Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka was accorded up to August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka for the period beyond August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Surendra Kumar, IFS(Retd.), Former PCCF(CWLW), Kerala was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of the Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

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Subsequently, the recommendation of 106<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka for a period up to December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka for the period beyond December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Nisarg Dham, Belgam, Karnataka shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondence. It is to inform that the evaluation of Kittur Rani Channamma Mini Zoo, Bhutharamanahatti, Belagavi District, Karnataka was carried out by Dr. B. Trinadha Rao, I.F.S. (Retired) on 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. The evaluation report of Kittur Rani Channamma Mini Zoo as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 79<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant conditional renewal of recognition for a period of two years. The renewal of recognition of Kittur Rani Channamma Mini Zoo as "a Small Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2018 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-

Other recommendation

The Zoo Operator should plant appropriate trees as screening between the national highway and the zoo premises. The zoo may also create the buffer zone by planting the various trees such screening shall reduce the noise level in the zoo premises and help the animals to be stress free.

A half yearly report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

Grant of recognition to Kittur Rani Chennamma Nisargadhama, Bhutaramanahatti, Belgaum beyond 31.03.2012 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition to the Kittur Rani Chennamma Nisargadhama, Bhutaramanahatti, Belgaum shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time if the Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.
