clinical and management facilities in off-the display area.
- (g) To serve as gene pool and germplasm reserve for future biological research on wild animals and to extend facilities for studies on behaviour and breeding of different animals.
- (h) To provide recreational opportunity to the visiting tourists.
- (i) To sustain the founder population and also to augment the depleting populations of endangered species in the wild.

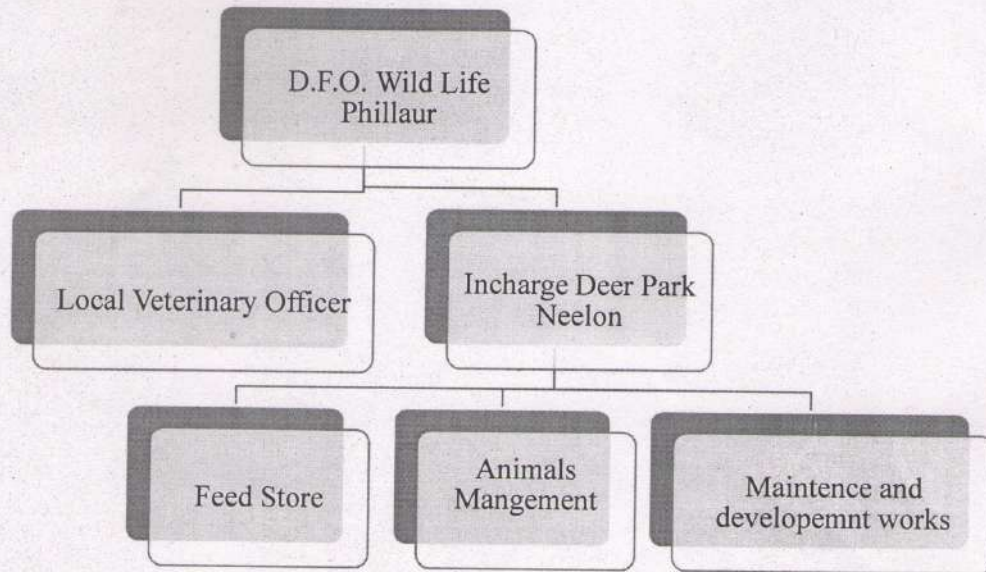
