Sir/Ma'am,

The application for recognition was received from the Director, Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala vide correspondence listed at (3). With reference to the aforementioned subject, the approval of the Master Plan of Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala (2013-14 to 2032-33) was accorded vide correspondence listed at (4).

The agenda pertaining to the recognition of the said zoo was deliberated in the $101^{\rm st}$ Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on 28/6/2021 and further recommended for the approval of the Central Zoo Authority. The Central Zoo Authority in its $38^{\rm th}$ meeting held on 16/11/2021, granted recognition under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala. The recognition of Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala is valid for a period of two years i.e., up to 20/5/2024 as per provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and extant

guidelines of the CZA; and subject to the compliance of the conditions stipulated below and midterm evaluation:

Further, compliance to the following conditions shall be ensured and compliance reported to this office within two months of issue of this letter:

- (1) The establishment of the said zoo is taken up in a phased manner (accounting for financial availability), however, there is a need for a plan such that the distribution of the activities across phases accounts for the minimum infrastructure required for operation of a zoo. A plan for the same shall be submitted for consideration of the CZA.
- (2) Since the zoo is situated on forest land, the Zoo operator is yet to furnish necessary statutory clearance under Forest Conservation Act, 1980, following which permission for acquisition of animals shall be sought.
- (3) The relocation of State Museum and Zoo, Thrissur, Kerala was proposed with the intention to provide better care, housing and enhance standards of captive management. The application (dated January 12, 2021) states that the newly established Thrissur Zoological Park has created some enclosures to house animals from old zoo, however they have also stated that the remaining enclosures will be

completed in six months. The compliance against the same and factual status on the completion of the infrastructure at the zoo as per approved Master Plan shall be furnished.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in the implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority. The recognition of Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala for the period beyond 20/5/2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Thrissur Zoological Park, Puthur, Kerala shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.
