Annual Report 2007-08 Central Zoo Authority

An Introduction

Zoos in India are regulated under the provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and are guided by the National Zoo Policy, 1998. The Central Zoo Authority was established by the Government of India in the year 1992 through an amendment in the (Protection) (1991 Wild Life Amendment) Act, 1972. The main objective was to enforce minimum standards and norms for upkeep and healthcare of animals in Indian zoos and restrain mushrooming unplanned and ill-conceived zoos that were cropping up in the country as adjuncts to public parks, industrial complexes and waysides.

The Central Zoo Authority is a statutory autonomous body under the administrative control of Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India. The Authority is a twelve body headed member Chairperson. Minister of State for Environment & Forests (Forests & Wildlife) is presently the ex-officio Chairperson of the Central Zoo Authority. Member Secretary is the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority.

The functions assigned to the Authority under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 are:

- (a) to specify the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in zoos;
- (b) to evaluate and assess the functioning of the zoos with respect to the prescribed standards or norms;
- zoo;
 (e) to coordinate the acquisition, exchange and loaning of animals

wild animals for purposes of captive breeding and assigning

responsibility in this regard to a

- (c) to recognise or derecognise zoos;
- (d) to identify endangered species of
- for breeding purpose;

 (f) to ensure maintenance of studbooks of endangered species

of wild animals bred in captivity;



- (g) to identify priorities and themes with regard to display of captive animals in zoos;
- (h) to coordinate training of zoo personnel in India and outside India:
- (i) to coordinate research in captive breeding and educational programmes for the purposes of zoos;
- (j) to provide technical and other assistance to zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- (k) to perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act with regard to zoos.

To carry out the functions of the Authority, two sub-groups of the members, namely Administrative Committee (headed by the Director General of Forests, Government of India - to decide on administrative and budgetary issues) and Technical Committee (headed by the Addl. DGF(WL) - to take decisions on all technical matters) have been formed, which are coterminous with the tenure of the Authority. An expert group on Zoo Designing with one Zoo Designer, one Architect and one Civil Engineer as Members and Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority as convenor has also been formed in the Authority to give recommendations on Zoo Master Plans and approval of the Enclosure Designs submitted by different Zoos.

Central Zoo Authority was held on 21.11.2007. Budget estimate for the year 2008-09 along with the revised estimate for 2007-08 was adopted in the meeting. The Technical Committee met thrice during the year. 45th meeting was held on 16.07.2007, 46th on 01.08.2007, and the Technical Committee had its 47th meeting on 18.2.2008 and considered the recommendations made by the Expert Group on Zoo Designing/ Sub-Committee on Zoo Designing in addition to attending to other agenda.

Prescribing standards and norms

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority in its 44th Meeting held on 23.01.2007 had decided to form one Expert Group for giving recommendations rationalization of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992, as well as on different guidelines issued by the Central Zoo Authority for their compliance. The Expert Group had two sittings during period of report. The draft has been finalized for placing in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority for discussion before submission of the same to the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India for approval.

Evaluation of zoos

3 large, 8 medium, 6 small, 22 mini zoos and 7 rescue centres have been evaluated as zoos during the year. A list of zoos evaluated during the year 2007-08 is placed at **Annexure-I.** Central Zoo Authority also gave in principle approval for creation of a







Night Safari at Greater Noida and Lion Safari at Ambardi in Gujarat, subject to the necessary orders from the Supreme Court of India.

Recognition/ de-recognition of zoos

5 large, 8 medium, 5 small, 20 mini zoos and 4 rescue centres have been given conditional recognition whereas recognition has been refused to 2 rescue centres during the year. Details of different categories of zoos recognized or refused recognition as zoos during the year 2007-08 is placed at Annexure-II. The Central Zoo Authority has received 509 applications from different wild animal holding facilities for recognition as zoos in the last 15 years of its creation. 180 zoos have been given conditional recognition whereas 38 facilities have been found to be not requiring recognition as zoos. Out of the 291 animal holding facilities which have derecognized or refused recognition by the Central Zoo Authority, 260 facilities have physically been closed. There are only 31 animal holding facilities which have been derecognized by the Central Zoo Authority and still holding animals (1563 Nos.) and in process of rehabilitation of these animals. of recognized zoos in India as on 31.03.2008 is at **Annexure -III**.

