Sir,

With the reference to above, it is to inform that recognition of the Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh under section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 was valid till August 19,2021. Application for renewal of recognition was received in this office on July 22, 2021, from the Divisional Forest Officer, Wildlife Division, Kullu and Officer in-charge, Mini Zoo Rewalsar. Sh. R. K Srivastav, IFS (Retired), deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on March, 09, 2024. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh was placed before the Technical Committee in its 117th Meeting of the Technical Committee held on January 16,2026. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority in its 43rd Meeting held on February 03,2026 has approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

As per provisions of sub-section (1),(3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, regularized the period after August 19, 2021 and renewed recognition of the Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh as a **Mini Category Zoo** for a period up to **February 03, 2029** subject to compliance with the following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.

with the directions and guidelines issued by the Central Zoo Authority from time to time, for the purpose of maintenance and upkeep of the Zoo.

6. The renewal of recognition of the Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh for period beyond February 03,2029 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

7. The recognition of the Mini Zoo, Rewalsar, Himachal Pradesh shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

It is to inform that the evaluation of Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Mandi, Himachal Pradesh was carried out by Dr. Devender Kumar, Scientific Officer, CZA on 08.07.2018. The evaluation report of the Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Mandi, Himachal Pradesh was considered by the Technical Committee in its 86th Meeting held on 28.09.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee decided for renewal of recognition of the Rewalsar Mini Zoo, Mandi, Himachal Pradesh for a period of two years. A copy of the evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officer is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action.
