Sir/ Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha was accorded up to August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha for the period beyond August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Dr. Shailendra Kumar Singh, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority

held on September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha for a period of two years and to regularise the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha for a period up to December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha for the period beyond December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Deer Park Kuanria, Nayagarh, Odisha shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying

with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

Sir,

With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Kuanria Deer Park, Neliguda, Nayagarh District, Odisha under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till September 27, 2019. Application vide letter No.114 dated February 25, 2021 received in this office from the Forest Range Officer, Banigochha (E) Wildlife Range, for renewal of recognition. Dr. A. K. Malhotra, evaluating officer deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on February 8, 2020. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Kuanria Deer Park, Neliguda, Nayagarh District was placed before the Technical Committee in its 96<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on July 30, 2020. The Technical Committee, after detailed deliberation, made its recommendation to the Central Zoo Authority.

3. This office issued Office Memorandum F.No.7-10/2020-CZA(PART-I) dated August 25, 2020 regarding renewal of recognition of the zoo. Subsequently, the Central Zoo Authority, in its 37<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on December 7, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, approved recommendation of the Technical Committee.

4. The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after September 27, 2019 and renewed recognition of the Kuanria Deer Park, Neliguda, Nayagarh District as a Mini Zoo for a period up to **August 19, 2021** subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo.



Sir,

The Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, Odisha was established in the year 1986 on an area of 5 acres (1.8 Hectare). The Divisional Forest Officer, Nayagarh Division submitted an application dated 05.01.1993 seeking recognition under Section 38-H(1),(3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The Zoo was firstly evaluated by the CZA on 11.04.1996. Based on the Evaluation Report, the CZA granted recognition of the Zoo for a period upto 31.07.1998 subject to compliance with conditions stipulated therein. The CZA vide letter dated 10.09.1996, 17.08.2006 and subsequent reminders, directed the zoo management to enhance the area of the Deer Park to 5 Hectare and to submit Master Plan for approval of the Central Zoo Authority. However, compliance is awaited.

Subsequently, the CZA has been repeatedly providing opportunity to the Zoo Operator of the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh to comply with conditions stipulated from time to time. However, compliance has been observed to be poor.

It is pertinent to mention the Annual Inventory of the Zoo for year 2006-07 submitted to the CZA by the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO), Mahanadi Wildlife Division vide letter dated 25.05.2007. In the said Inventory, enclosed summary on death of captive animals wherein the Veterinary Surgeon, Daspalla, Nayagarh has pointed out severe constraint of space for the captive animals housed in the Deer Park and recommended enhancement of area. Also, pointed out about need to ban the blasting activity at nearby hill.

Recently, the Divisional Forest Officer, Mahanadi Wildlife Division vide letter No. 2933/4F-MWL/236/16 dated 24.08.2017 submitted application to the Central Zoo Authority for renewal of recognition of the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, for period beyond 23.08.2017. The Zoo has been evaluated by the evaluator deputed by the CZA on 24.10.2017. The Evaluation Report was placed before the Technical Committee, CZA in its 85<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 23.03.2018.

The Technical Committee, on perusal of the Evaluation Report, observed that the management of the zoo violated various provisions under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009. As decided by the Technical Committee, the office of the CZA issued Notice dated 01.05.2018 and provided an opportunity of hearing to the Operator of the Zoo under Section 38-H(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The hearing was conducted on 20.07.2018 in the office of the Central Zoo Authority in the presence of Smt. A.P. Das, Divisional Forest Officer, Mahanadi Wildlife Division, Nayagarh, Odisha under the Chairmanship of the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority. The Proceeding of hearing dated 20.07.2018 is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action at your end.

The reply furnished by the zoo operator in respect to CZA's Notice dated 01.05.2018 was considered by the Technical Committee in its 86<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 28.09.2018. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee decided for renewal of recognition of the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, Odisha for a period of one year. A copy of the evaluation report as submitted by the evaluating officer is enclosed with this letter for your perusal and needful action.

The renewal of recognition to the Kuanria Deer Park, Nayagarh, Odisha as a "Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 27.09.2019 subject to the compliance of the given below directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation, and to regularise the period after 23.08.2017:-

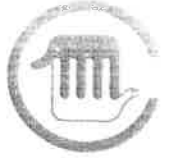
