Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Sh. Dev Prakash Bankhwal, IFS (Retd.), Ex-PCCF(CWLW), Assam was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on April 1st, 2022 by Sh. Dev Prakash Bankhwal, IFS (Retd.).

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 105th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority

held on May 11th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 105th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh for a period up to July 27, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, West Bank, Pakke Tiger Reserve, Arunachal Pradesh under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was suspended till January 30, 2020. Shri R. N. Mehrotra, IFS (Retired) and Dr. C.N. Bhuva, evaluating officer/s deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on February 11, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96th Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37th Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has renewed recognition of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation, Seijosa, as a Rescue Centre for a period up to **August 19, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.



Sir,

Please refer to your letter CWL/D/16/2001/2619 dated 17th November, 2004 seeking recognition of Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa, Arunachal Pradesh as a 'zoo' under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act.

The evaluation of the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa was carried out on 13.12.2004 by Shri Brij Kishor Gupta, Scientist in the Central Zoo Authority. The evaluation report was placed before the Technical Committee Meeting held on 19.7.2005 and the Committee has approved granting recognition to the Centre for Bear Rehabilitation and Conservation (CBRC), Seijosa as a 'zoo', subject to fulfillment of the following conditions within a time period upto 31.8.2009:-

Other Recommendations:-

- A. Reintroduction programme of Schedule I species shall be carried out after taking prior approval of the Government of India under Section 12 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act.
- B. Reintroduction programme of animals should be carried out as per the IUCN guidelines on "Reintroduction".

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition beyond 31.8.2009 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.
