Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till March 21, 2019. Application vide letter No.498/28-6/JMZP dated January 19, 2021 received in this office from the DFO-Jhargram Division and Ex-Officio Director, Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram, for renewal of recognition. Shri Rupak De, IFS (Retired) and Dr. A.B. Shrivastava, evaluating officers deputed by this office have evaluated the zoo on March 16 and 17, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96th Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37th Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after March 21, 2019 and renewed recognition of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram as a Medium Zoo for a period up to **August 19, 2022** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

6. The renewal of recognition of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram for period beyond August 19, 2022 as a Medium Zoo would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

7. The recognition of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram was carried out by Shri Bipul Chakrabarty, Director, Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur on 27th February, 2017. The evaluation report of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram, as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 82nd Meeting held on 22nd March, 2017. Copy of evaluation report is enclosed with this letter for your perusal.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of two years. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately. The renewal of recognition of the Junglemahal Zoological Park, Jhargram as a "Small category zoo" under provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 21st March, 2019 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the Zoo:

Grant of recognition to Jhargram Deer Park, Jhargram beyond 31.08.2010 as "a Small Category Zoo" would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the Jhargram Deer Park, Jhargram shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
