Sir,

Reference is invited to your letter No. PFA/WDA/311/2012/GN dated 24.03.2012.

The revised Master Plan submitted for the long-term development of the Animal Shelter Home, People for Animals, Wardha was scrutinized by the members of the Expert Group on Zoo Designing of the Central Zoo Authority. The Master Plan and Layout Plan shall be considered for approval subject to the following changes:-

- (i) It has been stated that this center will provide shelter and veterinary care to domestic, abandoned animals like cows, buffaloes and dogs (Pg 12,13). It is contrary to Recognition of Zoo Rules to have domestic animals in zoos. So this unit should be separated from the wild animal enclosures by a wall of height of 2 meters with independent entrance.
- (ii) The location of night houses for snake and aviary enclosures should be marked in layout plan.
- (iii) The amphitheatre should be removed, as agreed. The provision of Rs. 1.70 lakhs is shown as earmarked for the purpose in the budget estimates (Pg 44) for open air theatre should be deleted from list of expenditure.

Keeping in view of the above, you are requested to revise the Master Plan and submit four amended copies to this Authority for its approval at our end.

**The PRESENT**





## 1. Introduction

Wildlife is an integral part of the entire ecosystem. The existence and the balance of various levels of the living world depend on the correct interaction between the flora and fauna of the wild.

Modernization has incurred a curse on the peace of the wildlife though it has brought a sense of security to the human beings. Activities like mining, construction, rapid industrialization etc. have taken excessive advantage of the capacity of Mother Earth to sustain the need of the ecosystem, which has led to a direct negative impact on the life supporting factors such as ground water level, climate and fresh air. These changes have affected everyone but the wildlife seems to be at stake due to destruction of their natural habitat.

The recent years have witnessed an increasing conflict among human beings and the animals of the wild due to destruction of the flora of the forests resulting from excessive cutting of trees for agricultural and constructional purposes. This encroachment of humans on the land of forests has disturbed the entire balance of the wildlife as the complete food chain has been disturbed, somewhere par repairs. The wild animals are thus helplessly compelled to leave the forests and search the adjoining towns and villages for water and food. Human beings living in these areas thus live in panic if the animal is a carnivore. If the animals are herbivores, destroying the yield of crops, the people prefer to adopt every means to make these animals return the forests which often proves dangerous to the animals leaving them injured and helpless. Such animals are not capable of returning to the wild on their own as they are left injured and stranded.

The animals in the wild have no one to monitor their health. There have been, in the past, lots of cases where precious wildlife has been lost due to the unawareness of its health problems, these health problems which would have been curable. Thus wildlife casualties cannot be left unattended. This is because many of India's endangered species occur in discrete and fragmented populations, every loss means further decline in the effective population size.

These animals are then taken to the zoos where they are looked after. But such zoos are often overcrowded and very few in numbers. Thus the measures taken by the government are proving somewhat insufficient. The reputation of zoos gets tarnished as these animals for

the want of space are kept in substandard enclosures. There has been a general public opinion that such animals should be taken care of. There is a class of people who dare to champion the cause of animal welfare in the society. So there is an urgent necessity to allow the people willing to work hard for conserving the invaluable wildlife, to take up the charge of effectively rehabilitating the wild animals which lies well in their capacity. Rehabilitation is a wildlife management tool, which if strategically used, can significantly contribute to conservation of wildlife.

The People for Animals Shelter House cum Wild Animal rescue center "Karunashram" at Wardha, proposed in this document, is one such step forward for effective wildlife rehabilitation.

### 1.1 Wardha, Vidarbha, the Central India

The district of Wardha is located in the Vidarbha Region of the State of Maharashtra, the central India. Vidarbha region is rich in forest and mineral resources. Its lush green deciduous forests are home to a variety of flora and fauna. In fact, all of the tiger reserves in Maharashtra are situated in Vidarbha. They are Melghat Tiger Reserve in Amravati district, Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve in Chandrapur district, Pench Tiger Reserve in Nagpur district and Nagzira wild life sanctuary and Navegoan Bandh National Park (bird sanctuary) of Gondia District is also very popular. Maharashtra's oldest National Park created in 1955, is the Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve. It is also one of India's 25 Project Tiger Reserve. Aside from tigers, Tadoba Tiger Reserve is home to rare Indian wildlife like leopards, sloth bears, gaur, wild dogs, hyenas, civet and jungle cats, and many species of Indian deer like sambar, cheetal, nilgai, and barking deer. The Tadoba Lake sustains the Marsh Crocodile, which were once common all over Maharashtra. Tadoba is also an ornithologist's paradise with a varied diversity of aquatic birdlife, and Raptors. But this region is under continuous threat of human invasion as it is very rich in mineral resources thus it is extensively exploited for mining. Recent news has that some more 21 coal mining projects have been sanctioned in the Tadoba region. The wildlife in the region is thus at stake. Also there is no animal rescue centre in the whole Vidarbha except the Maharajbag zoo.

The fauna consists of deciduous trees. Teak trees are abundant in this region. The common associates of teak in these areas are *Dhaara* (*Anogeissus latifolia*), *Salai* (*Boswellia serrata*), *Tendu* (*Diospyros melanoxylon*) and *Ain* (*Terminalia tomentosa*). The other trees are

Bamboo, Gardenia, Satinwood, Mahua and Jamun. The trees which are found within the protected area are, Ain, Arjun, Bor, Bel, Chichwa, Kusum, Rohan, Salai, Shisham, Sisoo, Shivan etc. Khair (*Acacia catechu*), *bor* (*Zizyphus jujuba*), *Palas* (*Butea monosperma*) *Jilhilli* (*Woodfordia fruticosa*) are the main species occurring as underwood and under growth. *Tarota* (*Cassia fortis*), *Ban tulsii* (*Eranthemum pulchellum*) and *Diwali* are the main weeds.

The climate of this region is characterized by a hot summer and general dryness throughout the year except during the southwest monsoon season. The rainfall varies for different districts. The eastern part getting more rain than the western part. This has led to differentiation of the forest type. The eastern region of Gadchiroli and Chandrapur has a patch of thick dense forest which constitutes the Tiger reserves mentioned above. The rest of the region has sparse deciduous forests.

The human population of Wardha is 113759 according to the recent census and is still growing thus adding pressure on the forest land as it is being encroached for construction and building.

The proposed People for Animals Shelter House "Karunashram" is located in Wardha. This district is located at 20.75° N 78.60° E. It has an average elevation of 234 meters (767 feet). The average annual rainfall is around 1000mm. The location of this place is of strategic importance from the view of wildlife conservation and rehabilitation as it is surrounded by the Tadoba Tiger reserve on the south eastern boundary. Also it is neighbour to the district of Chandrapur and Amravati which are rich in forests.

This district lies in the basin of the rivers Wardha and Wainganga. To its north are the trails of the Satpura Ranges. The Wardha River flows along the entire northern and western borders of the district. The Wunna (Venna), along with the Bor and Dham, is an important tributary of Wardha and constitutes the main riverine system within the district. The Satpuda pass through the Bor sanctuary in the Seloo taluka of this district. The fauna of this region can be divided in two parts- the big game and the small game. The big game includes the animals like Nilgai, Black-buck, four horned antelope, Sambar, Cheetal, Panther, Tiger and Sloth bear. The small game includes the Spot-bill duck, Water birds (egrets and herons), Jungle fowl, Partridge (grey and painted), Pigeon and Dove, Hare, Hyaena, Wolf, Wild pig, Chinkara and Barking deer.

The Non-poisonous snakes found in this area are *Pytas Mucosus*, *Python Molurus* (ajgar), *Eryx conicus*, *Natrix Stolata*, *Typhiops Braminus*. The poisonous snakes found here are *Naja-Naja* (the cobra), *Bungarus Coeruleus* (the krate snake), *Vipera Russellii* (viper).

This place is well known all over the world for its rich history marked by the residence of Mahatma Gandhi "Bapu Kuti" in the Sewagram village. It has also been the working ground of many great national leaders like Vinoba Bhave, Jamanalal Bajaj and many others.

The primary aims and objectives were to effectively rehabilitate any injured animal which came to notice, using the available infrastructure. Thus **"Karunashram"** became the rehabilitation and veterinary skill unit of PFA WARDHA which aims to achieve the following objectives:

1. To create state- of- the- art animal hospital for rescued disadvantaged animals, which have been confiscated, injured, maimed, orphaned, sick or gone astray.
2. To preserve wildlife in its Natural environment.
3. Promote ethical and humane treatment to animals.
4. To stop killing of stray animals and provide them shelter.
5. To rescue performing animals and animals from illegal animals markets.

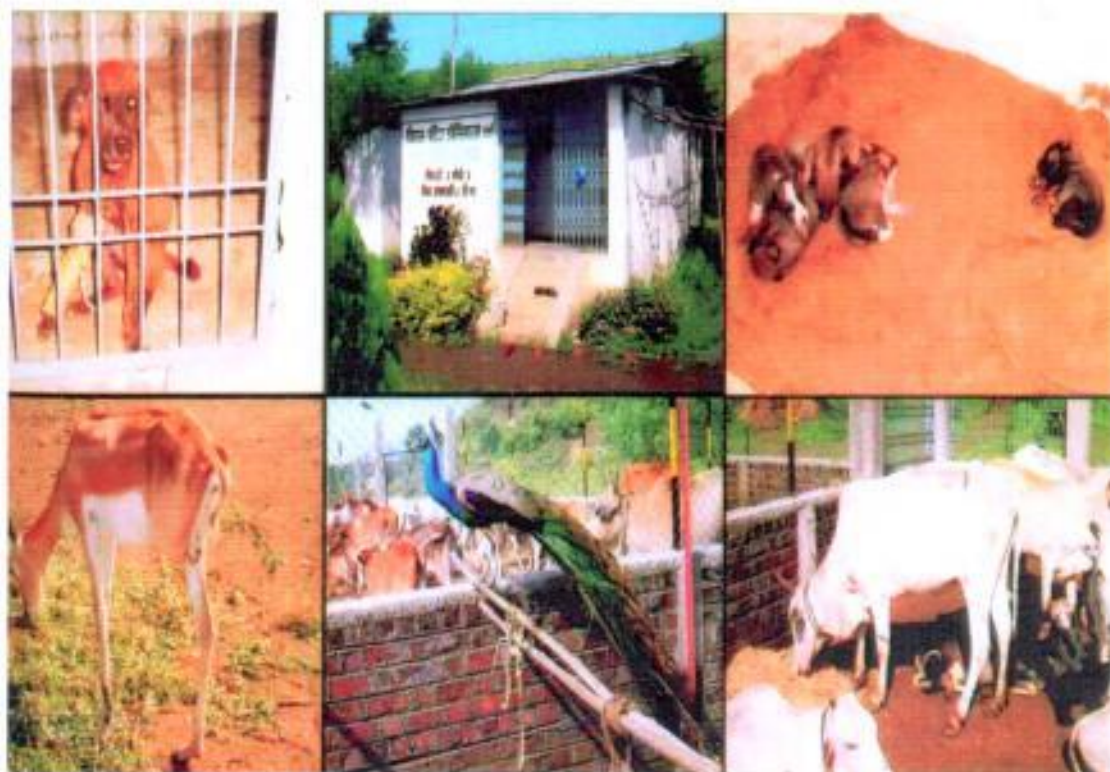


Fig: Various animals admitted to Karunashram

### 1.3 Regulation of Karunashram

The Regulation is done on the norms of People for Animals organization, whose national president is Mrs. Maneka Gandhi. People for animals is recognized by

1. Animal Welfare Board of India (Ministry of Environment and forest, Government of India),
2. Central Zoo Authority, Government of India,
3. Veterinary Council, Government of Maharashtra.

