With reference to above, it is to inform that the recognition of Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Sh. R.K. Singh, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The zoo was accordingly evaluated on May 3rd 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 107th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on April 19 th, 2023. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the zoo operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 107^{th} Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period

after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, West Bengal for a period up to May 25, 2025 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

Application vide letter dated January 24, 2020 received in this office for renewal of recognition from the Divisional Forest Officer, Kangsabati North Division and Ex-officio Director, Surulia Mini Zoo, Purulia, for renewal of recognition.
