REPORT OF THE OFFICER-IN- CHARGE

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual update of Kittur Rani Channamma Zoological Park for the year 2024–2025. The zoo continues to serve as a center for conservation, education, and recreation in the Belagavi and southern Maharashtra region. As a Mini Zoo recognized by the Central Zoo Authority, our team has worked with dedication to maintain animal welfare standards while also enhancing public engagement and visitor experience.

During the year, the zoo recorded a total footfall of 246000 visitors, generating a revenue of ₹1.81 crore. Although the numbers reflect a slight decline compared to the previous year, this was largely due to the ongoing development work on National Highway 4, which impacted accessibility. Despite this, the interest from schools, families, and wildlife enthusiasts remained encouraging.

One of the key highlights of the year was the addition of a pheasant enclosure, made possible through an animal exchange program with Jaya Chamarajendra Zoological Garden, Mysuru. This not only enriched our avian collection but also enhanced the educational value of our exhibits for visitors. Our zoo also participated in an exchange programme with Bannerughatta Biological Park (BBP), Bannerughatta, Bengaluru by acquiring female lion.

Significant progress was also made in infrastructure development. We successfully established a dedicated food store house, kitchen and meat room to ensure scientific management of animal diets. Additionally, a Post-mortem and Incineration Unit was constructed to handle animal casualties in a hygienic and professional manner, meeting important welfare and regulatory requirements.

To improve visibility, gigantic highway signage work is also in progress and state-of-the-art information boards were placed across animal enclosures. These boards provide visitors with detailed knowledge about species, their habitats, and conservation status, thereby supporting our role as an awareness center.

The zoo also actively organized awareness and outreach activities, including celebrations of Wildlife Week, Zoo Day, and other environmental events. These initiatives involved students and the general public through competitions, guided tours, and talks, helping to build a deeper appreciation for wildlife and conservation efforts.

Looking ahead, we are working towards upgrading the zoo from Mini to Medium category, which will enable us to house a wider range of species, improve conservation initiatives, and provide more advanced facilities to both animals and

visitors. We are committed to aligning with CZA guidelines and making the park a model center for wildlife education and care in North Karnataka.

I sincerely thank the Member secretary, Zoo Authority of Karnataka for his continuous guidance and Curator, Veterinary Officer, animal keepers, and the education and outreach team for their tireless efforts and commitment. Their coordinated teamwork has been instrumental in ensuring the smooth functioning and growth of the zoo. With continued support and collaboration, we hope to reach greater milestones in the coming years.

HISTORY OF THE ZOO

Kittur Rani Channamma Zoological Park, established in the year 1989 as Kittur Rani Channamma Nisargadaham. It was named after Rani Channamma, a revered freedom fighter of Kittur Kingdom, who born in Kakti village, which is 5 Km from zoo. The zoo was notified under GO No.HHFF.91.FWL-89 Dated: 04-08-1989. The zoo began modestly with enclosures designed for 12 deer and 3 nilgais.

After approval of Master Layout Plan by Central Zoo Authority in the year 2018 the zoo was expanded to an extent of 34.48 Ha area was carved out of Bhutaramanahatti and Honaga reserved forest. Presently zoo includes fascinating animals like Tiger, Lion, Sloth bear, Leopard, Crocodiles, Hyenas etc. Currently the zoo exhibits 205 specimen comprising 10 species of mammals.

Kittur Rani Channamma Zoological Park is not only a space for wildlife conservation and recreation but also plays a vital role as an **awareness and educational centre**. Its initiatives aim to foster a deeper understanding and appreciation of biodiversity, environmental issues, and wildlife conservation among the general public, especially students. Through its education and outreach initiatives, **Zoo** is shaping a more informed and environmentally responsible generation. It effectively bridges the gap between wildlife and the public, turning visitors into advocates for nature.

The rising footfall reflects the zoo's growing popularity as a family-friendly recreational destination and an educational centre for wildlife conservation. The zoo plays a pivotal role in promoting environmental awareness, especially among young children. The impact of the zoo reaches beyond Belagavi contributing significantly to the district's economy. As the zoo continues to develop, we are actively working on expanding it into a medium zoo. This will elevate the zoo's status, bringing Belagavi city into the national and global spotlight.