Also, the secretary of PFA unit, Wardha, is a honorary Animal Welfare Officer. This project is backed by the government state of Maharashtra, as every possible help has been granted by the state in terms of water and land resources.

The centre has been in collaboration with the regional Veterinary College and hospital, Nagpur and the District Veterinary hospital, Wardha. Regional Science colleges and the governmental organizations like Magan Sangrahalaya, centre for Khadi Gram udyog, Centre of Sciences for villages and NGO's like Nisarga Sewa Samiti, Dharamitra have been partners in promoting our work.

## 1.4 Site selection and preparation

The selection of site was done, taking into consideration the economic and managerial constraints. A patch of land on the outskirts of the main town of Wardha, at a distance of about 3 kilometres, on the foot of a small hill, in the village of Pimpri Meghe was found appropriate for the development of such centre. The following attributes acted as major guidelines while the site selection was done:

- Easy access of water, electricity and telecommunication facilities.
- Best possibility of reproducing a natural habitat for the animals.
- Least Anthropogenic interference but availability of manpower for managerial, official, constructional and developmental purposes.
- Proximity to national highways, roads and transport facilities.
- Minimal risk of natural disasters like floods and earthquakes.

A land of 2 hectares was purchased from the government of Maharashtra in 2003. This land is close to Nagpur – Mumbai national highway no. 7. Also it is surrounded by a grazing land of 10 hectares. The government of Maharashtra has reserved this patch of land as a green zone.

During construction some measures were taken to ensure minimal interference of humans and other invasive animals. They were as follows:

- Construction of a road adjoining the area of construction to facilitate easy transport. This road also served as a boundary between the centre and adjoining college of polytechnique.
- Construction of brick compound for nullifying anthropogenic interference
- Fencing on the hill to protect the animals in the centre from invasive animals.
- Security Guard post at the entrance

## 1.5 Establishment of “Karunashram”

Keeping in view, the need of the time to provide shelter to any rescued animal, be it wild or domestic, the available land was divided into 4 parts.

1. Stables for domestic animals like stranded and abandoned cows and buffaloes.

2. Office, Veterinary unit (hospital), security Guard post.
3. Enclosures for wild animals.
4. Cultivation of crops for self sustainability of the project.
5. All domestic animals enclosure section should be separated from wild animal enclosures with 2 meters height boundary wall with separate entrance.

The land was completely barren when it was purchased in 2003. Extensive cultivation measures were undertaken along with the construction of enclosures to create a natural environment for the animals.

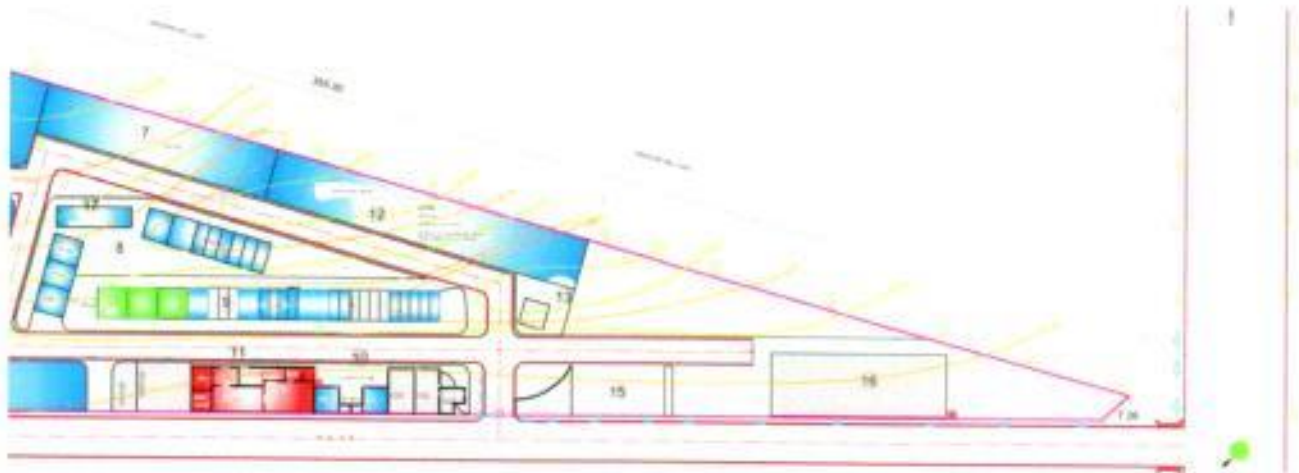
The premise is covered with greenery for most of the year. The hill slope is used for cultivation of fresh fodder grass in which accounts for fodder for herbivores at the centre. The availability of fodder cutting machine makes it possible to provide fresh fodder to the animals. This fodder is also dried and stored in the storerooms for rest of the year.

The office area consists of total 4 rooms:

1. An administrative office.
2. The hospital and operation theatre.
3. Post operative care room for domestic animals like dogs.

There are 20 compartments in each post care room where operated animals can be kept safely. One room is for security guard near the entrance.

The hospital is self sufficient in all the medical and surgical equipments, operation table, medicines, storage and cooling facilities for medicines. The centre has highly experienced veterinary doctors.

The centre has a water tank of storage capacity of 60,000 liters. The water is drawn from a distant well and 3 bore wells of the centre which provides ample supply of water to the centre. The development of water shed on the entire adjoining hill with a view of checking soil erosion of the hill, effective utilization of rain water for growing trees on the hill slope and increasing the water level of the area has also been undertaken by the centre recently.

The distance between the area for domestic animals and wild animals is more than 250metres thus minimizing interference between them.

As the project is not funded, it is of utmost importance that it should be self sustainable. The plantation of seasonal crops like sugarcane, wheat and other vegetables is a part of the self sustainability of the project. The centre also provides fodder for the livestock in the adjoining villages which makes a continuous source of income for the maintenance of the establishment. The proposed construction.

As the construction has been done with very limited economical resources, some of the enclosures do not satisfy the established norms for building the enclosures, but still helpful in providing temporary relief and shelter to the injured animals.

## **1.6 Campus Expansion and development**

Even though, the land under construction of enclosures for wild animals today is limited, the scope for more construction, if proper funding is made available, is very large. New structures to be built in this available area are as follows:

- An operation theatre and ICU unit especially for wildlife casualties.
- A store room and a clinic.
- A Bird Nursery for casualties needing protracted care.
- A herpetarium.
- An enclosure for Wolves and Jackals.
- An enclosure for Leopards.
- An enclosure for bears.
- An Enclosure for Monkeys and langurs.
- Isolation shed
- Seminar hall for volunteer training
- Solar Fence.

- The centre is also looking forward for getting a X-ray machine of its own.

All these constructions will be done in the new campus area. All these proposed constructions are shown in the map.

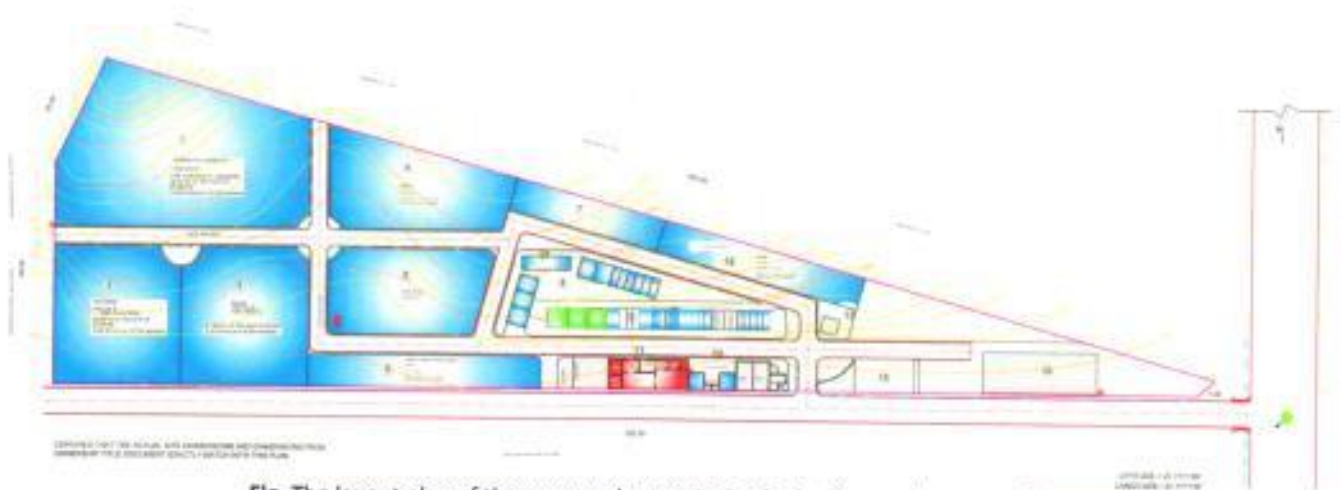
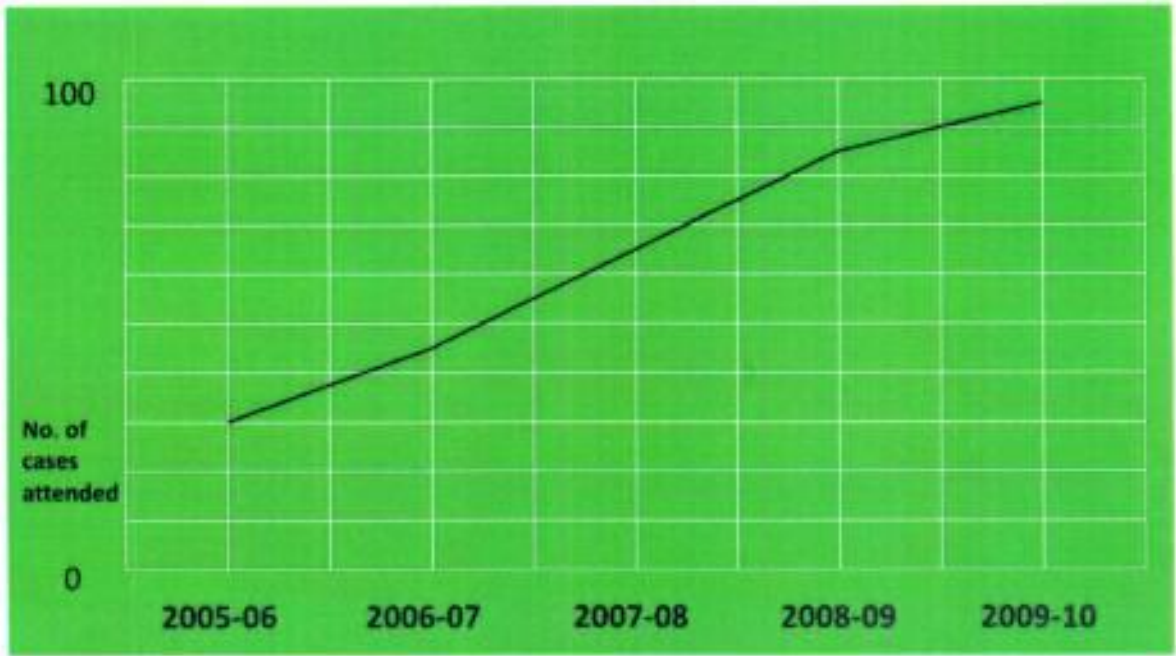


Fig. The layout plan of the proposed construction in the Karunashram new Campus area

### 1.7 The Ambulance service

With the increase in the animal human conflict in remote rural areas located near the forests, the number of cases left unattended due to unavailability of trained veterinary personnel and adequate medical facilities, it was of the utmost importance for the centre to start an ambulance service of its own.

