

Map of Kapilsh Zoo, Dhenkanal


The present Kapilash zoo came up as a Deer Park on 26th Jan 1979 over an area nearly 05 Ha in the foot hills of Kapilash R.F. to provide a source of knowledge to propagate message of nature and wild life conservation among the tourists visiting the famous temple of Lord Chandrasekhar. Subsequently the adjacent area of Kapilash R.F. and some Debottar (Endowment) land have been included and the present area of this Kapilash Zoo of 26.64 Ha. This park got recognition of State Authorities as a Mini Zoo since dt.01.04.1986 and from dt.01.04.1995 it has been recognised by the Central Zoo Authority of India. At present 247 animals are in display consisting of nineteen variety including five species of schedule-I category (Python, Elephant, Mugger, Sloth Bear and Peafowl). One Elephant Rescue Centre housing three rescued elephants received from different places of the State is now functioning in off display area of the Zoo. Looking at the above activities this Zoo is attending four criteria for qualifying as a Small Zoo as per the Classification of Zoos under Sub Rule 9 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.

Objective of Elephant Rescue Centre:

- Receiving elephants in distress, particularly calves deserted by the herds, and rouge elephants which have to be translocated after immobilization.
- Providing Veterinary Care and Service of Mahout and Caretakers.
- Any such elephant cannot go back to the wild.
- The Rescue Centre will also seek to train motivated Mahouts.

The care of the calves is now in the hands of trained person enganged on daily wage basis. Some of them now are experienced to handle the calves. But they are required to be upgraded to the status of Mahout for career progression resulting in better management.









MONTH WISE BOATING TICKETS & REVENUE GENERATED DURING 2018-19



ELEPHANT RESCUE CENTRE

Kapilash Rescue Centre started in the year 2007 inside Kapilash Zoo Comprising of an area of about 4 Ha which was an off display area for public. Presently 3 Nos of elephants including 2 males & 1 female residing in this rescue centre as details below.

- One male Elephant named "Kartik" aged about 10yrs Came from Athgarh Division on dtd.07.07.2010
- One male Elephant named "Chandu" aged about 8yrs Came from Bargarh Division on dtd.24.12.2011.
- One female Elephant named "Uma" aged about 7yrs came from Sadangi Range of Dhenkanal Division on dtd.04.09.2012.
- 4 Elephant Care takers are engaged in Elephant Rescue Centre for taking care of these 3 Elephants.
- 2 Fodder Collectors are engaged in daily basis for collection of required green fodder for those Elephants.
- These 3 Elephants feed on following feed items i.e, coconut, seasonal fruit (watermelon) straw, sugarcane, wheat, paddy, Castor oil, Turmeric, Molasses, Mineral Mixture etc.
- Per Annual Rs.841899/- were incurred for feeding these 3 Elephants.