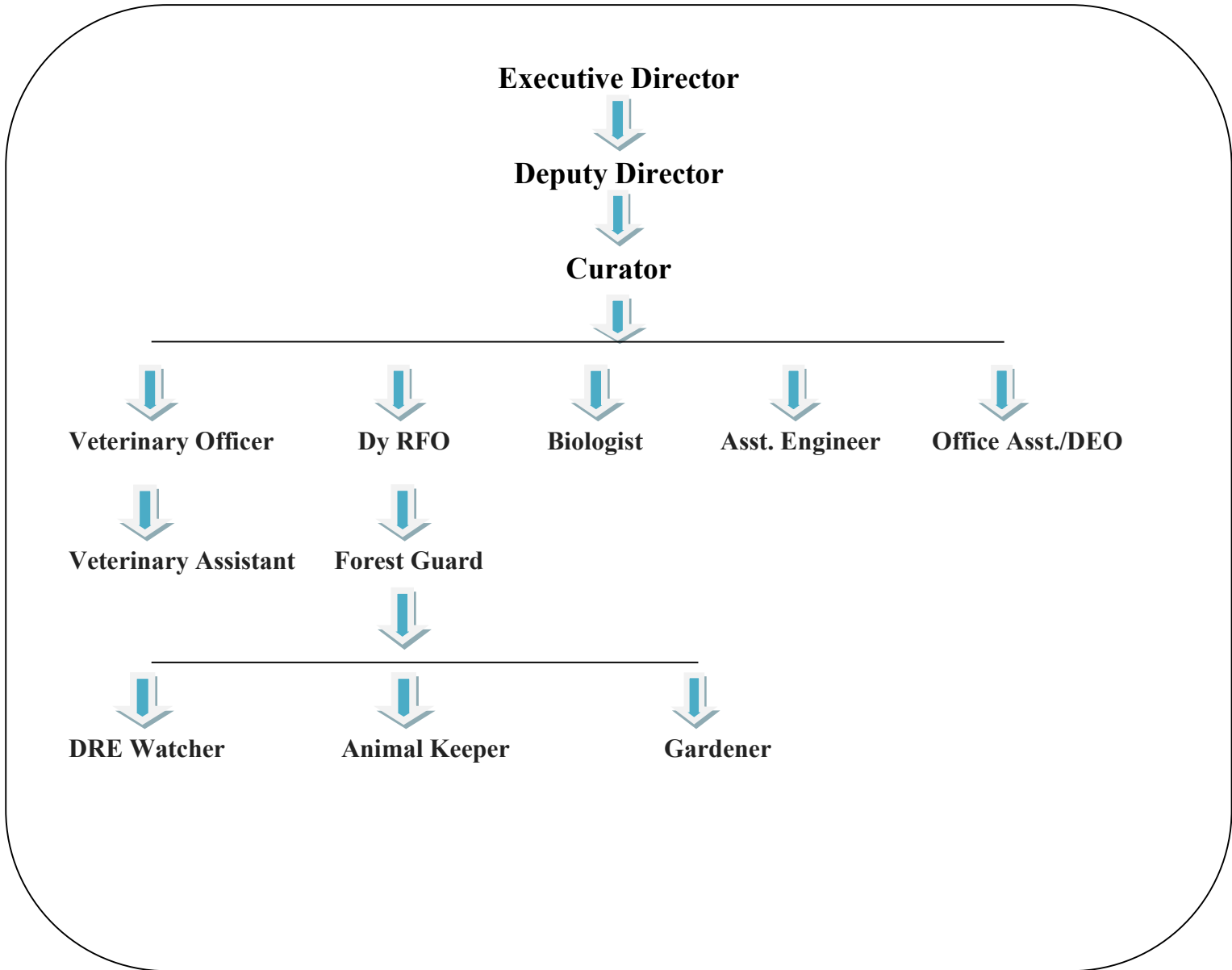

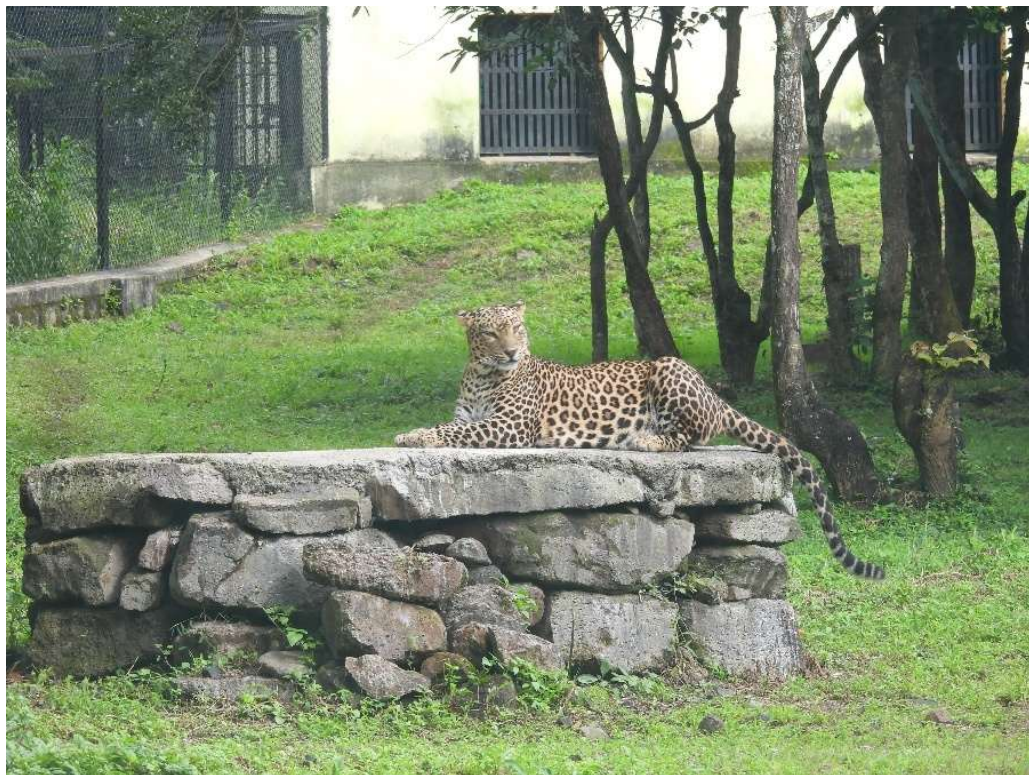