The ambulance service was incorporated in the centre in 2005. The number of cases attended by the ambulance has increased tremendously since its beginning, which shows the awareness of the people for wildlife conservation. The ambulance has helped the centre to spread awareness for wildlife conservation in far flung rural areas. The number of cases attended by the ambulance service since its beginning is shown in the following graph.

Along with Ambulance Service, the basic first aid centers of PFA unit of Wardha are located at distant places in the district at taluka places. These centers have proved effective in the past to provide speedy first aid care to casualties and provide a temporary relief to them till the specialized veterinary care is made available to them.

## **2. Present arrangements and constraints**

### **2.1 Present Functionaries of Karunashram**

#### **a) Animal Section**

Every effort is made to address the wildlife displacement issue in-situ and it is only when the efforts to reunite the young with their parents fail or they need critical care and monitoring, that they are brought to the centre. Records of all the animals brought into the centre for rehabilitation are maintained in the following registers:

1. Animal entry register
2. Treatment register
3. Feeding register
4. Anesthesia records
5. Laboratory investigation register
6. Release Register
7. Carcass disposal register

#### **b) Store and Feed section**

Two animal kitchen rooms and one store room accounts for the store and feed section of the centre. As the number and type of animals visiting the centre is varied, it is better to be fore prepared and different kind of food is prepared for animals depending upon their age, physical and mental conditions. One store room at the centre is sufficient for storing food materials, and fodder for the animals. For feeding insectivorous birds insects are gathered and fed to them. For owls, vultures and other prey birds , chicken is fed to them. The refrigerator at the centre is used to store chicken for such animals.

#### **c) Construction and maintenance**

The maintenance of the centre can be classified into following main heads:

1. Periodic replacement of mesh as it gets rusted and damaged.
2. Periodic painting of mesh.
3. Replacement of barbed wire fence.
4. Maintenance of campus and buildings.

## 5. Contingencies

The campus is maintained by a dedicated pair of trained zoo keepers.

### d) Solid waste disposal

Solid wastes like faeces, dung and leftovers of food are manually removed and deposited in a pit prepared outside the campus. After completion of autopsy procedures, animal carcasses are either incinerated or buried. While small birds are incinerated, the large bodied carcasses are buried. Carcass disposal is carried out after duly intimating the forest department.

A separate drainage system that originates from holding areas, hospital, office and animal kitchen is shown here.

### e) Veterinary section

As the centre's goal is to provide a holistic treatment and care to the animals in need, the veterinary section of the centre is well equipped and self sufficient. It can be divided into two parts:

1. The examination and surgery room
2. The post operation care rooms

The centre has one full time veterinarian and one part time veterinarian attending to the casualty cases coming to the centre. The veterinarians are highly experienced and well trained.

The surgery room is well equipped with all the basic facilities which include the surgical table, surgical instruments, and refrigerator for storing the medicines. The post operation care sections consist of 2 rooms having 20 divisions each for isolation of animals and provide special care for them.

**f) Other activities peculiar to Karunashram**

**Awareness camps :** The authorities and the volunteers hold awareness camps throughout the district. The Khadi Gram Udyog, Wardha annually organizes "Wardhawardhan", a one week program for the promoting small scale industries and local NGOs. PFA, Wardha unit conducts various activities like lectures, display of pictures etc. for creating awareness among the people. The centre, in collaboration with the Social Forestry department of Maharashtra Government has formed Eco-clubs in schools and colleges of the district.

**Volunteer opportunities at Karunashram :** The students from the Veterinary College of Nagpur, Veterinary Interns, villagers and wildlife enthusiasts across the district, work as volunteers for the centre.

**Disaster Relief during summer :** The summer in central part of India is extreme. During this period, the water resources dry completely as the water level of the whole region drops drastically. The animals have to migrate long distances in search of water. They have to pass highways and human settlements to reach to a safe water source. Due to this, the number of road mishaps increase in this season. The number of animals admitted to the centre goes up during this period. As this is an expected phenomenon, the centre is always forearmed with proper facilities to encounter this problem.

Some of the other activities include:

1. Publication and distribution of pamphlets to the villagers to create awareness
2. Public meetings in selected/ targeted villages to create awareness.
3. Working with the Forest department to improve the condition of wildlife.
4. Stopping illegal trading of wild animals and birds

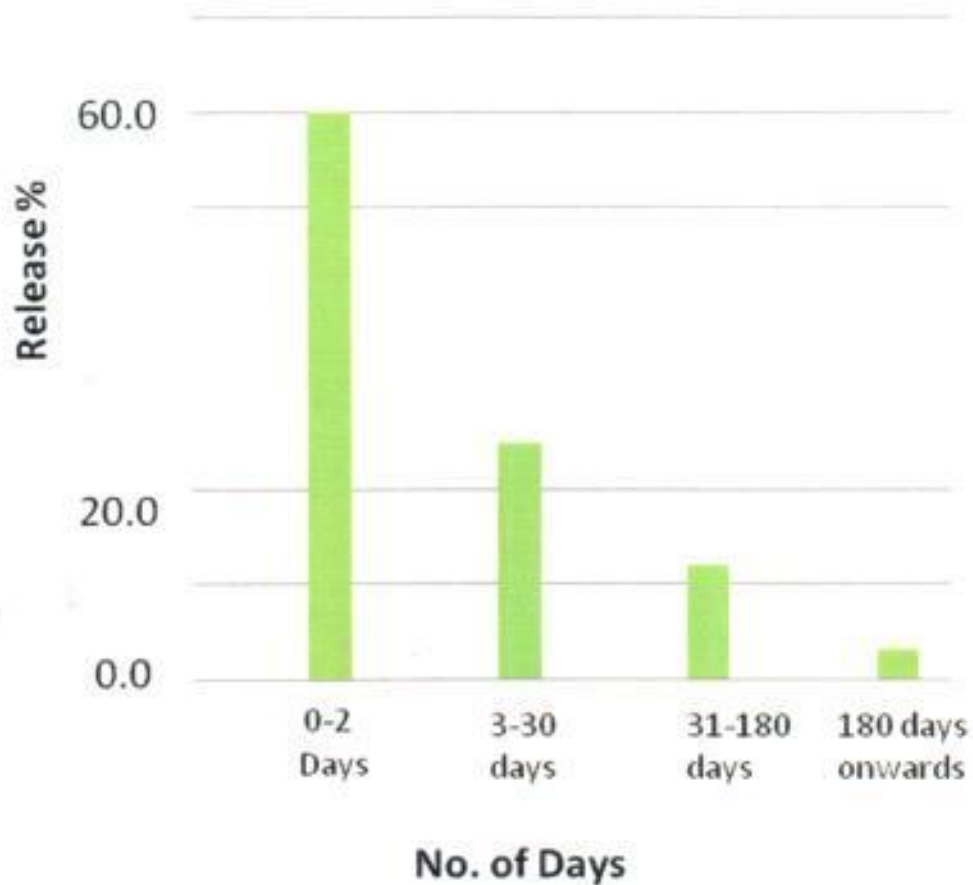
## 2.2 Collection Plan

The animals admitted to the centre are either brought by the forest department or by the centre authorities, informed by people who encounter any form of wildlife emergency.

The main objective of the centre is to provide the required healthcare needed to the animals in distress. There are three options for confiscated animals, depending on their total condition:

1. Release back to wild after required care
2. Captivity
3. Euthanasia

The situation is same for the rescued animals as well.

About sixty percent of rescued animals get released back to the wild within 2 days of arrival.

Since the centre is not a lifetime care facility, all animals requiring lifetime care, are transferred to the Maharajbag Zoo, Nagpur. In recent past crocodiles, peacocks, nilgai (*Boselaphus tragocamelus*) and deer have been transferred.

According to the Wildlife protection action(1972), Amendment of section 11(section 11 of the principal Act, it is mentioned that no captured animal shall be kept in captivity unless the chief Wild Life warden is satisfied that such animal cannot be rehabilitated in the wild and the reasons for the same are recorded in writing. True to the spirit of this wildlife law, no animal shall be resigned to captivity without making every effort to rehabilitate back to the wild.

**Part 2**  
**The FUTURE**



## 1. Mission, Aims and Objectives

The wildlife animal rehabilitation centre "KARUNASHRAM" is run by the Wardha unit of People for Animals. The mission of PFA is to act as a strong network of compassionate, committed and courageous people who will protect all animals against cruelty and work to bring about a change in attitudes, laws and lifestyles towards improving conditions for animals around India. The objectives of KARUNASHRAM are *"to conserve nature, rescue animals in distress and work for the cause of animal welfare with communities and governments"*. The goal of our Wild Rescue program is "to address the health and welfare need of the wild animals". This goal is realized through the following three aims:

1. To provide emergency relief to wildlife in distress and rehabilitate displaced wildlife
2. To provide veterinary expertise
3. To provide ethical and humane treatment to the wild animals in captivity.

The fundamental objectives of PFA are:

- To campaign for proper animal rights laws
- To rescue performing animals
- To close down animal markets
- To close down fur and leather trade
- To shut down crocodile and snake skin farms
- To protect endangered species
- To stop wildlife hunting
- To close down illegal private zoos

## 2. Action plan for future

### 2.1 Proposed changes in action plan, if any

As Karun ashram is not a centre for the display of various wild animals like a zoo, the centre does not go on collecting sprees. The Karunashram is not a lifetime care facility either, and for this reason only a few animals that fail to get rehabilitated to the wild, are held in captivity and only till such time that they are moved to lifetime care centre. PFA recognizes rehabilitation as "Treatment and temporary care of the injured orphaned and misplaced indigenous wildlife and the subsequent replacement of those cases back into the natural environment" and does not consider the keeping of wildlife for lifetime care, in rescue centers as rehabilitation.

Sometimes animals lose their rehabilitation potential for various reasons and they will have to be accommodated till they are moved to the Maharajbag Zoo, breeding centre or a lifetime care centre. As mentioned in part 1, the centre has no control over the species being brought into the centre, as the main goal is to address the health and welfare needs of all the animal species, particularly birds, mammals and reptiles. In keeping with the PFA's strict definition of wildlife rehabilitation, animals with no rehabilitation potential or species whose rehabilitation is not recommended will not be brought to the centre. However they may be temporarily admitted on welfare and humane grounds till the animal can be moved to suitable lifetime care facility. More than 80% of animals get released within 1 month of admission. In other words only 3-4% of animals become non-releasable and thus requires protracted care at Karunashram.

An analysis of the admission records of last 8 years of emergency relief and rehabilitation activities in Karunashram, Wardha, has revealed that the following are the species, most commonly brought in the centre:

1. Herbivores ( deer and nilgai)
2. Raptors (diurnal birds of prey and nocturnal owls)
3. Primates (langurs)
4. There have been in the past, incidences where other injured and sick animals like bears, wolves and leopards were reported to the authorities of the centre but due to

lack of infrastructure and other basic amenities, these animals were sent to the Maharajbagh zoo or the Bordharan sanctuary to look after.

