4. The zoo was evaluated on 17.4.2007 by Shri A. V. Joseph, Addl. PCCF (WL), Government of Andhra Pradesh and Dr. Navin Kumar, Deputy Director (Retd.), Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad. The evaluation report was placed before the Technical committee Meeting held on 16.7.2007.

On the recommendations of the Committee, it has been decided to grant renewal of recognition to the Chennai Snake Park Trust, Chennai <u>as a medium</u> <u>category zoo</u> for a period up to <u>31.08.2010</u> subject to following conditions:-
