Annual Report of activities 2016-2017

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Dhauladhar Nature Park (Zoo) Gopalpur

Dhauladhar Nature Park is located at Gopalpur in District Kangra, H.P. at a distance of 20 km. from Dharamshala, 13 km. from Palampur and 6 km. from famous Chamundaji Devi Temple on Dharamshala-Palampur Road.

Dhauladhar Nature Park is spread over 12.5 hectares with beautifully landscaped gardens interspersed with small forest patched with an abundance of free ranging Birds & Butterfly. Himachal Pradesh has been bestowed by Nature with diverse climatic conditions. The Climate and terrain ranges from sub-tropical to alpine and cold desert conditions which inhabits a wide spectrum of flora and fauna. To enable the public and visitors to enjoy & know about Nature and Wildlife Dhauladhar Nature Park was inaugurated on 23rd April 1992. The Park is located at a place which presents panoramic view of the unique feature of Dhauladhar Nature Park. Adjoining Tea Gardens adds to the beauty of area.

ZOO ACTIVITIES AT A GLANCE (FOR PERIOD APRIL 2016-MARCH 2017

ANIMAL HABITATS AND UPKEEP

Zoos are dynamic Institutions and being public places are always under visitor scrutiny with respect to the facilities provided both for the animals and people. Thus Changes are imminent to happen. The Central Zoo Authority has approved a Lay out plan for reconstruction of the zoo and the same is to be executed in the next coming years During the year under report following activities were taken up as part of improving upon the existing enclosure and enhancing the enrichment activities to improve the condition of animal enclosure:

- Precaution and preventive measures taken against Avian Influenza outbreak like potassium permanganate solution regularly pour around all the enclosures throughout.
- Footbaths have been made in the entrance of all the enclosures and night sheds of the animals
- Couple of new initiatives taken for Feeding like rain shelters has been made.
- List of wanted, surplus animals and animal collection plan of the Zoo has been prepared and finalized.

ANIMAL HEALTH CARE

- Captive animals and Birds were dewormed on regular basis for reduction of Endo & Ecto parasites.
- A Zoo veterinary team through their regular intervention kept check of the injuries and surgical repair, if any, caused to animals due to infighting or otherwise.
- The rescue and rehabilitation of wild/stray animals is also executed by veterinary unit of the zoo.




FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE
