Sir,

With reference to the aforementioned subject, conditional approval was accorded for the establishment of a zoo at Ramgarh Tal Development Area in Gorakhpur City of Uttar Pradesh as per Section 38-H(1A) as per correspondence listed at (4).

The application for recognition of the said zoo, now named as Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyaan, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh was received from the Director vide correspondence listed at (3). Accordingly, the zoo was evaluated as per correspondence listed at (2). The application for recognition was deliberated in the 98<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on November 19, 2020 and further recommended for the approval.

The Central Zoo Authority in its 37<sup>th</sup> meeting held on December 07, 2020, granted recognition under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyaan, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, for a period of two years. The recognition of Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyaan, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh is as per provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and extant guidelines of the CZA, for the period up to December 06, 2022; and subject to the compliance of the conditions stipulated below and mid-term

The recognition of Shaheed Ashfaq Ullah Khan Prani Udyaan, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions. This issues with the approval of the competent Authority
