Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Shri Sisir Kumar Acharya, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on June 14th, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana for a period of one year and to regularise the period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also

recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana for a period up to December 14th, 2023 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

Further, half yearly report regarding progress made in the implementation of the aforesaid conditions should also be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana for the period beyond December 14th, 2023 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourism Complex, Shameerpet, Telangana shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

ORDER

Sub: Suspension of recognition to the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana under Section 38 H (6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972.

1. Whereas the recognition to Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana under Section 38 (H) (1) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 was valid upto 20th Jan, 2018 subject to compliance with conditions specified under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the Zoo.
2. And Whereas the District Forest Officer, Medchal District, Telangana vide letter No. 1175/2017/S3 dated 14.11.2017 submitted application to the Central Zoo Authority (*hereinafter called as "CZA"*) for renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana, under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for period beyond 20.01.2018 .
3. And whereas the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana has been evaluated by the evaluator deputed by the CZA on 07.10.2017. The Evaluation Report was placed before the Technical Committee, CZA in its 85th Meeting held on 23.03.2018.
7. And whereas the Show Cause Notice was issued on 04.05.2018 to the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana for repeated violation under the Provisions of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and was asked to inform why recognition of the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana be not suspended/cancelled.

8. And whereas Operator of the Deer Park, Jawahar Lake Tourist Complex, Shameerpet, Medchal District, Telangana was provided an opportunity of hearing under Section 38-H (5) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 on 25th May, 2018. Shri D. Sudhakar Reddy, District Forest Officer, Medchal District, Telangana on 25th May, 2018 attended the hearing which was held under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary (CZA) at New Delhi. Also the Technical Committee of the CZA, authorised the Member Secretary, CZA to take cognizance under Section 55 (aa) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and thereby the proceedings of the hearing was prepared in the CZA which is given in the tabular form as below:
