1. Report of the Officer-in-charge

Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Zoological Park is located on the Gorakhpur-Deoria bypass road near the picturesque Ramgarh Tal and about 08 km away from Gorakhpur Railway/Bus station and about 11 km from the airport. This zoological park is the first zoological park of Purvanchal and the third of Uttar Pradesh. The historical Ramgarh Tal is situated on one side of it and the distance of the historical and famous Gorakhnath temple is also only 10 km from the zoo. The city of Gorakhpur is surrounded by the Rapti and Rohin rivers. Kapilvastu, the birth place of Mahatma Gautam Buddha and Kushinagar, the place of Parinirvana, is also close to this city. It has developed as a delightful place from the point of view of tourism, due to the proximity to the circuit house, Buddhist museum, Planetarium, boating and water sports complex, etc.

The purpose of the establishment of this zoological park is to protect and promote wildlife and to make tourists aware of the importance of conservation of natural resources to maintain ecological balance.

By using state-of-the-art scientific methods and resources for conservation of wild animals, breeding/proliferation of protected wild animals, giving priority to the collection and breeding work of wild animals of endangered species. It shall be maintained in such a way that every wild animal fulfills the implication objectives of the zoological park. To achieve this objective, a detailed management plan of each species is also being prepared by the zoological park management.

High-class closed-circuit cameras have also been installed in the zoological park area for effective protection of wildlife and tourists. A state-of-the-art veterinary hospital has also been built for monitoring the health of wild animals, scientific study of their nature and research. Apart from this, incinerators have also been installed for disposal of dead wild animals and veterinary waste.

2. History of the Zoo

In year 2009, the State Government of Uttar Pradesh decided to establish a modern zoo in eastern part of U. P., which will play a vital role in awareness among the people as well as to improve the conservation facilities of Wildlife in this area. Adjacent to Gorakhpur City and on the bank's of Ramgarhtal, 121.342 Acre area of land was found suitable for the purpose of Zoo and hence this beautiful place was established. This area has all natural requisites such as woodland of 29.75 Acre, wetland of 34.01 Acre and suitable place for Exhibit and other infrastructures (Parking, Administrative Building, Enclosures, Public Facilities, Service Area, Quarantine Centre, Hospital Area, Food & Kitchen Store, Postmortem Room, Incinerator Building and Residential Area) of 57.58 acres. By the letter no of Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi F . No. 20 – 4 /2008– C Z A (M) Dated 29-01-2009 and order Dated 29-01-2009 on Writ Petition no. 47/1998, the permission was granted to establish the Zoological Park.

Initially, the name of the zoo was decided as “Manyawar Kanshiram Prani Udyan Gorakhpur” but by the Government order no. 975 / 14 – 4 – 2012 Dated 21-05-2012 of Uttar Pradesh Forest Department, Government of Uttar Pradesh, Section – 4, the name of the Zoological Park was finally decided as “Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan Gorakhpur”.

The construction of basic facilities such as boundary and retaining wall as well as land filling to the whole acquired area was started in 2009. On 12-11-2019, the Master Layout Plan of Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan Gorakhpur was approved by Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi vide letter no. F. No. 20- 4/200-CZA (Vol. IV) (PKR) / 1717 / 2019 and on dated 06-02-2020, Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi approved the Master Plan of Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan Gorakhpur, vide letter no. F . No.20 – 4/2008-CZA(Vol.V)(PKR)/2117/ 2020.

Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi approved the Animal Collection Plan of Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan Gorakhpur vide letter no. F.No.20-4/2008-CZA (Vol. IV) (PKR) /1719 / 2019 Dated 12-11-2019. In the end of 2020 the construction was completed. After the completion of all the other facilities, The Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan was recognized as Zoological Park vide Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi letter no. F.No.20-4/2015-CZA(Vol.II)(E) Dated 18-12-2020 under the section of Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 – 38H (1), (3) & (4).

In the month of February and March, 2021 more than 150 wild animals of 34 species from different Zoological Parks were transported successfully to Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyan Gorakhpur and finally after quarantine and acclimatization, the Zoo was opened for visitors by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Uttar Pradesh Shri Yogi Adityanath on 27-03-21.