Therefore, it is for only these groups of animals that Karunashram has plans to have enclosures according to meeting of CZA standards. All the other animals will be held in nurseries or stabilization holdings.

## **2.2 Layout Plan of Karunashram**

The plan of the project has been attached to the report. The present 2 hectares campus consists of 2 parts:

### **1. The Old Campus**

This area consists of the entrance to the project and is the area where human activity of the staff of the zoo is predominant. This area concerns mainly with the treatment and orientation of injured domestic animals like cows, buffaloes and dogs. It has following main constructions:

- Stables for Domestic cattle.
- Office building.
- A Clinic.
- 2 Post Care rooms.

### **2. The New campus**

This area is separated from the old campus by a gate so as to minimize the human activity and to separate efficiently the domestic and wild animals. At present we have the following amenities at this place:

- Enclosures for Herbivores.
- An Enclosure for small mammals like rabbits.

- A rest house for the veterinary doctor.
- A water tank and a store room.
- A major part of this campus is used as a cultivation land for crops which help for the self sustainability of the project. This is the area where the new construction has to be done.

### 2.3 Proposal Plans for the future:

1. **Gate:** A Gate will be built so as to completely exclude the old campus from the new campus.
2. **Rooms for Hospital:** At present only 1 hospital is catering the need of both the wild animals and domestic animals, we are planning to build specialized units exclusively for wild animals. This will include 4 separate rooms. They are as follows:
  - **I.C.U unit:** This unit will be built for the animals needing critical and protracted care. It will be well equipped with all necessary facilities.
  - **Operation Theatre:** One room will be used as an Operation theatre. It will be helpful for moving the wild animals kept in adjoining enclosures needed to be operated upon without delay. This will also reduce the difficulties in moving the injured animal away to the other hospital room at a distance.
  - **Store:** This room will be built to store freezers for the food of carnivores, and other materials which need special storage conditions.
  - **Clinic:** This room will be built for daily health checkups and medication of the animals under treatment.



3. **A bird nursery (Aviary):** An aviary is proposed for the accommodation of any non-releasable birds and to provide flight exercises to rescued fledglings rescued from nest fall. The location of proposed aviary is shown in the layout.
4. **A herpetarium:** A herpetarium is proposed to be constructed for nursing snakes and other similar reptiles. This area will consist of large concrete tanks, total 5 in numbers, for reptiles to be kept in.
5. **Enclosure for Jackals, Wolves and Wild Dogs:** A special enclosure for Jackals, Wolves and Wild dogs shall be built here. In the past a lots of cases of injures and sick Jackals and wolves have been reported to Karunashram, but could not be attended due to lack of enclosures.
6. **Leopard Enclosure:** The instances of Leopards visiting villages and towns adjoining to the north-west part of the district is rising every year. This leads to increase in animal and human conflict which ends up in the animal ending injured and stranded. Karunashram has failed to attend to these cases of immense importance due to lack of infrastructure, leaving the injured animals' life at stake. So there is an urgent need to build an enclosure exclusively for leopards.
7. **Thresher area:** this area will be reserved for the use of the thresher available at the centre to cut grass and fodder.
8. **Post Mortem Room:** A special Post Mortem room will be created for maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness of the adjoining area.
9. **Drain Area:** This area will be used for disposal of the all the waste which arises from the centre. Special provisions will be made to dispose organic and inorganic waste separately.
10. **Enclosure for Bears:** An enclosure for bears will be built.
11. **Volunteer Training hall:** As the number of volunteers visiting to Karunashram increases every year, it has become necessary for the authorities to build a permanent training hall for the volunteer so that they can receive proper guidance and training in the field of animal rehabilitation and conservation from experts.

12. **Animal Awareness vehicle cum Ambulance:** A new multipurpose vehicle which will work both as an animal awareness vehicle and an ambulance is proposed. This vehicle will be active in those areas where the number of animal- human conflicts is always on the rise.
13. **X-ray machine:** The centre is planning to buy a portable X-ray machine of its own to facilitate easy and speedy medical care to the animals.
14. **Solar Fencing:** A complete solar fence for the project is planned.
15. **Quarantine Word :** We will construct quarantine word for the new coming animals for checking and treatment.
16. **Isolation Word :** We will construct isolation Word for the Seek Animals for special care and treatment.
17. **Tranquilizing equipments :** We will use tranquilizing equipments for sedating animals.
18. **Drugs and squeeze cages :** For the general checkup and treatment of aggressive wild animals we will use squeeze cages.

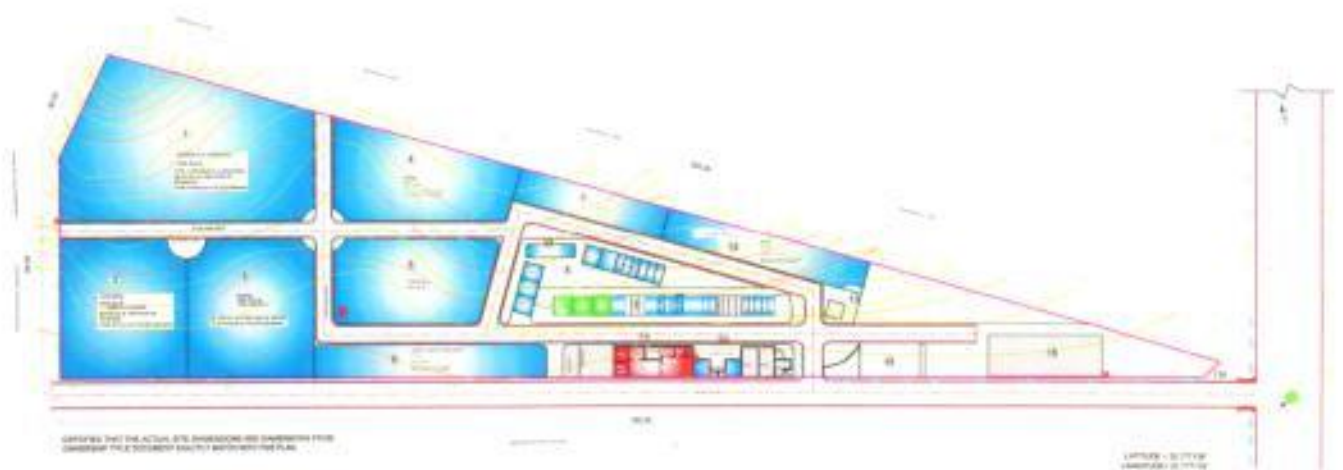


Fig. The layout plan of the proposed construction in the Karunashram new Campus area

## 2.4 Development in sub-centres

The four sub-centres of PFA, Wardha district mentioned in part-1 are in constant demand of animal healthcare facilities as the number of threatened taxa increases in its vicinity. An ambulance vehicle for each centre and a veterinary doctor at each centre are also proposed in the future.

- We contact to local Gram Panchayat and the local bodies are willing to give one acre land for the sub-center. We will construct sub centers on the same land.

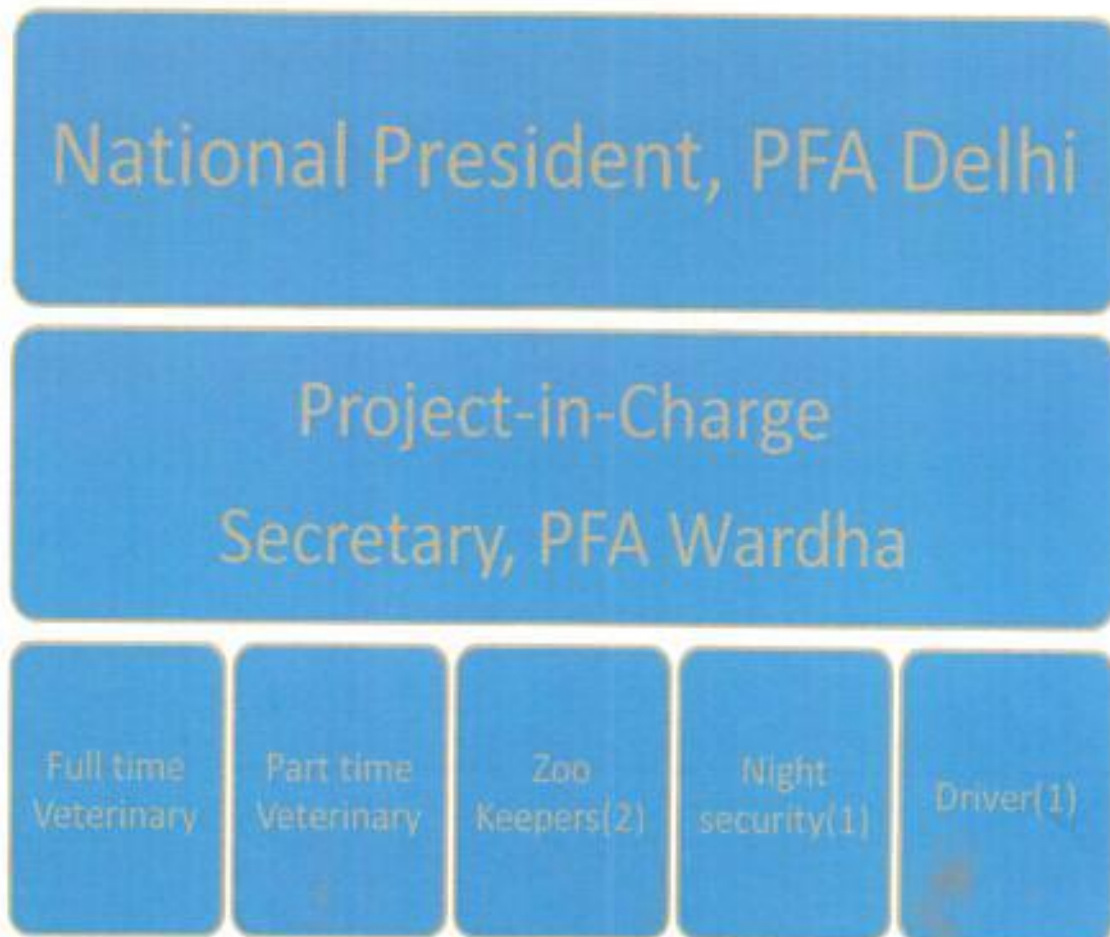


Fig: The staffing pattern of Karunashram

## 4. Disaster Management

Here at Karunashram, we try to keep the faculties well trained and updated. The resident veterinary doctor has been trained in Advanced Surgery at the National Institute of Delhi (Ministry of Environment and Forests). The zoo-keepers have attended the specialized training for zoo keepers held at Pune zoo. Besides these trainings, both vet and the staff working at Karunashram have been exposed to various workshops and study material on concerned subject matter.

### 4.1 Fire Control

Almost all the places including animal enclosures, main gate, etc shall be provided with fire extinguisher as well as sand buckets for safe guarding against accidents of fire.

### 4.2 Flood

PFA has a huge drainage pumping system for flood control. The whole pumping house having big electric and diesel pumping sets for pump out the extra water from the rescue centre premises.

