Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, this is to inform that the application for the recognition of Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and Kashmir as received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri P.C. Tyagi, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and Kashmir vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on June 26, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the recognition of Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and Kashmir for a period of two years and, subject to compliance with observation/ recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has granted the recognition of Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and Kashmir for a period up to December 29, 2024 under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

Further, half yearly report regarding progress made in the implementation of the aforesaid conditions should also be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and Kashmir for the period beyond December 29, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Manda Mini Zoo/ Rescue Centre Manda, Jammu and

Kashmir shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
