Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till March 21, 2020. Application dated November 14, 2019, received in this office from the Hon. Secretary, Tata Steel Zoological Society, Jamshedpur for renewal of recognition. Dr. Jagdish Kishwan, IFS (Retired) and Dr. A. K. Sharma, evaluating officers deputed by this office have evaluated the zoo on February 10 to 12, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after March 21, 2020 and renewed recognition of the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur as a Medium Zoo for a period up to August 19, 2022 subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

The evaluation of the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur was carried out on 18.08.2009 by Dr. Ajit Pattnaik, Chief Executive, Chilka Development Authority, Bhubaneswar and Dr. P. K. Roy, Sr. Veterinary Officer, Nandankanan Biological Park, Bhubaneswar. The evaluation report submitted by the evaluating officers was considered by the Technical Committee in its 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2010.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of renewal of recognition to the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur as <u>a small category Zoo</u> under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to <u>28<sup>th</sup> February, 2013</u> subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009:-

Grant of recognition beyond <u>28<sup>th</sup> Februrary, 2013</u> to the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur as a <u>small category zoo</u> would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, general performance and physical evaluation of the zoo.

The recognition to the Tata Steel Zoological Park, Jamshedpur shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point in time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