### 4.3 Cyclone Situation

In case of the cyclone, the inherent resilience of rescue centre workers persistently and assiduously put their efforts to bring the rescue centre to normal condition, had succeeded to a greater extent. While in discussion with other official of State Disaster Mitigation Authority, we knew that Wardha is geographically situated at a place, which is not prone to all 3 major natural disasters namely cyclone, floods and earthquake. Although it was felt necessary to equip the staff for any eventuality and upgrade mechanized support and infrastructure inside the rescue centre to reduce the response time. The training on emergency preparedness, mitigation and development of a "crack team" has been and is an attempt to keep all of us at rescue center aware of impending danger and how to face it at the time of crisis.

#### 4.4 Law and order break down

Wildlife laws, regulation as per the guide lines of Central Zoo Authority are being followed and implemented in the Rescue center as per the wildlife protection act (1972) and later amendments. The rescue centre is also implementing the National Zoo Policy.

## 5. Contingency Plan for Future

### 5.1 Dealing with animal escapes

Like in any other wildlife rehab centre, the following logical outcomes for animals admitted to the centre:

- Release after treatment or Stabilization
- Death During care
- Euthanasia
- Transfer to another facility



- Escape
- Snake bite : We provide training to staff in case of snake bite or snake handling we have already trained staff for the snake handling and first aid box on snake bite

The last in the list is "Escape", the most undesirable outcome of any captive wildlife centre would like to encounter.

The animals that manage to escape could be brought under 2 categories:

1. Animals having spent considerable amount of time at the centre
2. Animals newly brought in and have not yet established themselves at the centre

The greater challenge lies in bringing back the animals belonging to the later category as they cannot be lured back into the cage. Animals that have spent a long period of time in captivity prefer to go back into the cage. Animals that have spent a long period of time in captivity prefer to go back to their enclosures, either after their day out or after being lured to return. They are familiar to their particular surrounding, they would prefer the familiarity of their enclosure to the fear and confusion that they encounter outside.

Since Karunashram is not a zoo where visitors frequent, crowd control or visitor control is not an issue at all. Though the protocol of dealing animal escape would depend on the species involved, the following are the broad guidelines for dealing animal escapes at the centre.

- **Seal all escape routes:** Karunashram is fenced by a brick wall compound on one side and by barbed wire on the other. The fence is capable of preventing the escapes of mammals of the size of deer.
- **Rectify the escape door:** If the animals had escaped through gaps of chainlink mesh or through the door which was kept open by mistake, these defaults and loopholes will be immediately attended to, in order to prevent further escapes.
- **Rescue team:** Form a rapid response team, headed by the centre veterinarian and ably assisted by the concerned zoo keeper, and other support staff.
- **Equipment for recapture:** The rescue team will be equipped baffle boards, drug delivery systems for chemical capture, nets, crates, flash light, fire arm and a vehicle.

- **Monitoring the animal:** No animals will be actively pursued as it would complicate matters due to fright response from the animal. Each animal's flight distance will be duly taken into consideration, especially when targeting the animal for chemical capture.
- **Safety of handling staff:** The staff may carry baffle boards with them while dealing with bears and big cats. At no time will the safety of handlers be comprised upon.
- **Safety of the animal:** The safety of the animal will also paramount while all the methods are being employed to recapture the animal. Only after calming down the otherwise excited animal will any effort be made to recapture it. The keepers are cautioned at all the times to avoid using overt physical method to capture or subdue the animal. If the animal is not creating any havoc, patience should be the norm.
- **Confinement:** Species like primates and deer will be confined or concerned to a particular place before they can be darted with a remote delivery system.
- **Updating the protocol:** Once the operation is over, a review of all the procedures followed would be made to learn from and negative of the operation.

## 5.2 Monkey or Dog Menace

There have been no cases of monkey menace till date at the Karunashram. As the dogs are omnipresent, the brick compound and the barbed wire fence is enough to take care of dogs.

## 5.3 Infighting between animal

In spite of taking all precautions, infighting between two inmates is a possibility. Infighting could be of two categories.

1. Between animals sharing the same enclosure
2. Between animals housed in adjoining enclosures.

In the case of the latter, preemptive measures would include ensuring the barrier between two adjoining enclosures. In the case of the latter, preemptive measures would include ensuring the barrier between two adjoining enclosures being foolproof. Where

there is one common chain link mesh between two enclosures, adequate care will be taken to see that mesh size does not permit the animals from pushing their paws through them.

When infighting is noticed within inmates housed in the same enclosure, immediate plan would be used to separate the individuals by

- Confining one to the holding area
- Moving one of the animals, often the injured one, to the confinement zone (in case of birds.)
- Distracting the animals if personnel are there to witness the event
- To prevent or reduce the chances of infighting among the inmates, animals will be mixed only after gradually acclimatizing them to each other.
- Only the individuals found to be compatible after this acclimatization would be housed together.

#### 5.4 Epidemics

No disease of epidemic proportions has been reported so far from the rehab centre. The following contingency measures would be in place during such unexpected disease outbreaks:

- Immediately isolate the affected animals and house them away from the rest
- Ensure disease control measures in place
- Ensure prompt diagnosis and treatment of affected individuals
- Should situation becomes serious, consider euthanasia of affected animals with prior permission of the Chief Wildlife Warden
- Ensure that the animals are immunized against these disease beforehand to avoid recurrence in future.

## 7. E-governance

Director's office, hospital and curator office have been equipped with latest computers. The inventory, the treatments and the birth and deaths records are kept in computers and shared by e mails and as soft copy. The interactive website for Wardha Rescue centre is under preparation and will be launched very soon. The senior Vet interacts with other experts via emails and interactive web sites for better management of zoo and wildlife. Round the clock monitoring of endangered and rare wildlife exhibits is monitored through the CCTV cameras and important behavioural incidence or aberrations are recorded for analysis and studies. The director, deputy director, Head keeper and security Incharge have been provided with wireless handsets for better monitoring and coordination. They are also equipped with mobiles.

For faster and effective communication and for facilitating instant transfer of information on various aspects of wildlife rescue and rehabilitation, both governance and database maintenance are done through electronic network.

### 7.1. Communication

All communications between Delhi headquarters and the CWRC staff in the field is



invariably through the electronic email network. The centre near Wardha has a dedicated internet access through which effective communication is established on a regular basis. Weekly, monthly and quarterly reports are sent through email. In fact this is the only quick and effective communication tool with staff working in remote areas of Assam. All staffs have been provided with a laptop of their own to enable them to maintain an electronic version of all communications, prepare

reports and maintain data in excel sheets. They meet periodically at Wardha and update the regional coordinator on the project developments by submitting reports, statement of accounts and photographs in electronic format. These reports are then sent to the headquarters by email and copies of the relevant ones to the Chief Wildlife Warden of the state and the Conservators and/or Project Leader.

## 7.2. Online rescue database

There is often lack of data on the number of animals handled, rehabilitated and released at rescue and rehab centres. This is also an impediment in measuring the success of rehabilitation. From rescue to release, recording the success at every stage is important. With veterinarians working in different parts of Maharashtra and maintaining their own records in their laptops, it would be a difficult proposition to access their data from any given place. Wildlife Trust of India has therefore developed online software where the rehabilitators can enter the details of every new case (like rescue, admission, species, examination and outcome) simultaneously. A snapshot of the main page of this online database has been shown below.

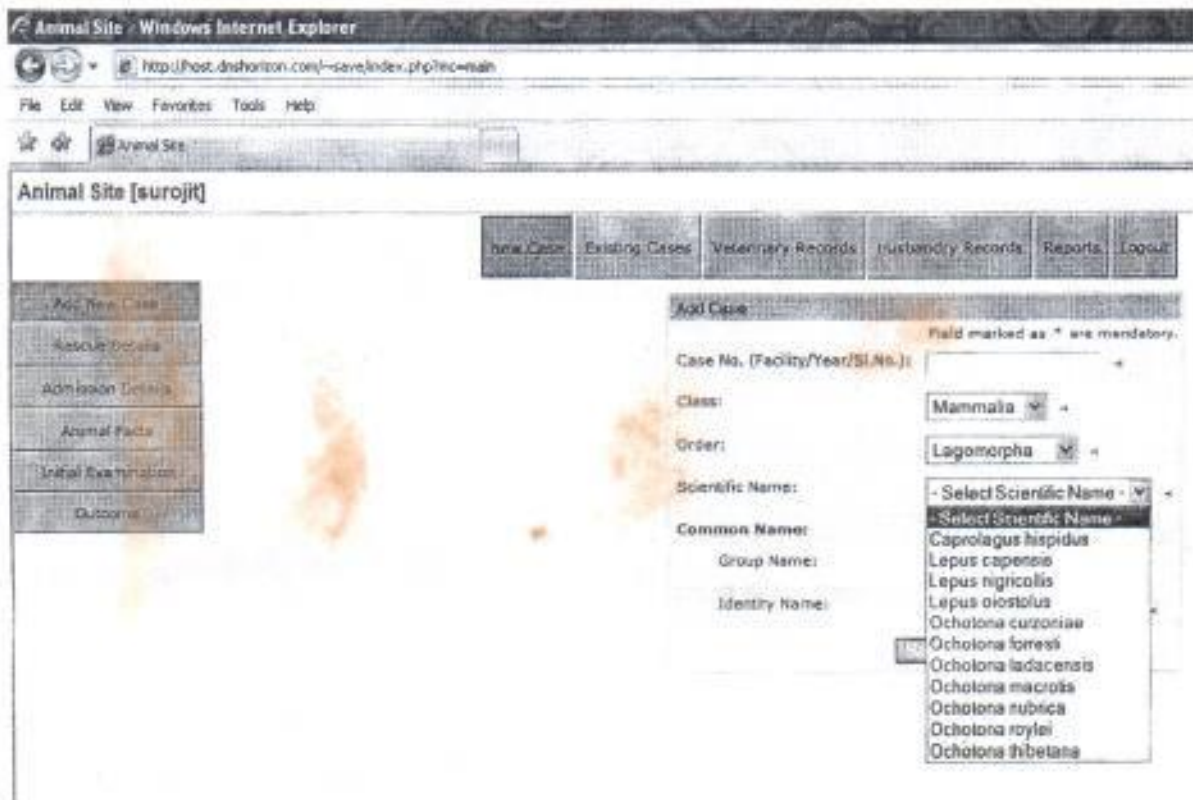


Fig: Snapshot of the first page of online rescue database software.

The online software has been programmed to generate reports, project-wise, species-wise, class-wise, and on the success of rehabilitation in terms of release percentage, mortality percentage etc. With the help of the online software, the WTI rescue staff working in different parts of the country can have access to information on what is happening in other satellite MVS stations and rescue centres.

## 8. Broad Budget analysis for implementing the plan

As mentioned in section 2 of Part 2, a few structures are being proposed to be built within the available area. Correspondingly, this would also involve budgetary increase in the project running expenses. The personnel planning for the future has been already discussed in section 3 of Part 2. In this section we deal with the broad budget required for the establishment and running of these proposed facilities and activities. The funding for these developments will be raised by the PFA with support of Central Zoo Authority.

### Construction and development

The following table (a & b) depicts the cost to be incurred for the developments planes during the next Thirteen years (2010-2023). Nearly Rs. 1,70,90,000 will be spent during this period for construction and about Rs. 16,19,0000 on equipping the rehab centre.

## 8.1 Day to day Maintenance

The creation of the above facilities would mean incurring additional expenses. This includes the cost of additional staff to be employed, the animal care and project running expenses. The first table (a) shows the cost of employing these additional staff.