3. Vision

Zoological parks, of late, have undergone a complete conceptual change from merely being a place for keeping wild animals in captivity, just for their exhibition value. Now the modern zoos have multifarious roles to play. Besides age old exhibition and recreation values, zoos shoulder additional responsibility to act as nature conservation centres to further the cause of wildlife conservation. Zoos also have education value, where the visiting publics get an opportunity to learn about nature, natural history, eco-systems, wildlife and their conservation issues to get sensitized to become nature lovers, leading to become conservationist. Zoos are nature's laboratories, offering ample opportunities to carry out research on animal health, nutrition, food, diseases, anatomy, physiology, inter and intra spp. behaviour, breeding biology and to make base line data pool of healthy spp. for clinical treatment of wild animals.

The world zoo Conservation Strategy of 1993 formulated by the I.U.C.N. has defined the role of zoos and aquariums in conservation of species globally and assigned to the zoo world, a key role to play in species conservation. The Strategy affirms the need for zoos to co-operate with each other, in captive breeding programme and to convey to their visitors a global conservation message.

Most zoos are still seen as “animal prisons” that don't even look after their inmates properly. But zoos are changing. In modern zoos, only a few animals have to spend their lives behind bars. In the best cases, they have plenty of room to move in spacious artificial landscapes based on their natural habitats. Animals are now only very rarely taken straight from the wild, because many species are protected, so most animals in zoos today have actually been born there. The World Association of Zoos and Aquariums (WAZAA) wants today's zoos to concentrate on conservation and make the public aware of nature and environment issues.

Gorakhpur Zoo is situated in tarai arc landscape of focal terrain of Gorakhpur in Uttar Pradesh. The area is rich bio-diversity and so to activate the network of key conservationist, strategist and people with a set goal of positive contribution towards nature and its conservation.

As we know that every Zoological Park in the country has been mandated to conserve a local species of that area and Gorakhpur Zoo being assigned the mandate for conservation breeding of Indian one horned rhinoceros.

Gorakhpur Zoo is only place in the eastern part of U.P. covering approximate 25 districts, out of which more than 05 districts have natural dense forest and different wild animals including Schedule I and II in it. To overcome from man-animal conflict situation and to save the animals which are orphaned or unable to sustained their life in dense forest, the Zoo has a rescue facility. This is the only rescue facility operational in the eastern Uttar Pradesh, variety of wild animals had been rescued at various periods of time.

4. **Mission**

“Inspiring passion for nature and saving wildlife for future generations”.

5. **Objective**

Having appreciated and recognizing the responsibility of zoos in wildlife conservation, education, research and healthy educational recreation and to achieve the goals set by Central Zoo Authority, in National Zoo Policy, 1998, the future objectives of the **Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan (S.A.U.K. for short) Zoological Park** being set up, at Gorakhpur, will be as under: -

1. To supplement and strengthen the national efforts in conservation of the rich biodiversity of the country particularly the local wild fauna.
2. To support the conservation of endangered species through coordinated breeding programmes among the zoos, under ex-situ conditions and raise faunal stocks for rehabilitation in to the wild following proper rehabilitation programme, whenever and wherever, it is desired.
3. To educate zoo visitors in particular and masses in general through education, awareness and outreach programmes to inculcate in them empathy and love for wild animals, spreading understanding and awareness about the need for conservation of nature for maintaining the ecological balance and ensuring man’s own survival
4. To provide opportunities for scientific studies/research useful for conservation in general and creation of data base for sharing between the agencies involved in in-situ and ex-situ conservation.
5. To provide and avail opportunities to carry out research for veterinary requirement of wild animals.
6. To collect and preserve specimen of dead animals for education in Universities and colleges in Zoology and vet. Sciences.
7. To provide educational recreation to the stressed masses for their welfare and create a linkage between humans and their wild brethren.
8. To function as rescue centre for orphaned and salvaged indigenous wild animals, and making them fit (if not too old and decrepit) for release in to the wild after restoring their health and following release and rehabilitation protocol.

