Sir/Madam,

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recognition of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha was accorded up to August 19th, 2021 vide reference no. 3 above. The application for the renewal of recognition Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha for the period beyond August 19th, 2021 was received by this office vide reference no. 2 above.

Dr. Shailendra Kumar Singh, IFS (Retd.) was deputed by this office to carry out the evaluation of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha vide CZA letter at reference no. 1 above. The Zoo was accordingly evaluated on July 15th, 2022.

The evaluation report (copy enclosed) as submitted by the evaluation officer was deliberated in the 106th meeting of the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority held on September 27th, 2022. The Technical Committee after detailed deliberations recommended to the Central Zoo Authority for the renewal of recognition of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha for a period of two years and to regularise the

period after August 19th, 2021, subject to compliance with observation/ recommendation in the table below and mid-term evaluation. The members also recommended that the Zoo Operator may be directed to submit half-yearly compliance report with respect to observation/ recommendation stipulated while renewal of recognition.

Subsequently, the recommendation of 106th Technical Committee Meeting was approved by the Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after August 19th, 2021 and renewed the recognition of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha for a period up to December 14th, 2024 under Section 38-H(1), (3) & (4) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. This is subject to the ratification of this decision in the next meeting of the Central Zoo Authority.

The recognition of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha for the period beyond December 14th, 2024 would be considered on the basis of compliance of the conditions stated above, mid-term evaluation and general performance of the zoo.

The recognition of Deer Park Papadahandi, Nabarangpur, Odisha shall be revoked by the Central Zoo Authority, at any point of time, if the zoo operator is found not complying with the stipulated conditions.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

Reference is invited to above cited correspondences. It is to inform that the compliance report of the Deer Park, Papadahandi, Odisha was considered by the Technical Committee in its 90th Meeting held on 06.06.2019. After detailed deliberations, the Technical Committee recommended to the CZA for renewal of recognition of the Deer Park, Papadahandi, Odisha for a period of one year.

The recommendations of the 90th meeting of the Technical Committee held on 06.06.2019 were placed before the Central Zoo Authority in its 35th Meeting held on 29.08.2019. The Authority approved the recommendation of the Technical Committee and decided to grant renewal of recognition to the Deer Park, Papadahandi, Odisha under Section 38H(1) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

The renewal of recognition to the Deer Park, Papadahandi, Odisha as a "Mini Category Zoo" as per the provisions of Section 38H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is for a period up to 28.08.2020 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules (RZR), 2009 and mid-term evaluation and to regularize the period after 23.08.2018:-

The Deer Park Operator should ensure that all the animal enclosures are as per the Guidelines issued by the Central Zoo Authority. Also, a report on this violation should be submitted to the CZA.	Immediately. The zoo should submit a detail report alongwith designs of enclosures following prescribed guidelines to the CZA for further action.
13	10.4(8)	The enclosures for Four horned antelope, endangered species (Schedule I of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972) were constructed in the Deer Park without obtaining approval of design from the Central Zoo Authority. The Zoo Operator should explain this violation and submit the design for post-facto approval of the CZA.

14	10.5(2)	Diet schedule of animals housed in the Deer Park should be prepared in consultation with the consultant Veterinarian as per the recommended guidelines titled 'Standardization of Diet for Indian Zoo Animals' and the same should be implemented. The evaluation of the Deer Park, Papdahandi was carried out by Sh. Sri G. Ramalingam, Curator, Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, Visakhapatnam on 29.04.2011. The evaluation report of the Deer Park, Papdahandi as submitted by the evaluating officers was considered by the Technical Committee in its 59th Meeting held on 20th September, 2011.

The Central Zoo Authority has decided to grant of recognition to Deer Park, Papdahandi as a Mini Category Zoo under Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, for a period up to 31st October, 2014 subject to the compliance of the following directives under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:-
