Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Vikram Singh Gaur, IFS(Retd.),Former PCCF, Jharkhand was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on April 5th, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was

deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat for a period up to December 7th, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat for the period beyond December 7th, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot, Gujarat was carried out by Dr. Brij Kishor Gupta, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer, CZA on 23.07.2017. The evaluation report of the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 84th Meeting held on 19.09.2017. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee has recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for renewal of recognition of the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot (Small Zoo Category) for a period of three years.

The Central Zoo Authority in its 30th Meeting held on 28.09.2017, approved the recommendation of the Technical Committee and has decided to renew recognition to the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot for a period of three years. Further, the Authority has also decided to regularise the period after 31.07.2016.

The renewal of recognition to the Rajkot Zoological Park, Rajkot as “a Small Category Zoo” as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 27th September, 2020 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

The evaluation of the Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot was carried out by Sh. B. S. Bonal, Member Secretary, CZA and Dr. R. G. Jani on 12.05.2014. The evaluation report of the Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot as submitted by the evaluating officers was considered by the Technical Committee in its 70th Meeting held on 1st July, 2014

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of recognition to Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot as "a Small Category Zoo" under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 31st July, 2016 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo (Amendment) Rules, 2013 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

Apart from the above, following are suggested to take immediate action:-

1. The approach to the zoo is very shabby because of encroachment of local residents. Action should be taken to modify for better display of entry point.
2. The brick masonry established at the outside of zoo located adjacent to herbivore enclosure because of pollution. This should be removed/ closed for better health of the zoo animal.
3. The zoo should establish and notify a society with autonomous governing body for smooth betterment and development works with provision of ploughing back of revenue for development work of the zoo.

4. The zoo should consider to execute some of the special pack of works through architects/ masonry viz., formation of rock structures, timber structures etc.
5. The zoo should consider for continuation of service of engineer for long term basis to harness the experience gained for zoo design and enrichment that is needed.
6. The Zoological Park at new site although open for visitors in 2010, the work is in progress in case for last three years.
7. Exhibition of new enclosures should be done in the modern concept of the zoo management i.e. conservation exhibits with the larger and open areas with "nature immersing exhibits".

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.



In the meantime you are also requested to submit the 5 copies of Master plans for the long-term development of Rajkot Zoo, Rajkot for the approval from this office. It is to be recall that the Master plans should be prepared keeping in view of the agreed concept plans communicated by this office letter of even number dated 17.2.2009 and the guidelines circulated by this office for the preparation of Master plan.

In the meantime, you are also requested to comply with the following observations:-

1. The approach road to the new zoo from National Highway should be made free of all encroachments.
2. The proposed Blackbuck enclosure may be used to house the Spotted deer and the proposed Spotted deer enclosure shall be used to house Blackbucks since the area proposed is dry in nature and does not have any under ground vegetation.
3. The proposed site for One horned rhinoceros may not be feasible as the site consist of dry and full hard rock.

You are also requested to ensure that during the given period the zoos should strictly adhere with the standards and norms laid under Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992.

The recognition to the Rajkot Municipal Zoo, Rajkot shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found violating with the standards and norms stipulated under Rules and Act laid there upon.

The grant of recognition to the Rajkot Municipal Zoo at new site shall be considered on physical evaluation of the zoo, progress made with regard to relocation of animals from old zoo to the new site and compliance of the above conditions.