### Additional staff cost:

The number of new employees to be recruited the next five years for Karunashram and its sub-centers is shown in the table below. This is apart from the present staff strength in these project areas which has been dealt already in the previous sections. About Rs.255,6,000 rupees is the project cost for the staff salaries alone.

# PART 3

## MANAGEMENT PLAN



## Management plan for period 2010 to 2023:

People for Animals, Wardha spends about 15 lakhs every year for meeting of the recurring costs of Karunashram. Funds will be generated for meeting the following tasks assigned for the period 2010-2023:

### 1) Establishment of new facilities

At present there are only enclosures for small and large herbivores at Karunashram. The plan is to build enclosures for jackals and wolves, bears and leopards as the number of casualties being reported in this region are increasing. Also it has been proposed to build enclosures for langurs and monkeys. Other enclosures being planned is the aviary for birds. These enclosures are necessary considering the space requirements for arboreal species like primates and free flying large birds and diurnal raptors. The scope for the construction of enclosures is very large as there is lots of free space available for construction. A herpetarium is also proposed. There are total 6 enclosures being planned for the period 2011-13.

As far as other infrastructure is concerned there is an immediate need to build a highly equipped hospital with all the medical facilities for quality treatment to the casualties.

All the other constructions are planned in the proposed new campus area.

### 2) Capacity building of staff

There are plans to send the zoo keepers for the training on various aspects of wildlife rehabilitation and medicine. The veterinary doctor of the center will be sent to workshops and conferences on advanced medicine. With X ray machines planned to be incorporated into the diagnostic support line up, there is also a need to train the staff on these aspects.

**3) Equipping Karunashram**

Since the establishment of Karunashram, an X-ray machine has become a necessity. An animal rehabilitation awareness vehicle which will serve both as an awareness vehicle in remote areas and as an ambulance is planned to be purchased in near future.

**4) New staff to meet demands**

One surgeon at Karunashram and 4 veterinary doctors at 4 sub centres will be needed in the future. Also new zoo keepers and guards will be needed. Thus in the coming five years, 5 veterinary doctors and 4 new sub staffs will be employed.

**5) Additional animal care and project running expenses:**

Additional new facilities and development of 4 sub centers will mean new sets of activities and new avenues for added recurring expenditures. The major increase in the project running cost would be at Shelter house, X-ray films and maintenance cost will account for a substantial proportion of the project expenditures for the next 5 years.

## ANNEXURE 3

### Flora and Fauna of Karunashram

The Karunashram project is located adjoining a small hill on the outskirts of the town Wardha. When it was purchased in 2003, the site was completely barren, a clear indication of anthropogenic pressures on the land from the neighbouring village Pimpri Meghe. Vegetation inside the campus has shown remarkable recovery ever since it was fenced. Considerable amount of planting was also undertaken in the subsequent years and all these efforts have resulted in a green environment.

#### (a) Flora of the campus

The vegetation of this area consists of Deciduous trees. There are very few trees found in the area surrounding the campus of Karunashram. They are namely *Azadiracta Indica*, *Magnifera Indica*, Babul, teak etc. Following is the list of trees planted in the campus area of karunashram:

The variety of teak planted are:

1. *Dhaora* (*Anogeissus latifolia*),
2. *Salai* (*Boswellia serrata*), *Tendu* (*Diospyros melanoxylon*)
3. *Ain* (*Terminalia tomentosa*).





This office comments on revision 455 / dtd. 26.07.2010 were forwarded to CZA and other members through an e-mail. The comments of this office on revision 455/ dtd. 07.06.11 are as below:

1. Comments on Master Layout Plan:

i On comments already sent

- a The comment at serial no. 1 has not been complied. Only contours have been indicated on the new plan annexed to the RMLP.
- b The CZA norms have not been followed for preparation of master plan under part-I and II as communicated earlier. No clarification has been given for management plan spanning upto 5 year though the period has been increased to 16 years (2010 to 2025) under the management plan.

ii Comment on RMLP 455/dt. 07.06.2011.

- a The colour code adopted for showing enclosures is invariance with the prescribed color code. All the enclosures have been shown in green colour indicating that the enclosures are proposed to be modified. However, as per the master plan, it is apparent that all enclosures are to be erected new by demolishing the existing enclosures.
- b Existing animal enclosures have not been shown in the RMLP.
- c The dimensions of the plot does not tally with the master layout plan submitted with RMP 455/dt. 26.07.2010.
- d Reference to history of revision has not been indicated in RMLP. The drawing plate also does not indicate the revision and its date.
- e Electrical, water supply and drainage lines have not been demarcated.
- f Area statement of each enclosure has been shown in the RMLP but it does not indicate enclosure's area and number of night shelter, and their area, required as per guideline.
- g Rescue centre does not need an amphi theatre. The provision needs to be reviewed.

iii Comment on RMP 455/dt. 07.06.2011.

- a Master plan needs to be developed on prescribed format circulated by CZA. Chapters on disaster management and e-governance are to be included.
- b Proposal at para 1.3 on page-28 may include provisions for quarantine ward, isolation ward, tranquilizing equipment, drugs and squeeze cages etc.
- c Availability of land for development of sub centers has not been mentioned in para 1.4 at page-31 as communicated earlier.
- d The contingencies plan for future (para 5 on page-34) does not include in case of snake bite to the handling staff etc. as communicated earlier.
- e As per record of last 3 years, there is no rescue of leopard, bear, jackal etc. The justifications for providing large enclosure for such animals be reviewed.
- f As per inventory of year 2010-11, 2 crocodiles have been indicated as opening balance. But closing stock of year 2009-10 it does not have any such animal at the rescue centre. The correctness of data sheets needs to be confirmed by the state body.



This office comments on revision 455 / dtd. 26.07.2010 were forwarded to CZA and other members through an e-mail. The comments of this office on revision 455/ dtd. 07.06.11 are as below:

1. Comments on Master Layout Plan:

i On comments already sent

- a The comment at serial no. 1 has not been complied. Only contours have been indicated on the new plan annexed to the RMLP.
- b The CZA norms have not been followed for preparation of master plan under part-I and II as communicated earlier. No clarification has been given for management plan spanning upto 5 year though the period has been increased to 16 years (2010 to 2025) under the management plan.

ii Comment on RMLP 455/dt. 07.06.2011.

- a The colour code adopted for showing enclosures is invariance with the prescribed color code. All the enclosures have been shown in green colour indicating that the enclosures are proposed to be modified. However, as per the master plan, it is apparent that all enclosures are to be erected new by demolishing the existing enclosures.
- b Existing animal enclosures have not been shown in the RMLP.
- c The dimensions of the plot does not tally with the master layout plan submitted with RMP 455/dt. 26.07.2010.
- d Reference to history of revision has not been indicated in RMLP. The drawing plate also does not indicate the revision and its date.
- e Electrical, water supply and drainage lines have not been demarcated.
- f Area statement of each enclosure has been shown in the RMLP but it does not indicate enclosure's area and number of night shelter, and their area, required as per guideline.
- g Rescue centre does not need an amphi theatre. The provision needs to be reviewed.

iii Comment on RMP 455/dt. 07.06.2011.

- a Master plan needs to be developed on prescribed format circulated by CZA. Chapters on disaster management and e-governance are to be included.
- b Proposal at para 1.3 on page-28 may include provisions for quarantine ward, isolation ward, tranquilizing equipment, drugs and squeeze cages etc.
- c Availability of land for development of sub centers has not been mentioned in para 1.4 at page-31 as communicated earlier.
- d The contingencies plan for future (para 5 on page-34) does not include in case of snake bite to the handling staff etc. as communicated earlier.
- e As per record of last 3 years, there is no rescue of leopard, bear, jackal etc. The justifications for providing large enclosure for such animals be reviewed.
- f As per inventory of year 2010-11, 2 crocodiles have been indicated as opening balance. But closing stock of year 2009-10 it does not have any such animal at the rescue centre. The correctness of data sheets needs to be confirmed by the state body.

1] DEFINITIONS :

"Association" means "People for Animals (PFA)," Gopuri, Wardha, District :

"President" means President of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Vice-President" means Vice-President of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Secretary" means Secretary of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Joint Secretary" means Joint Secretary of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Treasurer" means Treasurer of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Advisory Member" means an Advisory Member in the Executive Body of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Executive Committee Member" means the Member in the Executive Body of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha.

"Member" means the any category or type of member of Association i.e. People for Animals (PFA), Gopuri, Wardha, District : Wardha, who is also known as General Meeting/Body Member of the Association.

2] AREA OF OPERATION :

The whole State of Maharashtra.

3] Financial Year :

1<sup>st</sup> of April to 31<sup>st</sup> of March of the succeeding year.

4] Membership and its Registration :

Any Indian person above the age of 18 years who accepts the aims, objects rules and regulations of the Association, can obtain membership of the Association. For that purpose, such person shall have to formally apply to the Executive Committee of the Association. Upon grant of sanction/consent by the Executive Committee and after depositing the requisite Membership Fee with the Association, the name of such member shall be enrolled in the List of Members of the Association.



5) Types / Classification of Members :

There are two types of Members :--

a) Life Member : Any person who contributes Rs.101/- as Membership-Fee and who is a general member of the Association for two years, or any person to whom the Executive Committee proposes to appoint, shall be known as Life Member of the Association.

b) General Member : Any person who contributes Rs.25/- as Membership-Fee annually, shall be known as General Member of the Association.

6) Discontinuation of Membership :

The membership of any member shall be discontinued if such a member is convicted for an offence or, is a defaulter in payment of membership-fee or, is dead or, has left the nation and went abroad or, is addicted to vices or, is indulged in misbehavior or, is detected in causing harm to the Association, or for any specified reason if the Executive Committee pass a resolution by majority discontinuing the membership, the membership of such member shall be deemed to be discontinued.

7) Special General Meeting : Its Powers and Functions :

The Special General Meeting shall be the supreme and final decision making Meeting of the Association. This Meeting shall be held atleast once in a year. All Life Members can participate in this Meeting. The Special General Meeting has power to keep control over the working of the Executive Committee and, pass the annual accounts and budget for the next financial year and, amend the rules and regulations as required and, elect the Officers of the Executive Committee and, take resolutions on the subjects coming on the last moment and, appoint new Executive Body for 3 years and, call special meeting for filling up the vacant posts of Officers within 2 months and, if the Executive Committee invites any person, who may assist the Association, to attend Annual General Meeting of the Association, however, such member shall not have a right to vote.

8) Notice of General Meeting and Quorum:

It shall be mandatory to issue notice regarding the General Meeting to all the members of the Association. The notice shall contain date, time, venue and agenda of the meeting. The notice may be issued to all members by taking signature in the Dak Book of the Association or by Registered Post Ack. Due. The notice shall be sent prior to 15 days of the Meeting.

9) General Meeting : Its Powers and Functions :

The General Meeting, if required, shall be called upon the requisition of any General Members or Life Members of the Association. However, for this Meeting requisition of atleast 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the members shall be necessary. This Meeting shall be restricted only to the subjects incorporated in the agenda of the meeting. Notice of



such Meeting shall be issued 6 days prior to the day of Meeting. The notice may be issued through the Dak Book of the Association, Simple Post or by Registered Post. The quorum of meeting shall be 2/6.