Conservation Breeding Programme

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to coordinate planned conservation breeding of 63 critically endangered wild animal species in Indian zoos. The species for conservation breeding have been identified in consultation with the Chief Wild Life Wardens, insitu wildlife managers and Zoo Directors. It has been decided that wild animal species with less than 2500 individuals left in the wild and less than 100 animals in captivity in India will be taken up under co-




ordinated planned conservation breeding in Indian zoos. 2 to 4 zoos nearer to the natural distribution zone of each identified species have been identified to participate in the conservation breeding programme. One of the participating zoos has been designated as coordinating zoo for the species, where the off-display conservation breeding centre will be created. A meeting of the Chief Wild





Life Wardens and Directors of zoos of North Eastern States was organized at Guwahati for finalizing the species and other details of conservation breeding of the endemic species of North Eastern India. A meeting of the Chief Wild Life Wardens and Zoo Directors from South Indian States was organized at Ooty to finalize the details breeding conservation the programme for the endangered species of Western Ghats. Similarly, a meeting of the Chief Wildlife Wardens and the Zoo Directors from Himalayan States was organized at New Delhi to finalize the details of the breeding programme of the High Altitude species from A meeting of the Himalayas. concerned Chief Wild Life Wardens, experts and ex-situ managers was organized at New Delhi for initiation of conservation breeding programme for different bustard species in India. 

Maintenance of Studbooks

A Studbook Cell has been established in the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun where the Institute will be preparing and updating the National Studbooks of all the wild animal species which have been taken up for Coordinated Planned Conservation Breeding in Indian zoos. The Wildlife Institute of India has already started working on the Project. It is expected that National Studbook of all the desired species as on 31st March,08 will be published soon. The compiled data and the Studbooks under programme will also be uploaded on the website of the Central Zoo Authority as well as of the Wildlife Institute of India.

Theme/ Planning in zoos

On initiative of the Central Zoo Authority, Ministry of Environment & Forests has issued an order (F.No.11-66/2004-FC dated 13.11.2007) that development and management of zoos in India shall be treated as forestry activity if the works are executed as per the master plan approved by the Central Zoo Authority. The provisions of the Forest Conservation Act will not be attracted in cases where the zoos are operating on the forest land. All the recognized zoos have been given time upto 31st March, 2009 for preparation and submission of master plans to the Central Zoo Authority for approval. The zoos have been asked to consider a proper theme, collection plan and other details while preparing the master plan. Guidelines as well as format for preparation of Master Plan has also been finalized and circulated to all the recognized zoos.

Human Resource Development

Short term training programmes (three weeks) for zookeepers have been organized in zoos at Trivandrum, Chandigarh, Pune, Bhopal, Guwahati and Chennai during 2007-08. All together 153 zoo keepers from various zoos got training in these programmes.




Group Photo: Participants of International Conference on "India's Conservation Breeding Initiative" at New Delhi

Training programmes for mahouts have also been organized at Guwahati and Trivandrum during the year. 36 mahots from various zoos got training in these programmes. Two weeks training programme for middle level zoo personnel/ supervisors was organized at Ahmedabad in collaboration with Wildlife Institute of

India and 22 middle level officers attended the training programme. The theme of the training was Education & Marketing of zoos. 16 Zoo Directors from Indian zoos participated in International Conference Environmental Education organized by Centre for Environmental Education, Ahmedabad with the theme "Making Zoo Education Sustainable with special focus on Fund raising, Public relations and Marketing". Five Zoo Directors (on Regional basis) have also participated in the annual meeting of South Asian Zoos Association for Regional Cooperation (SAZARC) at Ahmedabad from 30th January to 3rd February, 2008. Five Biologists from Indian zoos also attended a conference

on amphibian conservation in Kerala during the year.

Two days training programme on conservation breeding was organized for for the Zoo Directors from all the major zoos at New Delhi on $21^{\rm st}\,$ &

22nd February 2008. The programme extended into an international conference on "India's Conservation Breeding Initiative" on 23rd and 24th February, 2008, where 100 (55 National + 45 International) zoo personnel from 18 countries took part. One Zoo Director and one zoo veterinarian attended three weeks training programme on conservation Durrell Wildlife at breeding Conservation Trust, Jersey (U.K). The Central Zoo Authority also organized two number hands on training programme at New Delhi and Chennai to deal with the avian influenza where 25 veterinarians from major Indian Zoos participated. The Member Secretary attended annual meeting of Conservation Breeding Specialist Group (CBSG) and World Association of Zoos & Aquarium (WAZA) at Budapest, Hungary during the month of August, 2007.

Research

The Central Zoo Authority has Memorandum signed Understanding (MoU) with Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Bareilly for Rs. 31.33 lakhs to work on "Standardization of animal diet in Indian zoos". The study is of three years duration. The Authority has also approved Rs. 3.70 lakhs for Rajiv Gandhi Zoological Park, Pune to work on the "Guidelines for upkeep of reptiles in Zoological Parks" for two Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Science University, Chennai has been provided Rs.3.70 lakhs to work on "Common foot ailments in

captive Asian elephants" under the small grant fellowship scheme for two years. Central Zoo Authority has also approved Rs. 3.86 lakhs for preparation of conservation breeding management plan for Clouded leopards to Sepahijala Zoological Park in Tripura for two years.

