Sir/ Madam,

With reference to above, this is to inform that the recognition of Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Pawan Kumar, IFS(Retd.), Former PCCF(HoFF), Uttar Pradesh was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on May 3rd, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 105th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on May 11th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/

recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 105th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) for a period up to January 24, 2025 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Rescue Centre) shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, it is to inform that the evaluation of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Soor Sarovar Bird Sanctuary, Agra, Uttar Pradesh was carried out by the undersigned along with the EMA, CZA on 22nd, 24th and 25th December, 2016. The evaluation report of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra as submitted by the evaluating officer and Report of the Inspection carried out on 22.06.2017 by the team constituted by the Technical Committee in its 83rd Meeting along with pointwise remarks of this office were considered by the Technical Committee of the CZA in its 85th Meeting held on 23rd March, 2018.

The Technical Committee of the CZA, after due deliberation, observed that the Committee constituted by it has found that the observations of the evaluation team were factually correct. Further, the Committee has observed that written compliance is awaited from the Operator of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra on conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority as specified in the notice dated 31.03.2017. Also, the Committee decided that the Member Secretary, CZA may grant an opportunity of hearing to the Chief Wildlife Warden of the State and the Wildlife SOS under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for time bound commitment for compliance with the conditions. Accordingly, notice on opportunity of hearing is being issued separately.

Also, the Technical Committee recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for renewal of recognition of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra for a period of one year subject to compliance with the conditions mentioned therein and to regularise the period after 31st January, 2016 so that the Rescue Centre does not operate without recognition.

Further, the Central Zoo Authority in its 31st Meeting held on 26th June, 2018 decided to grant recognition of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility, Agra for a period of one year.



Reference is invited to your letter No. Nil dated 25.06.2012 seeking renewal of recognition for the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra beyond the period of 30.09.2012 under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

The evaluation of the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra was carried out on 19.08.2013 by Sh. S. C. Sharma, Retd. Addl. DGF (WL), MoEF and Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer. The evaluation report submitted by the evaluating officers was approved the Chairman, Technical committee of the Central Zoo Authority vide note dated 30.12.2013 subject to post-facto approval & ratification in next Technical Committee of the CZA.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of renewal of recognition to the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra as "Rescue Centre" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 31st January, 2016 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 and mid-term evaluation of the Zoo:-

Other Recommendations:

The Rescue Centre operator do not have full freedom to discharge the 1. statutory functions and comply the directions of the Central Zoo Authority because of lack of clear cut policy direction by the Chief Wildlife Warden to the Divisional Forest Officer (Wildlife) at Agra and local wildlife staff posted at Soor Sarovar Bird Sanctuary, Keetham. The Rescue Centre Operator should work/modifications repair the out permitted to carry be enclosures/infrastructure as per the directions of the Central Zoo Authority as per provisions of approved Master Plan without any further reference to the department. However, any new constructions would need explicit approval of the Chief Wildlife Warden (CWLW), Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow under Section 33 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The Rescue Centre Operator should be directed to get the master plan routed through the CWLW Ultrar Pradesh

2. The Rescue Centre operator should have full freedom in treatment diagnosis of diseases, post-mortem findings and follow-up check up of viscera for microbial and histo-pathological examinations. Routing it through the results in wastage of valuable time and sometimes the samples may get deteriorated beyond use.

Recently the Rescue Centre is being forced to open the part of Rescue Centre for visitors. This is against the policy of the Central Zoo Authority. However, if the State Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and Rescue Centre operator unanimously decide to do so, they will have to submit a detailed project report (DPR) as per the guidelines of the CZA giving details of the modification that would be made in the Rescue Centre to bring it to the standard of a general zoo. They may also be cautioned that the educational value of doing so would be quite limited, if they decide to go for it, the Rescue Centre within the Sanctuary Area would be converted into a zoo.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition beyond <u>31st January, 2016</u> to the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra as a 'Rescue Centre' would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, general performance and physical evaluation of the zoo.

The recognition to the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra as shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point in time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

- 1. The Zoo Operators should continue the practice of getting each Bear weighed periodically. The observations should be made and recorded by the Veterinary Officer/ Asst. Veterinary Officer personally. The same should be thoroughly analyzed and necessary mitigative measures taken.
- Zoo Operators should endeavour to ensure that the zoo veterinarians are not changed frequently. Continuity of veterinarians is of crucial importance for proper healthcare of the zoo animals.
- 3. Centre should seek directions of the Chief Wildlife Warden regarding Spotted deer, Hog deer and Blackbuck handed ever to it by the Range Officer. In future Chief Wildlife Warden should be kept informed of every rescued animal's that are handed over it. Invariably the rescued

animals should be accepted on the basis of written request from the Divisional Forest Officer, National Chambal Sanctuary, Agra.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition to Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra as a "Zoo (Rescue Centre)" beyond 30^{th} September, 2012 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the Agra Bear Rescue Facility at Keetham, Agra shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