10] Constitution of Executive Committee & Officers of the Association :

The Executive Committee of the Association shall contain 9 Officers as follows :-

1)	President	--	One

3)	Secretary	--	One
4)	Joint Secretary	--	One
5)	Treasurer	--	One
6)	Members	--	Two
7)	Advisory Members	--	Two

11] Tenure of Executive Committee and Mode of Election :

The tenure of the Executive Committee shall be for 3 years. The Executive Committee shall be elected after every 3 years by secret poll / by general majority in Special General Meeting.

12] Officers of the Executive Committee and their Duties :

- President** : To preside over and conduct the Meeting, to issue necessary orders in the interest of the Association, to control the affairs of the Association and its Branches, to issue notice for calling the meeting, to deliver or receive cash of the Association, etc.
- Vice-President** : To look after the affairs of the Association in absence of the President and to assist in proper management of the Association.
- Secretary** :
- 1) Call meeting of the Association
  - 2) Carry out and look after the postal correspondence of the Association.
  - 3) To set right the complaints.
  - 4) To keep control over the employees of the Association.
  - 5) To make miscellaneous Rules.
  - 6) To look after the necessary legal matters in the interest of the Association.
  - 7) To prepare Annual Statement of Accounts and submit them in the General Meeting of the Association.
  - 8) To maintain daily accounts of the Association and sign them.

- 9) To sanction the Bills of expenditure incurred,
- 10) To deliver or accept cash on behalf of the Association.
- 11) To preserve and look after the property of the Association.
- 12) To implement the resolutions passed by the Association.
- 13) To do any other work that may be necessary in the interest of the Association.

**Joint Secretary** : To look after the affairs of the Association in absence of the Secretary and to assist in proper management of the Association.

**Treasurer** : To control economical conditions of the Association, to write and maintain accounts, to submit the accounts so maintained before the Executive Committee, to prepare Annual Reports from the Account Books, to deliver or accept cash, to remove objections from the Account raised by the Auditor.

**Members of the Executive Committee** : To attend the Meetings of Executive Committee and General Meeting, to cast vote in Election, and to provide necessary assistance in the proper management of the Association.

**General Members** : To attend the General Meeting and to provide necessary assistance in the proper management of the Trust.

13] Executive Committee Meeting & Requisition Meeting :

The Executive Committee Meeting shall be conducted atleast 3 times in a year. If the Life Members of the Association demands for a Requisition Meeting, the President or the Secretary shall within 15 days from such demand, call the Requisition Meeting. While calling such Meeting, it shall be mandatory to mention items of requisition in the agenda of notice of the meeting. The Requisition Meeting shall have all powers vested in Executive Committee.

14] Notice of Executive Committee Meeting and Quorum :

The notice of the Executive Committee Meeting shall be issued two days prior to the day of Meeting. The notice shall contain date, time, venue and items in the agenda of the meeting. The notice may be issued by taking signature in the Dak Book

of the Association or by Post. The Quorum shall be completed on presence of 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of the members of Executive Committee.

15] Procedure for Election of Executive Committee :

The procedure for election of Executive Committee shall be laid down by the Special General Meeting. Any Life Members against whom any sum or amount of the Association is outstanding, shall be disqualified from contesting the Election or casting vote in the Election.

16] Procedure for Filling of Vacant Post(s) in the Executive Committee :

If, by any reason or the other, any post(s) of the Executive Committee is rendered vacant, the remaining members of the Executive Committee by majority, may fill-up the vacant post(s).

17] Powers & Functions of the Executive Committee :

The Executive Committee shall control all affairs of the Association. It will implement the resolutions passed by the General Meeting. The Executive Committee may frame miscellaneous Rules for smooth running and proper management of the Association. If necessary, the Executive Committee may also alter such Rules. The Executive Committee may appoint a Sub-Committee for any particular work and can take accounts and other information from time to time from such Sub-Committee, and upon completion of such work, the Executive Committee may dissolve the Sub-Committee. The Executive Committee may grant or repudiate (take away) permission to the Offices of the Association. The Executive Committee shall look after all legal aspects of the Association. 

Farmers Education about crop protection because all are well known about the problem of farmers. They have no other resources only depend on crop but always they didn't get justice no be benifit from farm finally going to susite, all these issues are directly & indirectly related to Animals. No rain no fodder & finally lack of Animals fodder but they can not fight for them selves.

Wardha District is the heart of India and well known about Mahatma Gandhi & Pawanar is famous in memory of Acharya Vinoba Bhave, Gandhi & Vinoba always gives message for Animal Welfare.

So people for Animals, Wardha unit working for Animal Welfare activities under guidance of Hon'ble Smt. Maneka Gandhi, National Chairperson of People for Animals.

#### **OUR WORK ON :**

- a) Anti Rabies Vaccination Camps street dog.
- b) Deworming Camps for Animals.
- c) First Aid Camps for Stray Animals.
- d) Rescue Programme.
- e) Environment Protection Training.
- f) Wormi Compost Training for Field Worker.
- g) Organic farming training for farmers.
- h) Regular Birth Control Street Dogs in Municipal Council, Wardha area.
- i) Wild life, awareness companing protection.

#### **STREET DOG BIRTH CONTROL PROGRAMME :**

People for Animals, Wardha unit start the Birth Control Programme for Street Dogs in the year 2009-10 that time we got help from Rotary Club, Wardha and its our starting to aware people about Birth Control is most important for dog population control.

In the year 2009-10 Animal Welfare Board of India, Chennai give us fund & its most important for to change the total work still of people for Animals Wardha without these support we are unable to run this huge activity. Now we have well facility to run the regular birth control activity. Street dog population is day by day increase but from last three years we are successful to control the population of street dogs. We collaborate with Municipal Council, Wardha and so municipal authority support to dog catching then after we operat the dog (male and female) and release in same area.

#### **ANTI RABIES VACCINATION CAMPS :**

First we start rabies vaccination programme in Civil Hospital, Wardha & Achrya Vinoba Bhave Hospital, Sawangi (Meghe), Wardha. Because after dog bite post operative care for human is more costly than free care i.e. antirabies vaccination to dog.

In the hospital most problem is many population of street dog in the premises of hospital for food & garbage, same time chances of dog bite so we regularly conduct anti rabies vaccination camp at Hospital area & marked the vaccinated dog.

#### **MONKEY RESCUE FROM RIVER :**

18<sup>th</sup> July, 2009 is memorious day for PFA, Wardha unit. That time heavy rainy season in Maharashtra. On 17<sup>th</sup> late night we receive a phone call from Samudrapur Tahasildar & he give information about 40 monkey on tree at "LAL NALA" DAM.

Because of heavy rain monkeys are unable to move toward Bank of river from dam. PFA Wardha team reached early morning on 18<sup>th</sup> July and start mission monkey resque after 5 to 6 hour we got success. To save the life of 40 monkey safely.

#### **DEWORMING CAMPS FOR ANIMALS AT VILLAGES :**

Animal Help awareness campaign is main aim of people for animals, Wardha unit. We always conduct first aid camps. Deworming camp. Antirabies vaccination camps at different village area with the co-ordination of local Sarpanch & Veterinary Dept. of Wardha district. In same activity we conduct a Deworming

Camp on 16th Nov. 2009 at Jamtha. Deworming is important for to maintain health of animals. We provide facility for Small animal & Big animals.

**FIRST AID CAMP AT MAHAKAL :**

In series of camps we provide regular facility to our adopted village Mahakal. We adopt four village for all medical treatment to the animals, farmers education for wormi culture, organic farming education to BPL (Below Powarty Line Farmers) who have only one or two acre land. We also provide free First aid camp for those animals for same we organised a First aid camp at Mahakal on 15th July 2009 with the operation of Veterinary Polyclinic, Wardha.

**KARUNASHRAM ACTIVITY :**

We run a animal shelter house & as well as wild animal rescue centre at Pipri (Meghe), Tah. & Dist. Wardha we have 2 hector area with man proof forcing, hospital facility including indoor & outdoor patient facility as well as we have small animal shed, big animal shed, Isolation shed, animal Ambulance, operation theatre.

Here, we run a unique activity regularly i.e. street dog Birth Control Programme from last three years and for these activity Animal Welfare Board of India provides funds for same. Municipal Council provides Street Dogs in Municipal Council area.

Daily 20 to 40 outdoor animals treatment run by the People For Animals Hospital.

Rotary Club, Wardha also help for the street dot Birth Control activity in Wardha city.

**ANIMAL SURGERY CAMP AT BHIDI :**

Wardha District eight Tahsils. Arvi, Ashti & Karanja these three tahasil are boarder Tahsil of Wardha District and mostly tribal villages'are covered in these three Tahsil, Bhidi is very interior village where there is no hospital no regular doctors visit for the treatment of Animals, so People For Animals, Wardha originised a big camp for Animal Heath Check-up & if in need of surgery; surgery will be there. In this camp total no. of animals 273 treated (small & big animals) 27 surgery are taken.

**ONE DAY WORKSHOP FOR WORMI COMPOST :**

Chemicals & Pesticide are so harmful for Environmental Balance. For Environmental Protection and nature awareness People for Animals Wardha unit organised one day workshop for worm compost preparation & wormi culture production unit. Wormi compost is the best solution of Pesticide and mass craft production. Wormi culture is also the alternative source of income to the farmers. Farm the use of cow dank one Kg. cow dank produce 5 kg. wormi compost, as well as multiplication of Wormi culture.

It is the best income generation work for farmers so we provide the wormi culture training at our shelter house i.e. Karunashram Natural Resource Training Centre.

**ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON ORGANIC FARMING :**

## Annual Report 2011-2012

### ANIMAL SHELTER HOME :

People for Animals, Wardha unit runs various activities for Animal welfare. We run Animal Shelter House for Domestic Animals like cow, bull, buffelaw, donkey, cat, dogs etc. We have all facilities for their treatment and care. We have operation theatre, Isolation shed, cow, shed. Small animal shed, large Animal shed facilities for all treatment and care. People for Animals, Wardha, centre is recognised by Animal Welfare Board of India, Chennai. Every year we received regular grant from AWBI.

### ANIMAL RESCUE CENTRE FOR WILD ANIMALS :

Wardha District is well known as Gandhi District because very famous Sevagram Ashram is at Sewagram we believe great message of Mahatma Gandhi that is "Ahinsa". Our Neighbour district is Yavatmal, Chandrapur, Nagpur and Amravati district, This four district are covered by forest areas as well as Wardha district is also covered with good forest. Many times we face cases like man versus wild like road accident and poaching that time, for rescue purpose and also for treatment and postcare we provide medical facility and animal Ambulance facility for wild animals like monkey, langour, bear, deer, and other herbivorous and carnivorous animal. People for Animals, Wardha centre is also approved as a recognised rescue centre from Central Zoo Authority Ministry of Environmental and Forest Govt. of India.

### ANIMAL AMBULANCE FACILITIES :

For the Human treatment and care many facilities are available but for Animal treatment not enough. People for Animal try to provide all facilities for small and large animal we provide Animal Ambulance Service for sick and injured animals which need treatment and care on road or transport for same. We provide 24 hour Animal Ambulance facilities for them our Ambulance is with hydraulic small chain pulley block which put animals without harm. We provide the Ambulance facilities in all Wardha city and try to provide Wardha district but one vehicle is not enough for us. Now we are in

need of tractor as a animal ambulance, so that we also provide our facility in remote area.

