Sir/Madam,

With reference to the above cited correspondences, it is to inform that the evaluation of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka was carried out by Dr. Rashmi Kant Shukla, IFS (Retd.), Former PCCF, UP on 15.03.2024.

The evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officers was placed before the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority (CZA) in its 110<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 14.05.2024.

The Technical Committee after deliberation recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka beyond the period 19.08.2022 under Section 38-H (1, 3 & 4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 for the period of 2 years. Further, the committee also recommended to regularise the intervening period from the date until the previously accorded recognition was valid till the date of issue of renewal. The renewal is subject to the conditions stipulated as part IV of the evaluation report (Copy enclosed).

Subsequently, the recommendation of the 110<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee, CZA were approved by the Chairperson, CZA.

The renewal of recognition to the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka as per the provisions of Section 38(H) (1, 3 & 4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 17.07.2026 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation:

15.	5.1	Proposal to construct a 'Walk Through Aviary' is under consideration as per approved Master (Layout) Plan by CZA. It is highly recommended to visit the latest Zoo establish at the Kevadiya, Ekta Nagar, Gujarat, where a 'Walk Through Aviary' is designed and energized. Since the construction and erection of such an Aviary is a specialized job, it is highly advisable and recommended for the Officer-in-charge and associated professionals of Zoo Shimoga to visit Kevadiya Zoo before starting the construction of the 'Walk Through Aviary' in Shimoga Zoo.	6 months.
16.	5.1	Proposal to construct a 'Nocturnal House' as per the approved Master (Layout) Plan by CZA. It is highly recommended to visit Kankaria Zoo, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, managed by the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation, where newly designed and constructed modern 'Nocturnal House' is established. Hence, a visit to Kankaria Zoo, Ahmedabad to see the Nocturnal House by the Office-in-charge and associated professionals is recommended before initiating the construction activity. It is further recommended to keep a provision of few extra nocturnal enclosures to accommodate the future availability of nocturnal animals.	6 months.
17.	6.1	In the Veterinary Hospital traditional stainless steel examination table/Operation Table should be replaced with advanced hydraulic operation table.	6 months.

A time bound compliance report regarding progress made in implementation of the aforesaid conditions should be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority within 30 days of the date of issue of this letter and half yearly compliance report should also be submitted subsequently.

The renewal of recognition to the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka for period beyond 17.07.2026 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above and general performance of the Zoo.

The recognition to the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the, Zoo Operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Tyavarekoppa, Karnataka under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till September 27, 2019. Application dated September 20, 2019 received in this office from the Executive Director, Tiger and Lion Safari, Tyavarekoppa, for renewal of recognition. Shri B. S. Bonal, IFS (Retired) and Shri Lakshminarasimha, Scientific Officer in this Office, deputed by this office have evaluated the zoo on March 8, 2020. Copy of the evaluation report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Tyavarekoppa, was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after September 27, 2019 and renewed recognition of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Tyavarekoppa, as a Small Zoo for a period up to **August 19, 2022** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.



Reference is invited to above cited correspondences. As recommended by the Technical Committee, CZA in its 85<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 23.03.2018, Notice dated 26.04.2018 under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 was issued to the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka wherein serious and continuous violation of the Recognition of the Zoo Rules has been reported.

The hearing was conducted on 25.05.2018 in the office of the Central Zoo Authority in the presence of Shri S.J. Chandra Shekar, Executive Director & Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wildlife Division, Shimoga under the Chairmanship of the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority.

It is to inform that the evaluation of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka was carried out by Shri C.S. Yalakki, IFS (Retired) on 13.09.2017. The evaluation report along with proceeding of hearing held on 25.05.2018 was considered by the Technical Committee in its 86<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 28.09.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee decided for renewal of recognition of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga, Karnataka for a period of one year. A copy of the evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officer is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action.

The evaluation of the Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga was carried out by Dr. B. Trinadha Rao on 18.03.2016. The evaluation report of Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga as submitted by the evaluating officer was considered by the Technical Committee in its 78<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2016.

The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has decided to issue Show Cause Notice under Section 38H (5&6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 to authorities of Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga for non-compliance with conditions stipulated by the Central Zoo Authority in violation of Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and to provide time period of six months to the zoo to file a reply and to submit an action taken report on issues raised in the Notice. Besides, the Committee has decided to grant renewal for recognition for a period of one year. Show Cause Notice is being sent separately. The renewal of recognition to Tiger and Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shimoga as "Small category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 for a period up to 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 is granted subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and subject to mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-


