**Subject: Renewal of recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, Arunachal Pradesh, under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 – regarding**

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, Arunachal Pradesh under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was suspended till 2<sup>nd</sup> January, 2020. Shri R.N. Mehrotra, IFS (Retired) and Dr. C.N. Bhuvra, evaluating officer/s deputed by this office have evaluated the zoo on 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Mini Zoo, Roing was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> July, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, observed that action taken by management of the zoo on grounds cited for suspension of recognition is not satisfactory and recommended to serve notice to the zoo under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. Also, to ensure that the zoo does not continue to operate without recognition, it was recommended to the Central Zoo Authority to grant recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, for a period of one year, subject to compliance with conditions therein and mid-term evaluation.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated 25<sup>th</sup> August, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> December, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee. Also, the notice under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is being issued separately.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has renewed recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, as a Mini Zoo for a period up to **19<sup>th</sup> August, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

5. A compliance report to the Central Zoo Authority on implementation of the aforesaid conditions shall be submitted by the zoo within three months of issue of this letter followed by half-yearly report.


6. The renewal of recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing for period beyond 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2021 as a Mini Zoo would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

7. The recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with approval of the competent authority.

Sub: Suspension of recognition to the Mini Zoo Roing, Arunachal Pradesh under Section 38 H (6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

Ref: This office letter F. No. 19-96/93-CZA (29) (Vol.I) NS/3027/2018, dated 01.05.2018 addressed to Chief Wildlife Warden, Government of Arunachal Pradesh

1. Whereas the recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, Arunachal Pradesh under Section 38 H(1) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 was valid upto 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2016 subject to compliance with conditions specified under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.
2. And whereas the District Forest Officer, Mehao Wildlife Sanctuary Division, Roing has applied vide letter No. MWS/D-05/2013/1117-18 dated 23.02.2016 for renewal of recognition of the Mini Zoo Roing, Arunachal Pradesh for the period beyond 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2016 as per provisions of the Section 38 H (6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 under Rule 8 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009.
3. And whereas the show cause Notice was issued on 01.05.2018 to the Mini Zoo Roing for repeated violation under the Provisions of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and was asked to inform why recognition of the Mini Zoo, Roing, Arunachal Pradesh be not suspended/cancelled.
4. And whereas the representative of Mini Zoo, Roing was directed to appear before the CZA on 23.05.2018. They did not appear on 23.05.2018 and further they were given chance of opportunity for hearing on 07.06.2018. That Shri Bibom Kamdak, Range Forest Officer, in-charge Mini Zoo Mehao Wild Life Range was present to attend the hearing held under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority on 07.06.2018. Also the Technical Committee of the CZA, authorised the member secretary, CZA to take cognizance under Section 55 (aa) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and thereby the proceedings of the hearing was prepared in the CZA which is given in the tabular form as below:

6 After detailed deliberation, the Committee recommended to CZA for suspension of recognition of the Mini Zoo Roing as per provisions of Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 till the Zoo report compliance of the conditions and improvements in the operation and management of the zoo.

7. And whereas the CZA in its 32<sup>nd</sup> Meeting held on 19th November, 2018 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister MEFC adopted all the recommendation of its Technical Committee in its 86<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> September, 2018.

8. Keeping in view of the above, the recognition of the Mini Zoo Roing as a "Mini Category Zoo" is hereby suspended for one Year to bring about improvement in their management. The Operator of the Mini Zoo, Roing is directed to intimate the CZA about the compliance of standard and norms prescribed in this regard. After receipt of intimation, the Member Secretary, CZA shall depute evaluator/s who shall verify the ground situation and submit a Report to the CZA for a decision about renewal of recognition of the concerned zoo. It is hoped that the Mini Zoo, Roing shall work tirelessly for bringing about necessary improvement to continue to function.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition to Mini Zoo at Roing as Mini Category Zoo beyond 30.09.2010 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

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The recognition to the Mini Zoo at Roing as Mini Category Zoo shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
