

कमला नेहरू प्राणी संग्रहालय में प्रदेश का पहला जूनॉलेज सेंटर बनेगा। 100 बाय 100 वर्गफीट में बनने वाले इस सेंटर के लिए 1 करोड़ रुपए खर्च होंगे। इसमें प्रदेशभर के वेटरनरी और साईस के छात्र 150 प्रजातियों के जंगली जानवरों पर शोध कर सकेंगे। यहां वन्य जनजीवन और वन्य प्राणियों के साथ होने वाले अपराधों की जानकारी भी दी जाएगी।

Zoo Education:

Education is fundamental to our commitment to conservation. Since the inception, Indore Zoo is offering engaging programs that educate our community about wildlife, help visitors feel connected to animals, and motivate them to take action to preserve the natural world.

Year around programs for all ages are conducted to bring the excitement of learning about wildlife. Tens of thousands of children and adults attend classes, programs, special events, workshops and outreach programs.

Opportunities to learn are throughout the zoo, from educational signs and interactive, to encounters with zookeepers. And of course, just watching our animals during zoo guided tours were made an educational experience.

Indore zoo has grown as a conservation educational institution over the years. Various new and unique initiatives have been taken up by the zoo to give impactful wildlife educational experience to our visitors. For doing so, our group of volunteers from <u>ARPF – India</u> and other animal welfare NGOs has played a major role in shaping our educational module.

Few initiatives taken up this year by the zoo as as follows:

 Launched Zoo Ambassador Network: Largest in the state, this network offered wildlife enthusiasts to stay connected, learn and contribute towards zoo educational outreach and zoo news.

Total Signups: 559

• Specialized Education Workshops: We conducted special educational workshop based on species and environmental days to engage and educate visitors, students on short educational projects. Every month one workshop was held at Zoo Conference room which shortly saw an increase in the participation numbers due to our unique modules.

Some of the Workshops held: Young Zoo Keeper, Zoo Keeper for a Day, Know your Reptile, Which Avian is it?, Dig your Reptile, Mega Jumbo class, etc.

- **Zoo SnooZee Program:** Special Zoo Snooze workshop was held for the first time in the state to give visitors specialized experience of walking through the ex situ habitat and watch our nocturnal animals active.
- Environment Days celebrations: Special Environmental days and activities were conducted to keep visitors hooked on to our conservation educational efforts.
 Visitors were educated and involved in various fun related activities to learn importance of wildlife conservation and biodiversity importance. Each environmental day were outreached through our media network for the city to learn and gain.

- World Wildlife Week: Amidst much fanfare, wildlife week was celebrated as a grand carnival at Indore Zoo. A week filled with special guest lectures, NGO stalls, environmental games, Drawing/Painting/Quiz activities for schools, zoo clean drives, special talk and feeding shows for students and visitors were held.

Experts on 4 topics were flown in from different parts of the country to educate our visitors and students on specialized conservation challenges and issues. Mega Plantation drives were held and students were educated about the importance and role of Zoo in ex situ conservation.

- Weekly shows/Activities: 10 Zoo Corps have been trained who help zoo staff on every weekend and public holiday in vandalism control, zoo guided tours and educational shows.
 Special Snake Awareness shows, Animal Feed Shows are held every Sunday to educate mass visitors about wildlife and its eco habitats.
- <u>Specialized Internships:</u> Special Wildlife internships are held for students from various institutions on wildlife and zoo conservation for free of cost. Students are trained and educated on importance of Wildlife and Zoo role in conservation.
- Paper contribution for International E- Journal: A paper on Zoo role in rescue, treatment and rehabilitation as well as research in terms of Non Target birds stuck in Glue Traps was published on behalf of Indore Zoo in Ela Foundation Vol. 5, issue 4.

Indore: In a first of its kind Indore: In a first of its kind, Indore zoo is in the process of running an outreach van that would promote wildlife education among students inrural area.

inrural area. The van that is expected to start in October would inform about different types of flora and fauna. It would connect to different schools in the district. "We are focusing on creating awareness among the students living in far-flung areas and not having an access to modern technologies in schools," satechnologies in schools," sa-id Dr. Uttam Yadav, the zoo

in-charge. The hi-tech van would ha-The hi-tech van would have modern equipment that would help in screening movies and short films related to wildlife and environment. Infertile eggs of different birds, dead skins of snakes and replicas of many plants and animal would also be displayed on the van.

The zoo officials would also organise quizzes and games for children. "There is a severe lack of knowledge

about wildlife among child-ren. When they'll be able to see and touch these original eggs and skins, they would develop an interest about wildlife. They would under-stand how different creatu-res evolved," said Nihar Pa-rulekar, education officer, ledars zee

rulekar, education officer, Indore zoo.

The van would also create awareness among the students about issues like ecosystem imbalance, green house effects, deforestation, crucial role of scavengers and damage to food chain. "This will not be similar to what they learn in textbooks, We will give them practical experiences," Yadav sa-

id. He informed that it would be divided into 16 blocks that would cater to different forms of wildlife and plants. Zoo officials said that their aim is to reach as many as 500 students daily. The proposal of making such a wan first came around a year ago. However, several hindrances, including budget issues delayed the project.

"We had earlier planned for outsourcing. But, when the private parties demanded more than Rs2 Jakh, we decided to do the work in the zoo itself," said Yadav adding that the total expenditure of the van was not more than Rs2 45,000.

Zoo gets student 'keepers' for a day

Indore: In a first of its kind initiative, Indore zoo gave 15 children the opportunity to become zoo keepers for a day. The initiative was a part of an education programme by the zoo to create awareness on wildlife among children.

They were taught about the behavior, food habits and how to take care of various animals. The children were taken to different enclosures and were given a first-hand experience of understanding animals' behaviour.

"We decided to give this opportunity to children as this is the age when they have many queries that in most cases go unanswered," said Nihar Parulekar, curator and education officer, Indore zoo.

He said that he was amazed by the children's observation, "We keep salt bricks in on wildlife," he added. the Sambar deer's enclosure

as they like to lick it and it gives them the calcium they need. If they don't get it, they lick their horns, which contains calcium," Parulekarsaid in response to a student, Dhruva Mishra's query.

"I think that our programme was a success. We wanted children to ask such questions, this would help create more interest in them

The children were also

taught zoo protocols and how steps need to be followed in case of a disaster.

Officials said such initiatives are common in zoos in foreign countries but have not been implemented in any in the country.

The zoo plans to come up with an outreach van for rural areas to create awareness on animals. The zoo will also come up with a book library dedicated to wildlife.