#### **STRAY DOG BIRTH CONTROL :**

Dog population problem is the very main problem in city area as well as rural area and due to this many dogs are died due to road accident and health problem. People for Animals, Wardha run the very good activity from the year 2004-05 we get help from Animal Welfare Board of India for the street dog birth control we sign agreement with Wardha Municipal Council and also nabour Gram Panchayat. Every year we operate 600 to 900 dogs including male and female provide them post care facility and release in same area. Due to this only dog population in Wardha city and near by area is under control we have expert doctor team and para vet for the operation. Surgery and Post care. For dog catching trained dog catcher who are trained under guidance of Expert team.

#### **FIRST AID CAMPS FOR ANIMAL :**

From the year 1999 People for Animals, Wardha starts the work for Animal Welfare activities under the guidance of Honourable Smt. Manekaji Gandhi. We regularly organised first aid camps for Animal treatment we have mobile Animal Hospital Camp Ambulance with expert doctor team we also get help from Veterinary Poly-Clinic, Wardha for Animal Treatment Camp. During the year 2011-2012 we organised total mobile camps for Animal treatment in villages of Wardha District in this camp we treat cow, bull, donkey, sheap, goat, cat etc. we treat total No. of animal 2383 during the animal treatment camps. Our camp places is mostly remote villages where regular treatment and medical check-up is not possible.

#### **ANTI RABIES VACCINATION CAMPS FOR DOGS :**

Every year we adopt particulars area of the city or village for treatment and general checkup of animals of regular follow-up and care. Mainly in city areas Dog bite cases is very common. And due to this reason people offered from dogs hit the dogs etc. so prevention is better than cure we aware people about Rabies and Stray dog population. Create awareness about rabies and also conduct antirabies vaccination

camps for stray dogs. Municipal Council, Wardha is always with us for dog catching and we provide antirabies vaccination to the Stray dogs during the camps.

#### **Eco CLUBS ACTIVITY IN SCHOOLS :**

People for Animals, Wardha started Eco clubs in Wardha city schools from the year 2005. We have total 78 eco clubs in schools of Wardha City with the eco club we create awareness about animal welfare activities like first aid about animal general care of stray animals. Importance of animals in nature etc. our Eco club member school student is good strength for us.

#### **BRD FOOD AND NEST AWARENESS CAMPAIGN :**

Due to Air pollution, Sound pollution, Water pollution and continuous forest cutting, encroachment birds population is less and going to decrease day by day. Birds are suffering for life. So for the survival of birds. People For Animals, Wardha trying to provide bird food and readymade nest put in house areas, We organised regular campaign. Save Birds Save Forest, we organised exhibition of species of birds their local habit, resting place food, living mating period with this knowledge many people put bird fodder at their home and save the birds.

#### **MOBILE HOSPITAL FACILITY :**

For human being many hospital facilities are available but for the animals very few. People For Animal, Wardha. Provide mobile Animal hospital facility for small animal as well as large animal.

Animal Ambulance purchased funds provided Animal Welfare Board of India Ministry of Environment and forest Govt. of India. We provide Twenty four hour facility for Animal care and treatment. We have Expert surgeon.

#### **BAN ON BULLOCK CART RACES :**

People for Animals, Wardha always protest against Animal cruelty. Bullock cart races is ban in all over India by the order of Ministry of Environment and Forest,

Govt. of India Gazet notification published regarding the sum in the year 2011. But still many places bullock card races organised. In Wardha District same event was organised on 28 Feb. 2012. P.F.A. Wardha booked offence on the 18 organisor of Bulock card race compation. Also Asst. Secretary, Animal Welfare Board of India issued the instruction to all concern higher authority to ban the races.

**COURT CASES REGISTER AGAINST ANIMAL CRUELTY :**

Transportation of cow and bulls in one Truch, slater at Bulls and cow is ban in Maharashtra State during the year 2011-12 we book total 05 cases against animal cruelty and took possession of 57 cattle to People for Animals, Wardha.

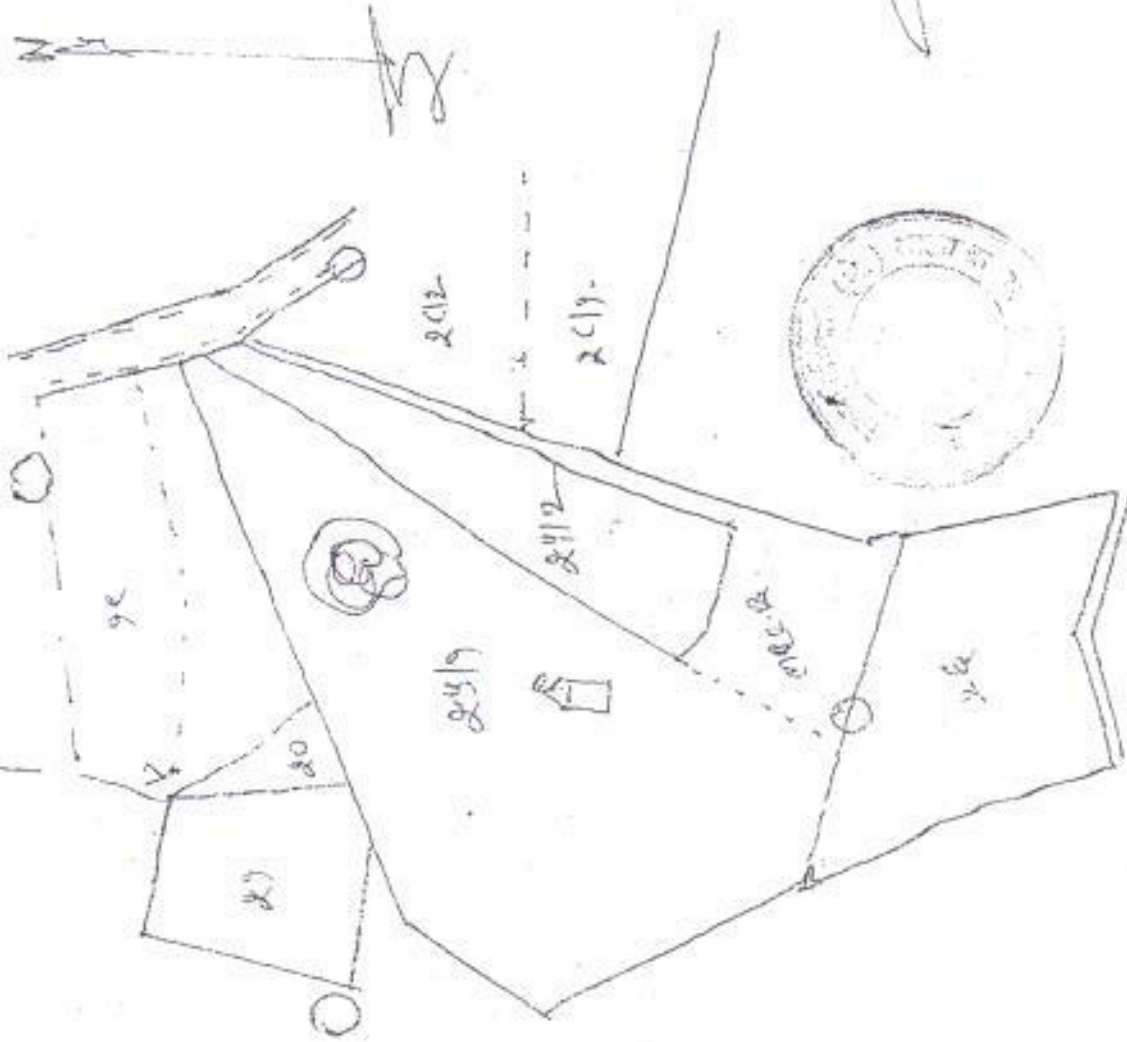



Period of validity of approvals issued under Section 10 (23C) (iv), (v), (vi) or (via) and Section 80G (5) of the IT Act-clarification reg  
Notice Date :27 October 2010

**Period of validity of approvals issued under Section 10 (23C) (iv), (v), (vi) or (via) and Section 80G (5) of the IT Act-clarification reg.**

**CIRCULAR NO 7/2010**

**Dated: October 27, 2010**

**Subject;-** Period of validity of approvals issued under Section 10 (23C) (iv), (v), (vi) or (via) and Section 80G (5) of the IT Act-clarification reg.

The Board has received various references from the field formations as well as members of public about the period of validity of approvals granted by the Chief Commissioners of Income Tax or Directors General of Income Tax under sub-clauses (iv), (v), (vi) and (via) of Section 10(23C) and by the Commissioners of Income Tax or Directors of Income Tax under Section 80G (5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

2. It has also been noticed by the Board that different field authorities are interpreting the provisions relating to the period of validity of the above approvals in a different manner. The following instructions are accordingly issued for the removal of doubts about the period of validity of various approvals referred to above.

3. Sub-Clause (iv) and (v) of Section 10 (23C) were amended by Taxation Laws (Amendment) Act, 2006 by insertion of the following proviso to that clause:-

“Provided also that any (notification issued by the Central Government under sub-clause (iv) or sub-clause (v), before the date on which the Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2006 receives the assent of the President”, shall at any one time, have effect for such assessment year or years, not exceeding three assessment years) (including an assessment year or years commencing before the date on which such notification is issued) as may be specified in the notification.)”

The intention behind the insertion of the above proviso was laid out in the relevant portion of the explanatory notes to the Taxation Laws Amendment Act, 2006 which reads as under:

“A need has been felt to dispense with the requirement of periodic renewal of notifications. The requirement of periodic renewal of notifications has been resulting in delays in their renewal.

5.2 In order to overcome delays, the eighth proviso to section 10(23C) has been amended so as to provide that the above mentioned limit of effectivity for three assessment years shall be applicable in respect of notifications issued by the Central Government under sub-clause (iv) or sub-clause (v) before the date on which Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2006 receives the assent of the President.

5.3 The Taxation Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2006 received the assent of the President on 13.07.2006. Therefore, on account of the above amendment any notification issued by the Central Government under the said subclause (iv) or sub-clause (v), on or after 13.07.2006 will be valid until withdrawn and there will be no requirement on the part of the assessee to seek renewal of the same after three years.

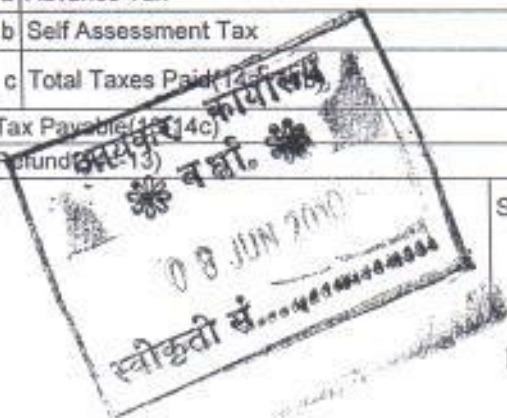

The evaluation of the People for Animals – Shelter House at Pipri Taluk, District Wardha was carried out on 15.01.2011 by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation & Monitoring Officer, CZA. The evaluation report of the Animals – Shelter House at Pipri Taluk, District Wardha as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 57<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> March, 2011.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of recognition to Animals – Shelter House at Pipri Taluk, District Wardha as a Rescue Centre under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2013 subject to the mid-term evaluation of the zoo and compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009:-

Grant of recognition to People for Animals – Shelter House at Pipri Taluk, District Wardha as "a Rescue Centre" beyond 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2013 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the People for Animals – Shelter House at Pipri Taluk, District Wardha shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