Improvement of zoos

The Sub-Committee on Zoo Designing had its meetings on 13/14 June, 2007 and again on 31st June, 2007. Master (lay out) Plans of Mahatama Gandhi Udyan Zoo, Solapur and Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot were approved. Designs for off-display conservation breeding centres for Cheer pheasant (Chail, H.P), Hume's Pheasant (Aizwal Zoo, Mizoram) and Blyth's Tragopan (Kohima Zoo, Nagaland) were also approved in addition to approval of designs of 7 enclosures animal number of submitted by different zoos. Newly formed Expert Group on Zoo Designs had two sitting i.e. 27.12.2007 and 13.02.2008 and recommended approval of Master (Lay out) Plan for VJB Udyan Zoo, Mumbai and Night Safari at Arignar Anna Zoological Park in addition to approval of designs of 24 animal enclosures.

The Technical Committee met thrice i.e. on 16.07.2007, 01.08.2007 and 18.2.2008 during the period of the report and approved financial grant worth Rs. 1111.77 lakhs for improvement of zoos during the year. Seven Rescue Centres dealing with Lions and Tigers rescued from the







circuses have been provided Rs. 352.97 lakhs for their maintenance including feed and medicines during the year. Details of the grants released to different zoos and other organizations during 2007-08 is given in **Annexure-VIa & VIb.**

Administrative Matters

The Administrative office of the Central Zoo Authority is presently housed at Annexe-VI, Bikaner House, Shahjahan Road, New Delhi. There are 15 regular/ contractual scientific/administrative personnel in the establishment of the Central Zoo

Authority to assist the Member Secretary in discharge of his duties. The position in respect of the office establishment of the Central Zoo Authority and the names of the posts are as follows:

Financial Matters

During the financial year 2007-08, Central Zoo Authority received Rs.1700 lakhs as Grant-in-Aid from Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India. Out of this, Rs. 1527 lakhs was released as Grant-in-Aid to different recognized public sector zoos and other organizations during the year.

Other Activities carried out during the year


The Central Zoo Authority has

The Central Zoo Authority has also decided to sponsor joining of all the major Indian zoos to the ISIS/ZIMS for the XIth Five Year Plan Period.

On the initiation of the Central Zoo Authority, Ministry of Environment & Forests has agreed to the creation of a Centre for Zoo Science at New Delhi. Modalities of the same are being worked out.

A manual on barrier design and Indian Zoo Year Book, Vol.V has been published during the year.

3. Depreciation



Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Central Zoo Authority for the year ended 31 March 2008

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Central Zoo Authority (CZA) as on 31 March 2008, the Income & Expenditure Account and the Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 38G of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, These financial statements are the responsibility of the CZA's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2 This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General, of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the law, rules & regulations (propriety and regularity) and efficiency-curn-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG?s Audit Reports separately.
- 3 We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4 Based on our audit, we report that:
- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in. the format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Central Zoo Authority as required under Section 38G of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1.972 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

Understatement of Assets

1. The Ministry of Environment and Forests released Rs. 6.30 lakh to the Authority for organizing "International Conference on Vulture" against which







the Authority spent Rs. 7.58 lakh during the year 2005-06. The excess expenditure of Rs. 1.28 lakh was yet to be reimbursed by the Ministry. The Authority had, however, not shown the same on the Assets side in the Balance Sheet[^] despite being pointed out by the previous audit as a result of which the assets were understated to the extent of Rs 1.28 lakh.

B. General

Revision of accounts

The CZA revised the accounts at the instance of audit. The revised accounts were submitted on 11.08.2008. The effect of revision is that the head 'Other Income' of Income and Expenditure *Ale* came down to Rs 468T-(from Rs 18,05,4687-) and the head 'Grants/Subsidies' increased to Rs 17,46,89,0687- (from Rs 17,28,84,0687-). However there is no effect on the Balance Sheet.

C. Grants in aid

Out of the grants in aid of Rs. 17.00 crore received during the year, the organization utilized a sum of Rs. 17.47 crore as on 31^s March 2008. The excess expenditure of Rs 0.47 crore was met from the unspent balances of previous years.

D. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- (v) Subject to our observations in the preceding-paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and

Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

- a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Central Zoo Authority as at 31 March 2008; and
- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

Annexure

(i) Adequacy of Internal Audit System: There is no internal audit wing in the Central Zoo Authority. Internal audit had not been conducted since inception.

The Authority stated that it is a small office and no need was felt for a separate internal audit wing for such a small office.

- (ii) **Adequacy of Internal Control System:** There is scope of some improvement in the internal control system of the Central Zoo Authority as the following deficiencies were noticed:
- a. The Expenditure Control Register to ensure that the expenditure under various heads remained within budget allocations was not maintained.
- b. The Broad Sheets to monitor the recovery of long term advances was also not maintained.
- c. As per good practices for internal control, cash is required to be physically verified periodically by a Senior Officer not associated with the custody or recording of such cash transactions. The cash of the Authority for the year 2007-08 was not found physically verified periodically by a Senior Officer who was not associated with the custody or recording of such transaction.
- d, Sub-vouchers were not found cancelled to avoid their reuse for payment.
- e. Store items were being issued without any indent/requisition slip, (iii) Test check of records revealed that Asset Registers were not maintained properly as some relevant columns were skowi.
