

Annual Report on Adina Deer Park

(2016-17)

1. Introduction

Adina Deer Park is situated in the district of Malda. It is heard that this area was within the territorial jurisdiction of King Ganesh. Afterwards the area was looked after by the Jaminder of Pandua as a walk-off-estates. Subsequently it was vested to the Government in 1960-61. An area of 70.17 acres was handed over to the Forest Directorate and subjected for planting. The Deer Park is connected with NH-34 by a metalled road which is under the Control of Local Panchayet. The Deer Park is situated about 23 K.M. North of Malda Town and about 2.0 K.M. eastern side of NH-34 from Adina Mosque.

- A. To Conserve Bio-diversity of lower Gangetic plains.
- B. To promote eco-tourism.
- C. To act as a rehabilitation Centre for Wild animals & birds.
- D. To provide sufficient stock for translocation of spotted deer elsewhere.

20. Water Bodies

There are 9(nine) ponds namely- Bhoot Pukur, Kalipukur, Paranpukur, Bhadupukur, Katapukur, Lamba pukur, Dinmon pukur, Jeeyat-Kundu Pukur, Uttar Pukur inside the Deer Park; Paran Pukur being the largest. Bhoot pukur & Kalipukur are within the wove wire fence being used as drinking water purpose for the captive deer population.

Out of the above area, the fenced deer enclosure measures 7.5 Ha.

22. Road & Bridle Path

Pitch Road (Tar macadam) on a stretch of 2.0 K.M. exists inside the Deer Park from the entry gate to spotted Deer enclosure .Non motorable foot tracks (bridle path) exixsts over a length of 1.5 K.m. inside the park for the purpose of patrolling.
