PFA has formed Eco- clubs for schools collages to spared awareness in public. People from various villages are involved in conservation activities, like joint forest management, wild life protection etc.

people for animals runs various projects in rural areas on human wildlife conflict. To control this situation we aware local villagers, give importance about wildlife and its conservation and why they are necessary to sustain our



environment. By the medium of this project we will try to create awareness measures like enacting street play, distributing pamphlets, pasting wall posters, screening film shows, field demonstration and workshop by experts may be undertaken. Apart from this we will try to teach them how to protect their crops using natural techniques from wild boar, nilgai. At the same time we will teach some rescue techniques and standard operating procedure for managing human wildlife conflict to the forest department and try to make a well trained rescue team in every villages near to the Bor tiger reserve's protected area.

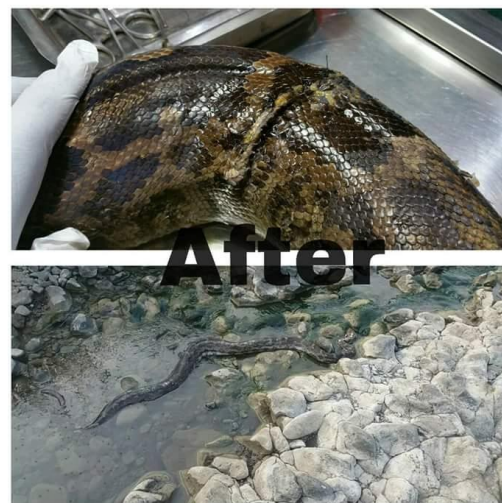
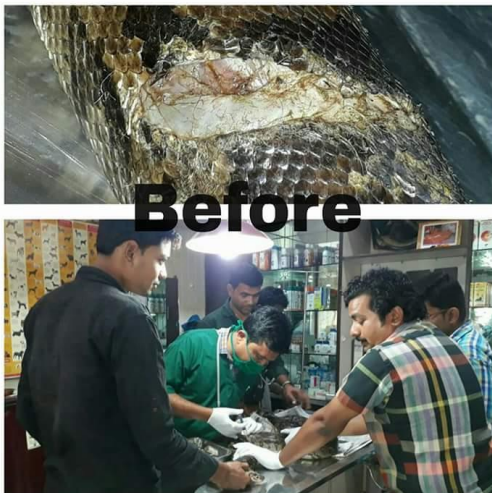


Rescue and rehabilitation of wild animals

On 23rd December, 2016, on receipt of information from Range Forest Officer, Hingni Range (Wardha Division), that a leopard has fallen into a dry canal and it is to be rescued. PFA, Wardha, rescue team containing specialized rescue volunteers, Veterinary Surgeon along with a rescue van reached site on the same day. After catching the leopard which is in a dehydrated condition, the team brought the same to PFA center for further treatment. After providing the required treatment and getting the fitness certificate from the Govt. Veterinary Surgeon, the leopard was handover to gorewada transit center Nagpur.



On 11th January, 2017 on receipt of information local farmer from waigaon wardha. The python was stuck into cultivator machine and got severe injury. It was rescued by PFA wardha rescue team, after one month treatment and care it was released into Bor Tiger Reserve.