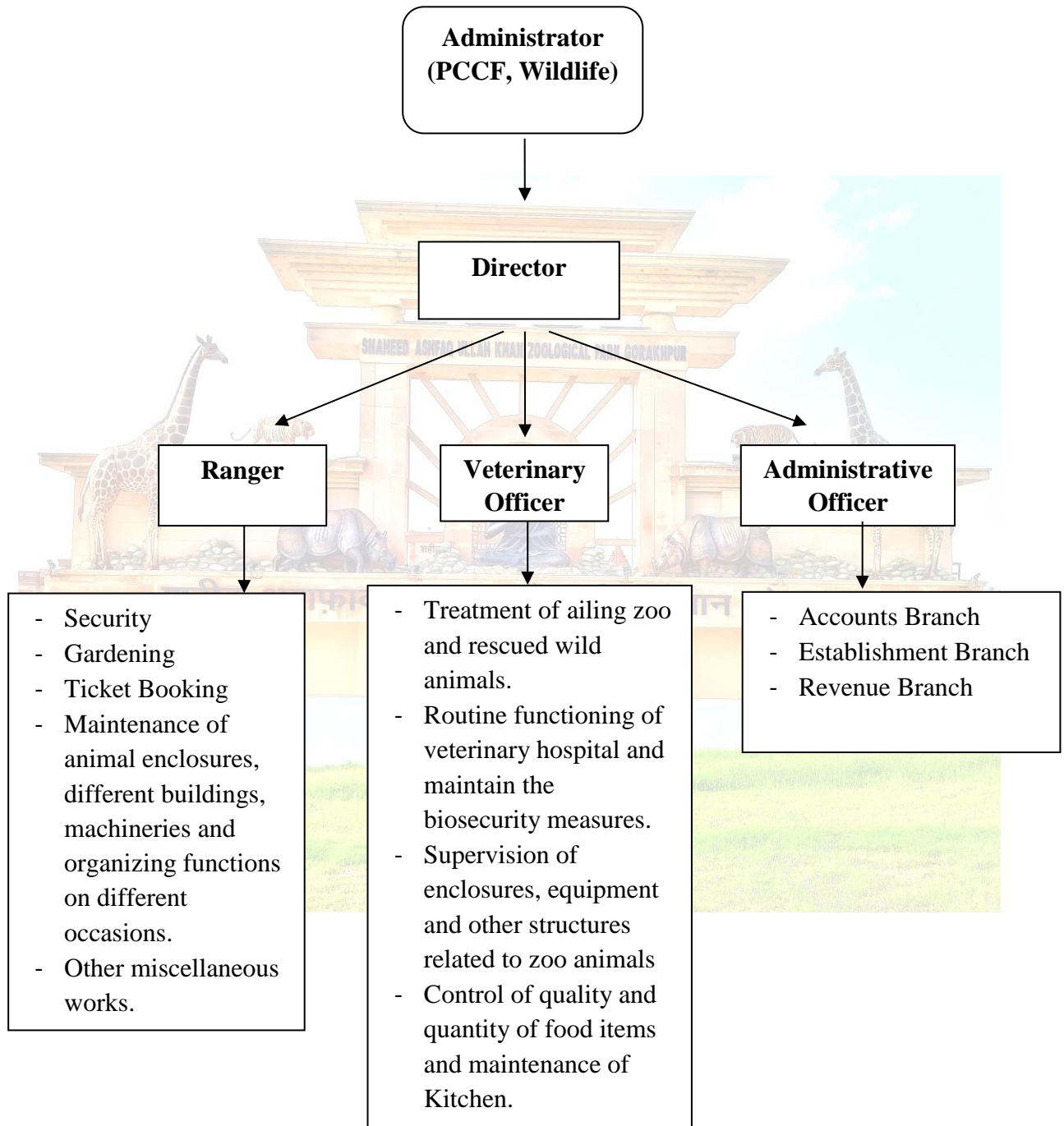
"Zoo Operator" means the person who has ultimate control over the affairs of the zoos provided that _____

In case of zoo owned or controlled by the Central Government or any State Government or Union Territory Administration or any Trust or Society funded by the Central Government or a State Government or a Union Territory Administration, the Secretary of the concerned Department of that Government, or as the case may be the Union Territory Administration, shall be deemed to be the Zoo Operator.
